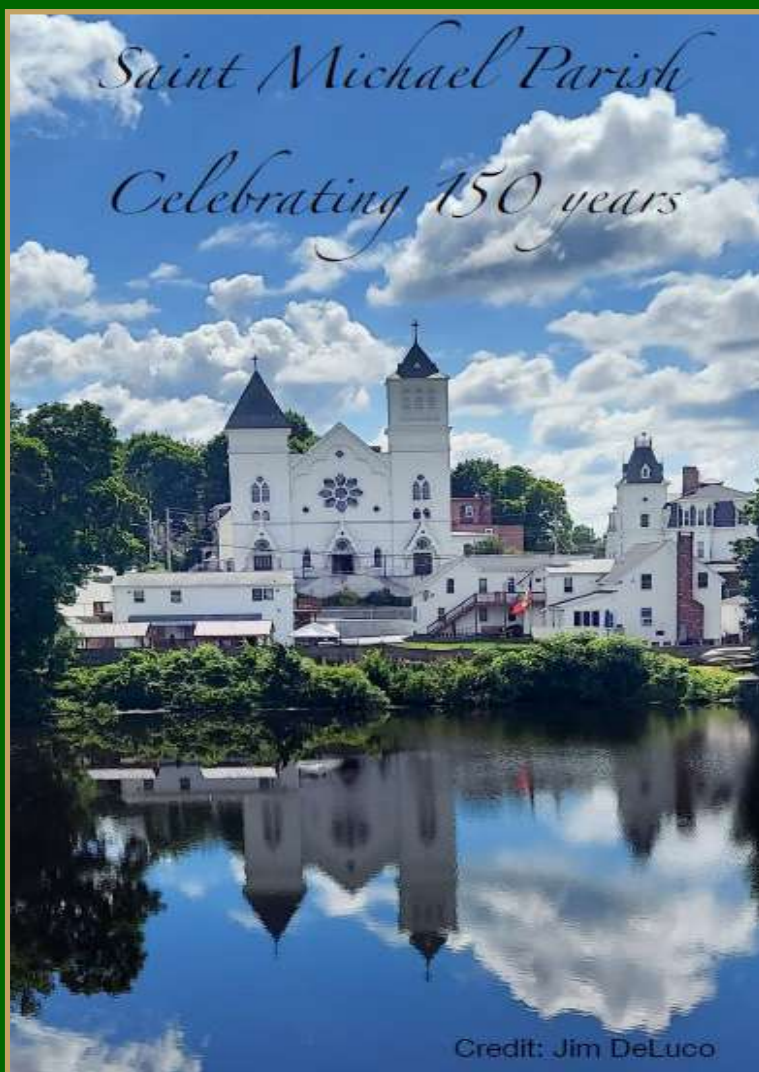

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's readings place one word right at the center of the Christian life: repentance. In the Gospel, Jesus begins His public ministry with a message that is simple, direct, and urgent: "*Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand.*" That line is not meant to frighten us. It is meant to awaken us. Repentance is the doorway into the Kingdom, because only a heart that turns toward God can truly receive what God desires to give.

Repentance, in the Catholic sense, is not merely feeling bad about something we did. It is deeper and more hopeful than guilt. The word means a change of mind and direction. It is the decision to stop walking away from the Lord and begin walking with Him again. And notice when Jesus calls for repentance: not "someday," not "once things settle down," but now—because the Kingdom is not distant. In Christ, it has come near.

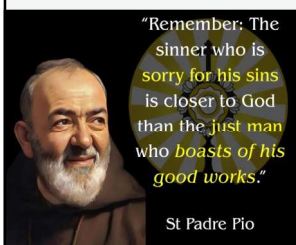
Isaiah's prophecy gives us a powerful image for why repentance matters. He describes people "walking in darkness," yet seeing "a great light." Darkness in Scripture is not simply sadness or hardship; it is confusion, fear, sin, and the heavy shadow of death. But

God does not leave His people there. He sends Light. And that Light is a Person: Jesus Christ.

What, then, is repentance? It is stepping out of the shadows and moving toward the Light. It is allowing Christ to illuminate what is hidden, heal what is wounded, and restore what has been broken. This is why repentance is never humiliation. It is liberation. It is the beginning of freedom.

We see the same movement in the calling of the first disciples. Jesus meets Peter and Andrew in the middle of ordinary life—casting nets, doing their work—and He says, "*Come after me.*" Their response is immediate. They leave their nets and follow. That is repentance in action: not abstract theory, but a concrete decision. Every one of us has "nets" we cling to—habits, resentments, distractions, fears, comforts—things that keep us anchored to what is familiar even when Christ is calling us forward.

Saint Paul, too, reminds us that repentance includes turning away from division. He pleads for unity: "*that there be no divisions among you.*" A divided heart cannot fully receive the Gospel. Repentance asks us to return not only to God, but also to one another—to forgiveness, humility, and communion.



In every Mass, we live this call again. We begin by acknowledging our sins, not to dwell on them, but to open ourselves to mercy. We hear the Word that calls us back. And we receive the Eucharist, the very life of the Kingdom, given to strengthen us for the journey. Repentance is not a one-time event; it is the steady rhythm of Christian life—returning, again and again, to the Lord who never tires of welcoming us home.

This week, let Jesus' first words echo in your heart: *Repent*. Not as condemnation, but as invitation. The Kingdom is near. The Light has come. And the Lord is calling you—today.

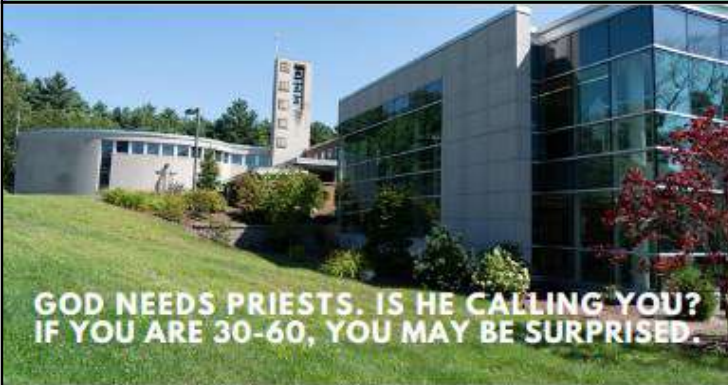

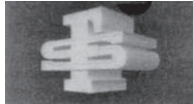
