Thanksgiving After Mass

It is fitting to spend a few moments in silence after Mass, offering our own personal prayers of thanksgiving after receiving Our Lord in the Sacrament of Holy Communion. One of the many features of our new Source & Summit Missals is the fine collection of devotional prayers, including these beautiful prayers of Thanksgiving After Mass:

Prayer of Saint Thomas Aquinas Prayer to the Most Holy Redeemer (*Anima Christi*) Prayer After Communion Before A Crucifix Prayer of Self-Offering (*Saint Ignatius Loyola*) The Universal Prayer Prayer to the Blessed Virgin Mary

These prayers may be found in the back of the Missal on pages 585 to 587. You are also encouraged to pray at any of the sacred shrines around the church, perhaps lighting a votive candle as a physical reminder that your prayers continue to be heard in heaven long after they leave your lips.

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"Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live."

This Sunday's readings offer a powerful call to return to the Lord—not as a distant deity, but as one who is intimately near, dwelling in our hearts, revealed in Christ, and encountered in every act of compassion we extend to others. In other words, in RELATIONSHIP.

In our first reading, Moses reminds the people of Israel that God's command is not remote or mysterious. "It is not up in the sky... nor across the sea..." Rather, it is "already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out." What a beautiful reassurance! The life of faith is not reserved for the elite or the mystically gifted. It is a matter of daily choice—of turning again and again to the Lord, especially in our need. God's law of love is already within us, waiting to be lived.

St. Paul, writing to the Colossians, reveals just how near God has come to us in Jesus Christ. Christ is the "image of the invisible God," the one through whom all things were created and the one through whom all things are reconciled. He is before all things, and yet

he chooses to dwell in us, to bring peace by the blood of His cross. When we are in need, when we feel overwhelmed, or lost, or small in the face of suffering, Paul reminds us: Christ is not far. He holds all things together—including us.

And then we come to the Gospel of Luke, the familiar and beloved parable of the Good Samaritan. The scholar of the law asks Jesus, "Who is my neighbor?" And Jesus doesn't give a textbook answer. He tells a story. A man lies beaten and abandoned on the road. Religious leaders pass by, but it is a Samaritan—someone considered an outsider—who stops, binds the man's wounds, and cares for him.

The Gospel message is clear: turning to the Lord in our need must lead us to see and respond to the needs of others (yes, enemy our "enemies"). Love of God and love of neighbor are inseparable. The "neighbor" isn't defined by proximity, ethnicity, or religious affiliation—it is anyone in need. Jesus challenges us not to ask, "Who is my neighbor?" but instead, "Am I being a neighbor?"

So this week, let us reflect on how we turn to the Lord in our need. Do we trust that God is near, dwelling within us? Do we allow him to dwell within us?Do we allow ourselves to be transformed by Christ, who holds all things together? And most importantly, when we see someone hurting on the roadside of life, do we stop? Do we act? Do we love?

The Lord is not far. He is in your heart. Turn to Him—and live. And then, go and do likewise.

ATTENTION ALL VOLUNTEERS! PROTECTING GOD'S CHILDREN

Thank you all for volunteering for the various ministries at St. Michael's. Your efforts keep our corner of God's vineyard fruitful. In our activities we always need to be keeping a safe environment for all. In the wake of the abuse scandal from two decades ago, the Archdiocese of Boston now requires certain tasks and trainings for all parish volunteers: every volunteer must complete and submit CORIs annually, and every parish volunteer must also take a class called **"Protecting God's Children"** (PGC) at least once.

To assist in these efforts, St. Michael's is offering two PGC classes this summer, right here in Hudson:

- Saturday, July 19th from 9 a.m. to 12 p.m.
- Tuesday, August 12th from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m.

We are asking any parish volunteer who has not already taken this class to sign up for one of them , or if neither of these dates work for you, there are other sessions being offered throughout the Archdiocese at **www.virtusonline.org**. Please note, this requirement is not restricted to those who serve the youth – it is for every volunteer, every staff member, and every member of the clergy team. These training classes must be completed prior to the fall startup of the various ministries here at St. Michael's.

Preregistration is required. Again, to register or view the list of classes being held elsewhere, go to

<u>www.virtusonline.org</u>, create an account, and register. If you do not have access to a computer and need assistance with the signup, please call or visit Lori or Andrea at the parish center. We thank you for your cooperation in this matter. This class is a requirement for continuing in any ministry in the Archdiocese of Boston.


