

Greetings, brothers and sisters. In our readings from last weekend, we heard Jesus tell his disciples, and us by extension, not to be afraid - even if we should face persecution, but to always trust in God our Father's care for us, and to be bold in Christ before others. These wonderful thoughts can serve as a helpful entre into the essential question for this weekend: can we remain faithful to Christ even when following Him becomes difficult?

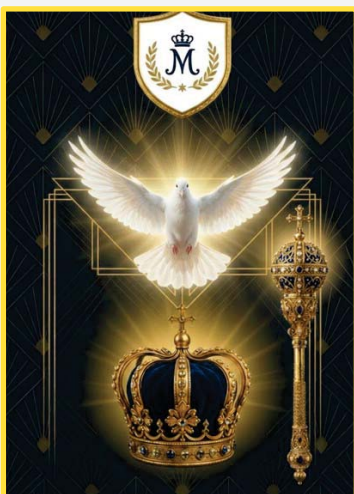
In our first reading from 2 Kings, we hear the wonderful story of the hospitality of the Shunammite woman towards Elisha – whom she recognizes as a holy man of God. Elisha is encouraged to do something for her because of her kindnesses towards him when he visits. When his servant Gehazi tells Elisha that the woman has no son and her husband is 'getting on in years', Elisha tells her she will have a son within the next year. The response in our Psalm this weekend reflects the joy which the woman experiences.

In our gospel from Matthew, as we have seen in prior weeks, there is a cost of discipleship, but also a reward. Jesus' words are very challenging. We are invited to, and in fact *must*, place Christ above everything. This may feel challenging while we're on earth, because we are limited by our humanity from glimpsing the beatific vision of beholding God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit in heaven – so glorious that everything else pales in comparison to it. We are distracted by our attachments to relationships and the myriads of material goods that surround us in our lives. For now – we strive to love Him with our whole souls, hearts and minds as best as we can, and ask that our faith journeys bring us into closer relationship with Him with each passing day.

A Message from Our Clergy

Deacon Chuck

On our bulletin cover this weekend, we have a beautiful, traditional image of the **Crown, Scepter and Holy Ghost** in honor of Holy Ghost Feast being celebrated by our Portuguese and Brazilian communities. The crown is surmounted by a dove, symbolizing the Holy Spirit, and includes a scepter, representing the kingship and authority that comes from God. These symbols relate beautifully to our readings this weekend. The crown represents putting Christ first in our lives, ahead of our attachments, and at the heart of all we say and do. It is through the gifts of the Holy Spirit that we are able to do this. A cross adorns both the crown and scepter which are symbols of God's authority, but for a different kind of kingship – where true greatness is not found in power but in self-sacrifice. Again, it is the Holy Spirit that strengthens us to carry our crosses faithfully! Finally, the tradition of the Holy Ghost feast emphasizes hospitality, generosity, feeding the community, and caring for the poor. We see the examples of this in what was done through the story of Elisha and the Shunammite woman.



We are grateful to our Portuguese and Brazilian communities for keeping this and so many wonderful traditions alive in our parish. We are collectively made so rich by them. On this traditional feast of the Holy Spirit, we invite the Holy Spirit to inspire us to generosity, hospitality, feeding the hungry and caring for our neighbors. This is how we place God first, even when it costs.

May our regular participation in our liturgy and reception of the Holy Eucharist serve to strengthen us in our resolve to serve God through our service to others, and enable us to reap the rich rewards awaiting us when we are with Christ in heaven for all eternity!

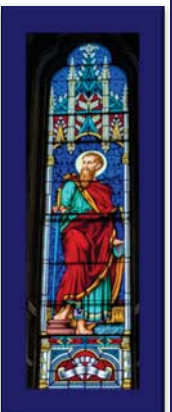

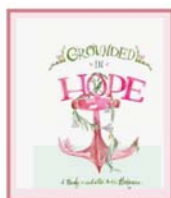


walking with purpose

Important Reminder: Proper Receiving of Holy Communion

Catholic parishioners who are properly spiritually disposed, without mortal sin, are invited to receive Communion at Mass with great reverence.

One option to do this is the encouraged use of the kneelers to receive Communion on the tongue. If you elect to receive Communion in the hand, please place one hand under the other and present an open palm of the hand to receive the Eucharist. Do not grab or take the Eucharist from the minister. When the minister says "The Body of Christ", the proper response is "Amen". The Eucharist must be fully consumed immediately in front of the minister. You must not remove it from your mouth or 'carry' the host back to your pew. Our ministers are trained to monitor for this.

Catholics who are not properly disposed, and non-Catholic friends and visitors are encouraged to come forward with arms crossed over the chest, to receive a blessing from either the priest or the deacon.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping to make receiving Communion a reverent act of spiritual worship.

Brazilian & Portuguese Community Information

Saudações, irmãos e irmãs. Nas leituras do último fim de semana, ouvimos Jesus dizer aos seus discípulos — e, por extensão, a nós — para não termos medo, mesmo que enfrentemos perseguição; para sempre confiarmos no cuidado de Deus, nosso Pai, por nós; e para sermos corajosos em Cristo diante dos outros. Essas reflexões maravilhosas podem servir como uma introdução útil para a questão essencial deste fim de semana: podemos permanecer fiéis a Cristo mesmo quando segui-Lo se torna difícil?

Em nossa primeira leitura, extraída do Segundo Livro dos Reis, ouvimos a maravilhosa história da hospitalidade da mulher sunamita para com Eliseu — a quem ela reconhece como um santo homem de Deus. Eliseu é incentivado a fazer algo por ela, em retribuição à bondade que ela lhe demonstrava sempre que ele a visitava. Quando seu servo, Geazi, informa a Eliseu que a mulher não tem filhos e que seu marido já é idoso, Eliseu lhe diz que ela terá um filho dentro de um ano. O refrão do Salmo deste fim de semana reflete a alegria que essa mulher experimenta.

Uma Mensagem do Nosso Clero

No Evangelho de Mateus, como vimos nas semanas anteriores, há um custo para o discipulado, mas também uma recompensa. As palavras de Jesus são um grande desafio. Somos convidados — e, de fato, devemos — colocar Cristo acima de tudo. Isso pode parecer difícil enquanto estamos na terra, pois nossa humanidade nos impede de vislumbrar a visão beatífica — contemplar Deus como Pai, Filho e Espírito Santo no céu —, algo tão glorioso que todo o resto empalidece em comparação. Somos distraídos por nossos apegos a relacionamentos e pela infinidade de bens materiais que nos cercam na vida. Por ora, esforçamo-nos para amá-Lo com toda a nossa alma, coração e mente, da melhor maneira possível, e pedimos que nossa caminhada de fé nos conduza a um relacionamento mais próximo com Ele a cada dia que passa.

Na capa do nosso folheto deste fim de semana, temos uma bela e tradicional imagem da Coroa do Espírito Santo, em honra à Festa do Espírito Santo celebrada pelas nossas comunidades portuguesa e brasileira. A coroa é encimada por uma pomba, que simboliza o Espírito Santo, e inclui um cetro, representando a realeza e a autoridade que provêm de Deus. Esses símbolos harmonizam-se perfeitamente com as leituras deste fim de semana. A coroa representa colocar Cristo em primeiro lugar em nossas vidas — acima de nossos apegos e no centro de tudo o que dizemos e fazemos. É por meio dos dons do Espírito Santo que somos capazes de fazer isso. Uma cruz adorna tanto a coroa quanto o cetro — símbolos da autoridade de Deus, mas de um tipo diferente de realeza, onde a verdadeira grandeza não reside no poder, mas no sacrifício de si mesmo. Mais uma vez, é o Espírito Santo que nos fortalece para carregar nossas cruces com fidelidade! Por fim, a tradição da Festa do Espírito Santo enfatiza a hospitalidade, a generosidade, o ato de alimentar a comunidade e o cuidado com os pobres. Vemos exemplos disso na história de Eliseu e da mulher sunamita.



Somos gratos às nossas comunidades portuguesa e brasileira por manterem viva esta e tantas outras tradições maravilhosas em nossa paróquia. Elas nos enriquecem imensamente. Nesta festa tradicional do Espírito Santo, convidamos o Espírito Santo a nos inspirar à generosidade, à hospitalidade, a alimentar os famintos e a cuidar do próximo. É assim que colocamos Deus em primeiro lugar, mesmo quando isso exige sacrifício. Que a nossa participação habitual na liturgia e o recebimento da Sagrada Eucaristia nos fortaleçam no propósito de servir a Deus por meio do serviço ao próximo, e nos capacitem a colher as ricas recompensas que nos aguardam quando estivermos com Cristo no céu, por toda a eternidade!
