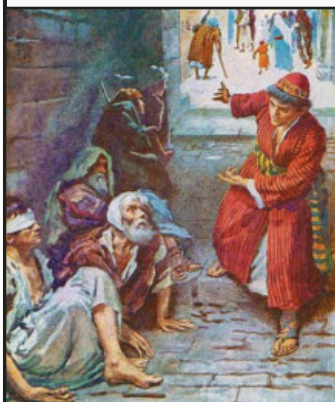


Greetings, brothers and sisters. Our journey through the experience of discipleship continues. Last week, we heard Jesus' invitation to us to enter through the narrow gate, and that those who give the minimum effort into a relationship may not necessarily be invited into the heavenly banquet at the end of our lives. Discipline of growing in our faith is required. As Fr. Bert mentioned in his homily last weekend, simply going to little league practice doesn't guarantee that we make the team! Jesus is asking us to throw ourselves 'all in' in our relationship with Him. He wants all of our hearts, not just when it feels convenient or checks the box to satisfy compliance. This is something that our faith journey allows us to grow into.

This week, we're invited to consider humility. Just like entering in through the narrow gate may require us to stoop and go low to gain entrance into the city, humility is the pathway for gaining favor with God and entering his Kingdom. Sirach

teaches us that greatness in the eyes of God is achieved by making ourselves more humble. We learn that pride can lead us to ruin, but humility opens the way to true wisdom. Growing in humility reduces our focus on ourselves, and frees us to focus on the needs of others. We hear this echoed in our psalm, which reminds us that God cares especially for the humble and the poor. How can we know the love of God if we are so filled with pride? We are the eyes, hands and feet of God on earth. How can God love the poor and the lowly through us if we are filled with only ourselves?

We can have no better role model for this than our Savior Jesus Christ. The Son of God the Most High, King of the Universe, chooses to enter into our humanity to save us from our sins, not as an all-powerful earthly king robed in majesty and commanding armies to conquer and rule over others. Rather, he chooses to enter into our world in poverty and the humility of being born in a stall, wrapped in the swaddling clothes used for animals. His entire life is devoted to teaching love borne through humility and service to others. The host in our gospel reading from Luke is advised to invite the poor, the crippled and the blind to the banquet. In like manner, so we too – as 'hosts' during our earthly existence, are invited to extend ourselves to those who suffer among us who are sick and needing the mercy of God. The saints all understood this. Like them, we can only do these things through the great gift of humility. In modeling them, we can achieve exaltation in the Kingdom of God.



Of course it's not easy. We have to go through the narrow gate! It's what's on the other side of it that will bring us incomparable peace and joy. Happy journeys, and keep a smile on your face!!

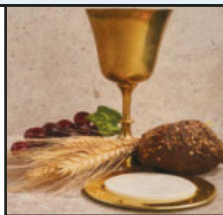

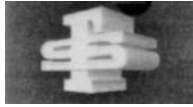

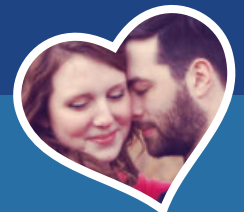
