Greetings, brothers and sisters! We are already into our second week of Advent! As the seasons have turned the corner towards the cold of winter, so too have our spiritual seasons changed. Advent means ‘arrival’, or ‘coming’, and we are into a special time of reflection. In our Christian faith, it is a time of spiritual preparation for the coming of Christ’s birth, as well as a reflection on His second coming in glory at the end of the age. Our Advent wreath helps us experience this season. It includes three purple candles (for penitence and preparation), and one rose candle symbolizing joy – which we’ll light on Gaudete Sunday next weekend, the third Sunday of Advent.

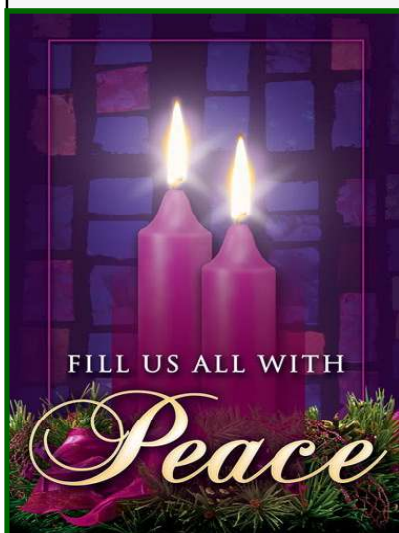
Spiritually, our readings are building on a unified theological theme of the coming of the Messiah who will bring justice, peace and conversion of heart by calling us to prepare the way of the Lord. Our first reading from Isaiah reveals that “...a shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom.” Jesse, traditionally of the town of Bethlehem, had at least seven sons and two daughters. David was the youngest and likely the least significant in everyone’s eyes; he wasn’t even presented to Samuel when he arrived to anoint a new king from Jesse’s sons. David, probably between 10-15 years old at that time, was sent for, and when he arrived, Samuel anointed him. From that day forward, the powerful Spirit of the Lord was with David. At the Christmas Vigil Mass, we’ll read the genealogy of Jesus from the Gospel of Matthew, and see Jesse prominently mentioned at the conclusion of the first 14 generations following Abraham. From Jesse’s lineage will come the ‘bud’ that will blossom, Jesus our Savior – Emmanuel.

A Message from Our Clergy

In our second reading, St. Paul reminds us that Jesus’ mission fulfills the Old Testament promises and extends salvation to Jews and Gentiles alike, fulfilling the hope spoken of in the scriptures. He urges the Romans, and us as well, to live in hope, endurance and harmony, all virtues of the Advent season.

In our Gospel from Matthew, John the Baptist appears in the wilderness proclaiming, ‘Prepare the way of the Lord’ and calling for repentance – a critical key to our preparation. He’s also warning that Jesus comes to us not only as a gentle shepherd, but also as a judge who will separate the wheat from the chaff. Become more wheat and less chaff!



Our Advent season is so beautiful. While we’re invited to personal repentance to help prepare our hearts to welcome the newborn Savior, we’re called to live and love outwardly the virtues of Advent – hope, endurance and harmony. This is the calling of all Christians during this advent season. David, even in his youth, responded to God’s call and did great things. No matter how insignificant we may feel, God invites us to respond similarly to the vocations he sets before us! When we let Him, God uses us to accomplish His will every day!

Happy Advent – and relish the Peace of Christ on this second weekend!



DINNER DANCE

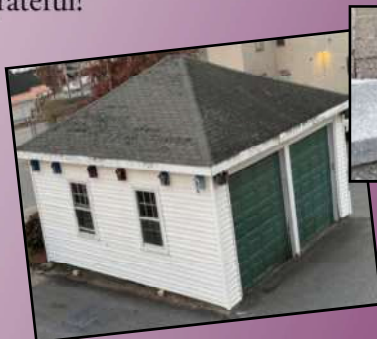
