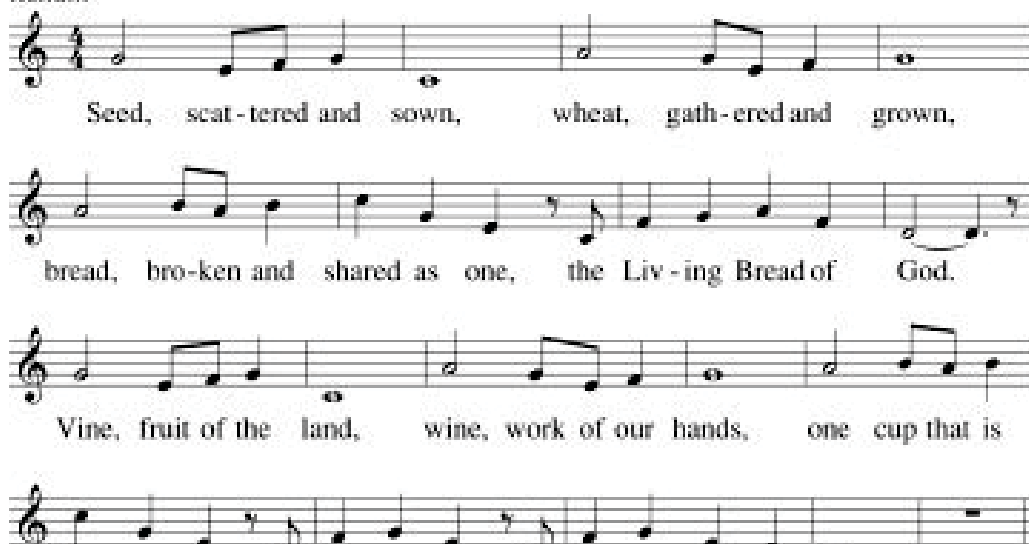

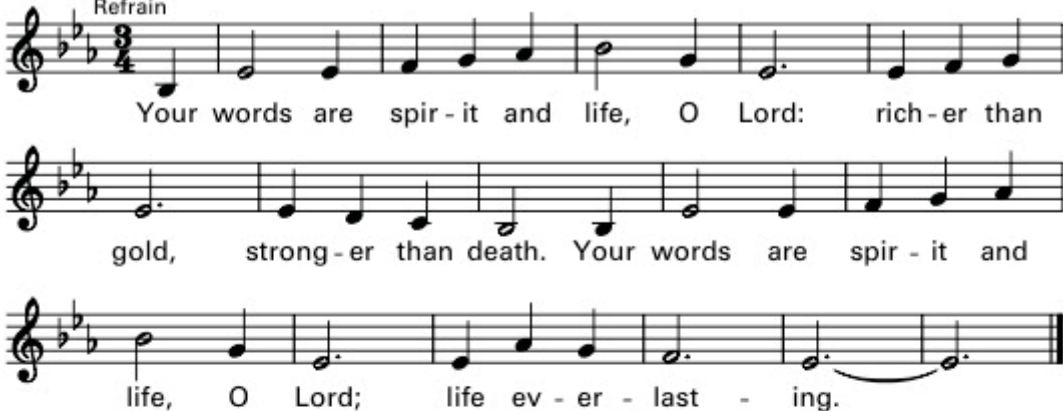

Recessional Hymn: Missal #214 Holy God, We Praise Thy Name

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This line from St. Paul's letter to the Romans really struck me this week: "I consider that the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us."

St. Paul was no stranger to suffering. He endured persecution, imprisonment, rejection, and hardship, and I feel confident saying we are all no strangers to suffering either. Perhaps you lost someone unexpectedly and wonder why? Maybe you have experienced struggles in your family relationships. Maybe you worry about money and finances, do I even need to mention the cost of college these days?

But St. Paul reminds us that suffering is fleeting, even if it lasts a lifetime. Why? Because suffering ends at death, when, hopefully, we enter the Kingdom of God. I know this is easier to remember than to live. When I'm in a difficult situation, and perhaps when you are too, it's easy to lose sight of the bigger picture, the burden we carry in that moment can feel crippling. But Paul is reminding us that our suffering is temporary and that God is still writing our story.

A Message from Our Clergy

The Gospel reinforces that message through the Parable of the Sower. In this parable, Jesus describes seeds falling on different kinds of ground, and where the seeds fall matters. Some spring up quickly but wither under hardship. Others spring up only to be choked by weeds, symbolizing our worries. And, yes, some fall on rich, fertile soil that produces an abundant harvest.

In thinking of these scenarios, I wonder how many of us identify with the weeds crowding out the harvest. In other words, we want to follow Christ, but the worries of everyday life crowd Him out; deadlines, family responsibilities, financial concerns, health worries, and the endless stream of demands that consume our lives. Even in that situation, though, we have to remember God has not given up on us.

This message is also carried through the first reading from Isaiah. Just as rain and snow water the earth and never return without accomplishing their purpose, God's Word never returns empty. It is only human nature, more so than ever, to expect immediate results from our prayers, but we have to remember that God is always working to support us, even when we don't see or understand it. Like a hidden seed underground, His grace is taking root long before we see the signs of it.

This message is more important today than ever. We live in a culture that expects instant answers and immediate success, if something takes too long, we assume it isn't working. Have you ever sent an email expecting an immediate response, only to not receive one? God's timeline is different, eternal, one might say. God wants to draw us near and form our hearts, not simply fix our circumstances.

What do we do, then, when we are suffering? Stay close to Christ. Pray, even when it is hard or feels empty. Keep serving, even when you feel discouraged. Continue to trust in Christ and His love for us.

This week, I invite you to carry with you the quote from St. Paul that I started with. Rip it out of this column or take a photo with your phone:

"I consider that the sufferings of this present time are as nothing compared with the glory to be revealed for us."

Whatever burden you are carrying today, remember this: your suffering is real, but it is not the end of the story. God is still planting seeds of hope, and in His perfect time, He will bring forth a harvest more glorious than we can imagine.

As part of the 2026 National Eucharistic Pilgrimage — "One Nation Under God" — nine Perpetual Pilgrims carried the Blessed Sacrament up the Eastern Seaboard along the St. Frances Xavier Cabrini Route

beginning Memorial Day weekend, when the journey started in the Diocese of St. Augustine, Florida. The six-week pilgrimage passed through 18 dioceses in most of the original thirteen colonies before concluding in Philadelphia on July 5, in celebration of our nation's 250th anniversary.

On June 27 and 28, the pilgrimage reached the Archdiocese of Boston. More than 2,500 of the faithful joined Archbishop Richard G. Henning for a 2.5-mile Eucharistic procession along the Freedom Trail, from Boston Common



to Bunker Hill in Charlestown, passing landmarks including the Old South Meeting House and the Paul Revere House. The following day, the archbishop led adoration at Lexington Battle Green, site of the "shot heard round the world."

Parishioners from St. Michael's joined pilgrims at these historic sites to pray for our country as it entered its 250th year — walking with Our Lord through the very streets where our nation's founding story began.

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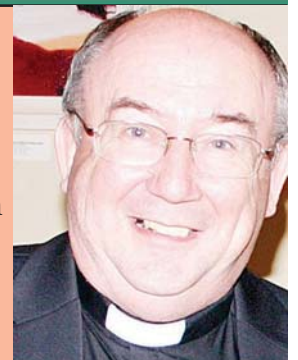


Welcoming Fr. Peter Devlin

Brazilian & Portuguese Community Information

Esta frase da Carta de São Paulo aos Romanos realmente me marcou nesta semana: “Julgo que os sofrimentos do tempo presente não têm proporção com a glória que há de ser revelada em nós”.

São Paulo conhecia bem o sofrimento. Ele enfrentou perseguições, prisões, rejeição e adversidades; e posso afirmar com segurança que nós também conhecemos o sofrimento. Talvez você tenha perdido alguém inesperadamente e se pergunte o porquê. Talvez enfrente dificuldades em seus relacionamentos familiares. Talvez se preocupe com dinheiro e finanças — preciso sequer mencionar o custo da faculdade hoje em dia?

Mas São Paulo nos lembra que o sofrimento é passageiro, mesmo que dure a vida toda. Por quê? Porque o sofrimento termina com a morte, quando, se Deus quiser, entraremos no Reino de Deus. Sei que é mais fácil lembrar disso do que vivenciá-lo. Quando estou em uma situação difícil — e talvez quando você também esteja —, é fácil perder de vista o panorama geral; o fardo que carregamos naquele momento pode parecer paralisante. Mas Paulo nos recorda que o nosso sofrimento é temporário e que Deus continua escrevendo a nossa história.

Uma Mensagem do Nosso Clero

O Evangelho reforça essa mensagem por meio da Parábola do Semeador. Nessa parábola, Jesus descreve sementes caindo em diferentes tipos de solo, e o local onde elas caem é importante. Algumas brotam rapidamente, mas murcham diante das adversidades. Outras brotam, apenas para serem sufocadas pelo joio, que simboliza as nossas preocupações. E, sim, algumas caem em solo rico e fértil, que produz uma colheita abundante.

Ao refletir sobre esses cenários, pergunto-me quantos de nós nos identificamos com o joio que sufoca a colheita. Em outras palavras, queremos seguir a Cristo, mas as preocupações do dia a dia acabam por deixá-Lo de lado: prazos, responsabilidades familiares, questões financeiras, preocupações com a saúde e o fluxo interminável de exigências que consomem a nossa vida. Mesmo nessa situação, porém, temos de nos lembrar de que Deus não desistiu de nós.

Essa mensagem também está presente na primeira leitura, extraída do livro de Isaías. Assim como a chuva e a neve regam a terra e jamais retornam sem cumprir o seu propósito, a Palavra de Deus nunca volta vazia. É da natureza humana — hoje mais do que nunca — esperar resultados imediatos de nossas orações; no entanto, precisamos lembrar que Deus está sempre agindo em nosso favor, mesmo quando não vemos ou compreendemos isso. Como uma semente oculta sob a terra, a Sua graça vai criando raízes muito antes de percebermos os seus sinais.

Essa mensagem é mais importante hoje do que nunca. Vivemos em uma cultura que espera respostas instantâneas e sucesso imediato; se algo demora muito, presumimos que não está funcionando. Você já enviou um e-mail esperando uma resposta imediata, apenas para não recebê-la? O tempo de Deus é diferente — eterno, poderíamos dizer. Deus quer nos aproximar e moldar nossos corações, não simplesmente consertar nossas circunstâncias.

O que fazemos, então, quando estamos sofrendo? Permaneça próximo de Cristo. Ore, mesmo quando for difícil ou parecer vazio. Continue servindo, mesmo quando se sentir desanimado. Continue a confiar em Cristo e no Seu amor por nós.

Nesta semana, convido você a levar consigo a citação de São Paulo com a qual comecei. Recorte-a desta coluna ou tire uma foto com o seu celular:

“Considero que os sofrimentos do tempo presente não têm comparação com a glória que há de ser revelada em nós.”

Qualquer que seja o fardo que você carrega hoje, lembre-se disto: seu sofrimento é real, mas não é o fim da história. Deus continua plantando sementes de esperança e, no Seu tempo perfeito, fará surgir uma colheita mais gloriosa do que podemos imaginar.

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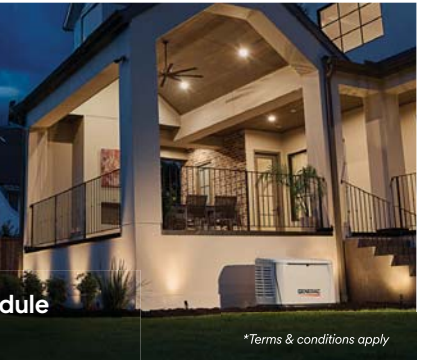
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
