Greetings, brothers and sisters.

I have a good buddy, Joe D., in Brooklyn NY. He's had an amazing career, not because of great wealth or prestigious positions; he's earned neither. He's amazing because of the roles through which he's served others throughout his life. I first met him about 45 years ago when he was running operations for Covenant House in NYC, working with the founder Fr. Bruce Ritter. Our music group, Living Waters, did a few concerts for the homeless young people who were sheltered there. Joe then moved onto other positions, serving in Jerusalem for about 10 years with Caritas Internationalis, and then served on selected commissions with the UN while he was President of Caritas Internationalis in the US. He would often share stories with me about the meetings he'd had with selected world leaders, some of whom

were from rogue countries known for atrocities against their citizens. Several of those people had been close friends of Joe's before their untimely deaths. Despite the hardships of his diplomatic work, Joe has always borne everything with patient endurance, always trusting in God's infinite love and mercy. His light has never stopped blazing!

Perhaps you have similar heroes in your own lives whose lights shine particularly brightly. Sometimes these are people who endure great suffering without complaining, always offering it for the benefit and grace for others. Perhaps they've helped others around them with tremendous acts of great charity. Maybe they are the ones who always greet you with smiles on their faces and the willingness to extend a hand, despite your awareness of their own poverty. For whatever reasons they stand out, they are noteworthy to us because they represent a stark, bright contrast against the world surrounding them. There is something rooted and grounded about them. In my experience, I most often find that they are people of great faith, attached to their profound love of God, their Savior Jesus Christ and their fellow man. Their light shines against darkness!

Our readings this weekend speak much about the qualities of those whose light impacts others in wonderful ways. Isaiah speaks about being light to the world. Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the homeless, and clothe the naked. By doing so, "your light shall break forth like the dawn" (Isaiah 58:8). St. Paul speaks of preaching with the power of the Spirit, drawing strength from relying on God's power. Paul's humility and dependence on the Spirit reveal how true evangelization relies on God's strength, helping believers to be authentic witnesses to the world.



In our gospel this weekend, Jesus calls His followers to be "the salt of the earth" and "the light of the world." He encourages believers to let their light shine before others through good deeds, so that all may glorify the Father in heaven. Light has the same brilliance during the day or night. But it's in the night that it stands out most powerfully. Like Joe, we all have the capacity to be light to others. Lord – help us always to be light and salt to those you send our way who need it most, and in doing so, become living testaments to You!

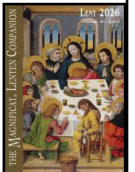

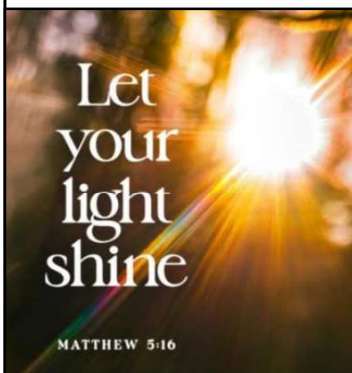
Saudações, irmãos e irmãs.

Tenho um grande amigo, Joe Donnelly, em Brooklyn, Nova York. Ele teve uma carreira incrível, não por causa de grandes riquezas ou posições de prestígio; ele não conquistou nenhuma delas. Ele é incrível por causa dos papéis que desempenhou a serviço dos outros ao longo de sua vida. Eu o conheci há cerca de 45 anos, quando ele administrava as operações da Covenant House em Nova York, trabalhando com o fundador, Padre Bruce Ritter. Nosso grupo musical, Living Waters, fez alguns shows para os jovens sem-teto que eram abrigados lá. Joe então assumiu outros cargos, servindo em Jerusalém por cerca de 10 anos com a Caritas Internationalis, e depois atuou em comissões selecionadas da ONU enquanto era presidente da Caritas Internationalis nos EUA. Ele frequentemente compartilhava comigo histórias sobre as reuniões que teve com líderes mundiais, alguns dos quais eram de países considerados párias, conhecidos por atrocidades contra seus cidadãos. Várias dessas pessoas eram amigas próximas de Joe antes de suas mortes prematuras. Apesar das dificuldades de seu trabalho diplomático, Joe sempre suportou tudo com paciência e perseverança, sempre confiando no amor e na misericórdia infinitos de Deus. Sua luz nunca deixou de brilhar!

**Uma mensagem do nosso clero**  
*Deacon Chuck*

Talvez você também tenha heróis em sua própria vida, pessoas cuja luz brilha de forma particularmente intensa. Às vezes, são pessoas que suportam grandes sofrimentos sem reclamar, sempre oferecendo-os em benefício e graça para os outros. Talvez tenham ajudado aqueles ao seu redor com atos de grande caridade. Talvez sejam aquelas pessoas que sempre o cumprimentam com um sorriso no rosto e com a disposição de estender a mão, apesar de você saber de suas próprias dificuldades. Seja qual for o motivo pelo qual se destacam, elas são notáveis para nós porque representam um contraste marcante e luminoso em relação ao mundo que as cerca. Há algo de sólido e profundo nelas. Na minha experiência, geralmente descubro que são pessoas de grande fé, ligadas ao seu profundo amor a Deus, a Jesus Cristo, seu Salvador, e ao próximo. A luz delas brilha em meio à escuridão!

As leituras deste fim de semana falam muito sobre as qualidades daqueles cuja luz impacta os outros de maneiras maravilhosas. Isaías fala sobre ser luz para o mundo. Compartilhe seu pão com os famintos, abrigue os sem-teto e vista os nus. Ao fazer isso, "a sua luz brilhará como a aurora" (Isaías 58:8). São Paulo fala sobre pregar com o poder do Espírito, buscando força na dependência do poder de Deus. A humildade de Paulo e sua dependência do Espírito revelam como a verdadeira evangelização se baseia na força de Deus, ajudando os crentes a serem testemunhas autênticas para o mundo.



Em nosso evangelho deste fim de semana, Jesus chama seus seguidores a serem "o sal da terra" e "a luz do mundo". Ele encoraja os crentes a deixarem sua luz brilhar diante dos outros por meio de boas obras, para que todos glorifiquem o Pai que está nos céus. A luz tem o mesmo brilho durante o dia ou a noite. Mas é na escuridão que ela se destaca com mais força. Assim como Joe, todos nós temos a capacidade de ser luz para os outros. Senhor, ajuda-nos a sermos sempre luz e sal para aqueles que colocas em nosso caminho e que mais precisam, e, ao fazê-lo, que nos tornemos testemunhas vivas de Ti!

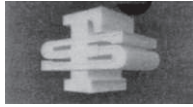
