Greetings, brothers and sisters.

We make choices and decisions every day in our lives. Hopefully – many times they are the right ones, but sometimes they are clearly wrong, and we can learn a lot from those. I'll never forget leaving for home from Logan airport in Boston one Sunday night. At a critical juncture, Waze was directing me to head north on I-93 instead of heading west on I-90. Clearly this wasn't correct! I kept resisting going the way I was instructed, and the GPS kept recalculating to guide me to go north. Why was it doing that??? I ultimately decided that Waze was having a malfunction and I turned it off, choosing to go west on I-90. Five miles later, I realized my 'wisdom' wasn't so smart after all. Construction on the Pike had narrowed the westbound travel to one lane most of the way to Route 128, and the backup was horrendous. There was no choice now but to endure the consequences... UGH!

A Message from Our Clergy

Deacon Chuck

Our readings this weekend remind us of the choices we need to make in our relationship with God and with each other. Sirach tells his Jewish community that we all have human freedom and responsibility towards each other. God places before us opportunities to choose between life and death, good and evil. Through our baptism and use of the sacraments, we are gifted with access to *God's wisdom*, and thus able to choose a path that aligns with His will for us. Knowing His immense love for us and desire for us to be with Him, is there any reason why we shouldn't follow His actions in our lives? Yet sometimes, our human condition wants us to rely on doing things our own way. St. Paul says hold on! The wisdom of God surpasses all human understanding. Divine wisdom is revealed by the Holy Spirit to those who love God. This wisdom is found only by seeking to understand and follow God's ways.



In our gospel from Matthew, Jesus is presenting some very sobering thoughts, all pointing to the intentions of our hearts, and the need to get them straightened out! One line in this passage always bothered me: if I learn that my brother has something *against me*, I'm to leave my offering and go reconcile with him first, and only then come back and offer my gift. It seems backwards. What's the point? Like Sirach says, we all have responsibility towards each other. That responsibility includes a lesson in humility and taking the initiative to seek reconciliation regardless of who is at fault. Self-examination can help us understand how our actions or words might adversely impact others, even when inadvertent and unintentional. We all need to help reconcile!

Two weeks ago, our gospel pertained to the beatitudes and the beautiful posture of humility. Last week, we were encouraged to be salt and light, so as to witness our faith to others. Lord, teach us how to fully embrace our responsibilities to each other from a place of humility and forgiveness. Help us to trust You, like a spiritual GPS, and follow along the ways you guide us with confidence, faithfulness and peace. Amen!


RICE BOWLS

Brazilian & Portuguese Community Information

Saudações, irmãos e irmãs.

Fazemos escolhas e tomamos decisões todos os dias em nossas vidas. Esperamos que muitas vezes sejam as certas, mas às vezes estão claramente erradas, e podemos aprender muito com elas. Nunca me esquecerei de quando saí para casa do aeroporto Logan em Boston em uma noite de domingo. Em um momento crítico, o Waze estava me direcionando para o norte na I-93 em vez de ir para o oeste na I-90. Obviamente, isso estava errado! Continuei resistindo a ir pelo caminho que me foi instruído, e o GPS continuava recalculando para me guiar para o norte. Por que estava fazendo isso??? Finalmente, decidi que o Waze estava com algum problema e o desliguei, optando por ir para o oeste na I-90. Oito quilômetros depois, percebi que minha "sabedoria" não era tão inteligente assim. Obras na Pike haviam reduzido a pista no sentido oeste para uma única faixa na maior parte do caminho até a Rota 128, e o congestionamento estava horrível. Não havia outra escolha a não ser suportar as consequências... ARGH!

As leituras deste fim de semana nos lembram das escolhas que precisamos fazer em nosso relacionamento com Deus e uns com os outros. Sirach diz à sua comunidade judaica que todos nós temos liberdade humana e responsabilidade uns para com os outros. Deus nos apresenta oportunidades para escolhermos entre a vida e a morte, o bem e o mal. Através do batismo e da participação nos sacramentos, somos presenteados com o acesso à sabedoria de Deus e, assim, capazes de escolher um caminho que esteja alinhado com a Sua vontade para nós. Sabendo do Seu imenso amor por nós e do Seu desejo de estarmos com Ele, há alguma razão para não seguirmos os Seus passos em nossas vidas? Contudo, às vezes, nossa condição humana nos leva a fazer as coisas à nossa maneira. São Paulo nos diz: perseverem! A sabedoria de Deus ultrapassa todo entendimento humano. A sabedoria divina é revelada pelo Espírito Santo àqueles que amam a Deus. Essa sabedoria só é encontrada buscando compreender e seguir os caminhos de Deus.



Em nosso evangelho de Mateus, Jesus apresenta reflexões muito profundas, todas apontando para as intenções de nossos corações e a necessidade de as corrigirmos! Uma frase nessa passagem sempre me incomodou: se eu descobrir que meu irmão tem algo contra mim, devo deixar minha oferta e ir me reconciliar com ele primeiro, para só então voltar e oferecer minha parte. Parece contraditório. Qual o sentido disso? Como diz Siráclide, todos temos responsabilidade uns pelos outros. Essa responsabilidade inclui uma lição de humildade e a iniciativa de buscar a reconciliação, independentemente de quem esteja errado. O autoexame pode nos ajudar a entender como nossas ações ou palavras podem impactar negativamente os outros, mesmo que inadvertidamente e sem intenção. Todos precisamos ajudar na reconciliação!

Há duas semanas, nosso evangelho abordou as bem-aventuranças e a bela postura da humildade. Na semana passada, fomos encorajados a ser sal e luz, para testemunhar nossa fé aos outros. Senhor, ensina-nos a abraçar plenamente nossas responsabilidades uns para com os outros, partindo de um lugar de humildade e perdão. Ajuda-nos a confiar em Ti, como um GPS espiritual, e a seguir os caminhos que nos guias com confiança, fidelidade e paz. Amém!
