

Greetings, brothers and sisters. Over the past couple of weeks, we've been building on insights into what discipleship really means for all of us as members of the Body of Christ. Two weeks ago, we heard Abraham's stories of courage and his stepping out faithfully into the unknown. His faithfulness was found in doing all that God commands, never questioning, and being prepared to say yes to whatever God asked of him. When we respond similarly, we become like the faithful stewards – dressed for action, with our lamps lit and ready for whatever the Master asks of us. Last weekend, we heard the story of Jeremiah being cast into the cistern to die – because his faithfulness in preaching God's word was not well received. We learned that Jesus came to bring division between the ways of the world and His way. Discipleship costs us

something when we choose to follow Him instead of the popular culture of the world. But no matter where we find ourselves, or how deep our 'pit' may feel, God never abandons us and rescues us in our times of need.

A Message from Our Clergy

Our readings this weekend add to what we've learned already. This weekend, we're encouraged to endure the *discipline* of the Lord, which can be painful at times, but it strengthens us as His faithful to 'walk straight paths' and be healed of those things which hold us back. In our reading from Hebrews, we're reminded again that following Christ requires perseverance, purification and endurance. Our reading from Isaiah adds something else: we're got companions on the journey with us across the world! God is gathering his faithful from ALL nations. God's invitation to follow Him applies to all; even the Gentiles and all foreigners to the faith are invited to be part of God's covenant people. God's kingdom is open to all, but it requires us to *respond* to God's call!

In our gospel from Luke, Jesus warns us that entry into God's kingdom is through a narrow gate. Many will try to come through but won't be able to make it. If we don't truly 'own' our faith, we're tepid at best. Think of any athlete training for a marathon or an Olympic event. Putting in the effort only part time will only get us part of the way there. *Responding* to God's call means being 'all in'. He wants all of our hearts, not just when it feels convenient or checks the box to satisfy compliance. No athlete ever won the prize without putting his/her heart into it!

Although the discipline can be challenging, the author of Hebrews encourages us to 'strengthen our drooping hands and our weak knees'. 'Faithfulness brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness for those who are trained by it!' St. Michael's offers an abundance of 'training programs' every weekend at all of our Liturgies and throughout the week. Sign on and join millions of others everywhere in becoming an Olympian for God!
