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One of the most profound truths in this Sunday's readings is also one of the simplest: God sees differently than we do.

In the first reading, the prophet Samuel is sent to anoint a new king. When he sees Jesse's older sons, he assumes the strongest and most impressive must be the chosen one. But the Lord corrects him with a powerful reminder: *"Not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance, but the LORD looks into the heart."*

God chooses David—the youngest son, the one overlooked, the shepherd still out in the field.

This moment reminds us that God's vision goes deeper than appearances, status, or outward success. God sees the heart. And that should both humble and comfort us.

The Gospel continues this theme in a dramatic way. Jesus heals the man born blind. While others debate the cause of his blindness—whether it was his sin or the sin of his parents—Jesus shifts the focus entirely. The miracle becomes an opportunity for God's works to be revealed. By the end of the story, the man who was physically blind comes to see clearly, while those who thought they understood everything remain spiritually blind.

## A Message from Our Clergy

In other words, sight is not just about our eyes—it is about our hearts.

Saint Paul captures this beautifully in the second reading when he reminds the early Christians: *"You were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of light."*

Lent is precisely the season when the Church invites us to move from darkness into light. It is a time of reflection, repentance, and renewal. But it is also a time of learning to see the way God sees.

Often we judge ourselves—or others—by the wrong standards. We focus on achievements, appearances, mistakes, or labels. But God looks deeper. God sees potential where others see weakness. God sees faith where others see failure. God sees a future where we sometimes see only our past.

Think again about David. He was not the obvious choice. He was young, inexperienced, and literally out tending sheep while the others were presented to the prophet. Yet God saw something in him that no one else noticed.

How often does God work that way in our lives?

Sometimes the people who make the greatest difference are those who feel overlooked. Sometimes the gifts God gives us are hidden in places we least expect. And sometimes the grace of God is working quietly in our hearts long before anyone else can see it.

The Gospel also challenges us to ask an uncomfortable question: Where might we still be blind?

Perhaps we are blind to the needs of someone around us. Perhaps we are blind to the quiet ways God is working in our lives. Or perhaps we are blind to our own ability to grow in faith.



The good news is that Jesus does not leave us in darkness. Just as he opened the eyes of the man born blind, he continues to open our hearts—through prayer, through the sacraments, and through the grace of this Lenten season.

As we continue our journey toward Easter, let us ask the Lord for the gift of true sight: the ability to see others with compassion, to see ourselves with humility, and to see the world through the light of Christ.

Because when we begin to see the way God sees, everything changes.

In preparation for the Feast of The Divine Mercy, the Lord asked Sister Faustina to make a novena of prayer from Good Friday to the following Saturday. For each of the nine days, our Lord gave Sister Faustina a different intention; all mankind, especially sinners; the souls of priests and religious; all devout and faithful souls; those who do not believe in Him and those who do not yet know Him; the souls of the separated brethren; the meek and humble souls and the souls of the little children; the souls who especially venerate and glorify His mercy; the souls detained in purgatory; souls who have become lukewarm.

*I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fount of My Mercy that they may draw therefrom strength and refreshment and whatever grace they have need of in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death (Diary 1209).*

# Brazilian & Portuguese Community Information

## Quarto Domingo da Quaresma (15 de março de 2026)

Uma das verdades mais profundas nas leituras deste domingo é também uma das mais simples: Deus vê de forma diferente da nossa.

Na primeira leitura, o profeta Samuel é enviado para ungi um novo rei. Quando vê os filhos mais velhos de Jessé, ele presume que o mais forte e impressionante deve ser o escolhido. Mas o Senhor o corrige com uma poderosa lembrança: “Deus não vê como o homem vê, pois o homem vê a aparência, mas o Senhor olha para o coração”.

Deus escolhe Davi — o filho mais novo, o esquecido, o pastor que ainda está no campo.

Este momento nos lembra que a visão de Deus vai além das aparências, do status ou do sucesso exterior. Deus vê o coração. E isso deve nos humilhar e nos confortar.

O Evangelho continua esse tema de forma dramática. Jesus cura o cego de nascença. Enquanto outros debatem a causa de sua cegueira — se foi seu pecado ou o pecado de seus pais — Jesus muda completamente o foco. O milagre se torna uma oportunidade para que as obras de Deus sejam reveladas. Ao final da história, o homem que era fisicamente cego passa a enxergar claramente, enquanto aqueles que pensavam que entendiam tudo permanecem espiritualmente cegos.

## Uma mensagem do nosso clero

*Deacon Jared*

Em outras palavras, a visão não se trata apenas dos nossos olhos — trata-se dos nossos corações.

São Paulo expressa isso lindamente na segunda leitura, quando lembra aos primeiros cristãos: “Vocês eram trevas, mas agora são luz no Senhor. Vivam como filhos da luz.”

A Quaresma é precisamente o tempo em que a Igreja nos convida a sair das trevas e entrar na luz. É um tempo de reflexão, arrependimento e renovação. Mas também é um tempo de aprender a ver como Deus vê.

Muitas vezes, julgamos a nós mesmos — ou aos outros — por padrões errados. Nos concentramos em conquistas, aparências, erros ou rótulos. Mas Deus olha mais profundamente. Deus vê potencial onde outros veem fraqueza. Deus vê fé onde outros veem fracasso. Deus vê um futuro onde às vezes vemos apenas o nosso passado.

Pense novamente em Davi. Ele não era a escolha óbvia. Era jovem, inexperiente e estava literalmente cuidando de ovelhas enquanto os outros eram apresentados ao profeta. Mesmo assim, Deus viu algo nele que ninguém mais percebeu.

Com que frequência Deus age dessa maneira em nossas vidas?

Às vezes, as pessoas que fazem a maior diferença são aquelas que se sentem negligenciadas. Às vezes, os dons que Deus nos dá estão escondidos em lugares que menos esperamos. E às vezes, a graça de Deus está agindo silenciosamente em nossos corações muito antes que qualquer outra pessoa possa vê-la.

O Evangelho também nos desafia a fazer uma pergunta incômoda: Onde ainda podemos estar cegos?

Talvez estejamos cegos para as necessidades de alguém ao nosso redor. Talvez estejamos cegos para as maneiras silenciosas pelas quais Deus está agindo em nossas vidas. Ou talvez estejamos cegos para nossa própria capacidade de crescer na fé.




A boa notícia é que Jesus não nos deixa na escuridão. Assim como abriu os olhos do cego de nascença, Ele continua a abrir nossos corações — por meio da oração, dos sacramentos e da graça deste tempo da Quaresma.

Ao prosseguirmos nossa jornada rumo à Páscoa, peçamos ao Senhor o dom da verdadeira visão: a capacidade de ver os outros com compaixão, de nos vermos com humildade e de ver o mundo através da luz de Cristo.

Porque quando começamos a ver como Deus vê, tudo muda.
