Greetings, brothers and sisters.

With having just celebrated Ash Wednesday, we've arrived at this first Sunday of Lent, and our Lenten journey has begun. Like Jesus' 40 days in the desert, we will journey through our 40 days of Lent to draw on everything we can learn about our own personal need for repentance and turning away from sin. The Church gives us this moment at this time in the liturgical year for good reason. While our other seasons like Christmas and Eastertide emphasize celebration and joy, Lent emphasizes repentance and sacrifice. We can't hope to develop, deepen and strengthen our spirituality without doing some work on it. This season is unique (and beneficial!) for taking stock of our spiritual lives, identifying our own areas of sin, and working towards transformation through the grace of God. During Lent, our liturgies will be more solemn - no more Alleluias until Easter, and the Gloria - a hymn of joy and praise, will not be recited or sung. Our entrance antiphons will be more subdued. Our clergy will wear violet vestments, symbolizing penance and humility. There will be fewer flowers in the sanctuary, and the environment will have a more austere appearance. Even our Penitential Rite will be reminding us of the call to repentance and conversion.

A Message from Our Clergy

Deacon Chuck

Our readings this weekend help us set the table for this season, as we reflect on humanity's journey from sin to salvation, drawing on themes of temptation and sin, and ultimately Christ's victory over evil. In Genesis, we hear the story of the creation of man and woman and their fall through the temptation of the serpent. This passage highlights the origins of original sin, and the brokenness that entered the world through Adam and Eve's disobedience. We come to understand our need for redemption and God's plan to restore us to grace. In Romans, St. Paul speaks about how sin entered the world through one man, Adam, and how salvation comes through one man, Jesus Christ. Adam's *disobedience* is contrasted with Christ's *obedience*, illustrating the redemptive power that Christ brings to humanity and reversing the effects of original sin. In our gospel from Matthew, we recount Jesus' temptation in the wilderness. Jesus triumphs over temptation, as He rejects the devil's offers by relying on God's Word. By overcoming these temptations, Jesus shows that He is the new Adam who succeeds where the first Adam failed. This is particularly fitting for Lent, as it emphasizes the call to repentance, reflection, and reliance on God.

During this season of Lent, Jesus invites us to enter into a deeper understanding of our *own* struggles with sin and the hope we can find in Him, and reminding us of our call to conversion. Embrace this journey through our daily and weekend liturgies, complemented with everything that St. Michael's will offer during this special season. All of it is for gaining a closer relationship with Christ to share eternal glory with Him in Heaven.




