Spiritual Communion

There are many circumstances which might prevent us from receiving Holy Communion at Mass. (For some helpful guidelines on when Catholics may properly receive Holy Communion, see page 584 in the missalette.) It has long been a Catholic understanding that when circumstances prevent one from receiving Holy Communion, it is possible to make an Act of Spiritual Communion, which is a source of grace. Spiritual Communion is an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament and lovingly embrace him at a time or in circumstances when one cannot receive Him in sacramental Communion. The most common reason for making an Act of Spiritual Communion is when a person cannot attend Mass. Acts of Spiritual Communion increase our desire to receive sacramental Communion and help us avoid the sins that would make us unable to receive Holy Communion worthily. Here is one of many beautiful Acts of Spiritual Communion:

My Jesus, really present in the most holy sacrament of the altar,
 Since I cannot now receive thee under the sacramental veil,
 I beseech thee, with a heart full of love and longing, to come spiritually into my soul
 through the Immaculate Heart of thy Most Holy Mother,
 and abide with me forever.
 Thou in me, and I in thee, in time and in eternity, in Mary. Amen.

There is another beautiful Act of Spiritual Communion printed on the back cover of the missalette. May these prayers be a source of grace for all who long for Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Most Holy Sacrament of the altar.

A Message from Our Clergy

Deacon Chuck Rossignol

Our readings this weekend do us a great service by reminding us that our earthly possessions, wealth and accomplishments reflect only the emptiness of materialism, because these things never last. They are fleeting; we don't take them with us when we're gone. Our scriptures invite us instead to seek the lasting treasure of God – things which will endure past the length of our earthly lives. In our OT reading from Ecclesiastes, we see that, for all of our labors while we were here, someone else will inherit the fruit of our work. In our psalm, we see the acknowledgment of human mortality and the shortness of life. In God alone do we have permanence which endures. In Colossians, St. Paul exhorts Christians to set their hearts on heavenly things, not earthly ones. He encourages our detachment from worldly passions like greed and selfishness and instead seek our identity in Christ. Our gospel reading from Luke says the same thing with the parable of the rich fool, who stores up his wealth for himself, thinking he has secured his future. *"You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you... thus it will be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."*

None of us take anything with us when we die. Our scriptures this weekend encourage us to reset our perspectives, detach from worldly possessions, be generous, and focus on eternal riches in God. Letting go of building up earthly treasures for our own sake has the great benefit of freeing ourselves for others and building up our eternal treasures. When we meet God, being 'cool' won't even be on His radar!

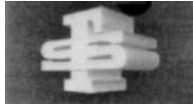

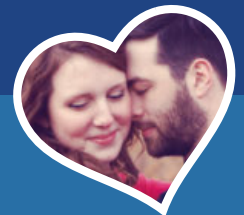
