



As we enter the Fifth Sunday of Lent, the Church places before us a powerful refrain: “With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.” ([Catholic Gallery](#))

These words rise from Psalm 130—“Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord.” ([Catholic Gallery](#)) They are not spoken from comfort, but from struggle, from grief, from a place many of us know all too well.

This Sunday’s readings draw us into the story of Lazarus. Jesus stands before a tomb. He weeps. And then, in a moment that changes everything, He calls Lazarus out of death into life. ([Catholic Daily Readings](#))

This is not just a miracle story—it is a promise. It is a promise that God does not abandon us in the tombs we experience in life—whether those are grief, sin, fear, division, or uncertainty. And in our world today, we see many such tombs.

A Message from Our Clergy

Deacon Jared

We see war and violence continuing in parts of the world. We see division in our communities and in our nation. We see families carrying quiet burdens—health struggles, loss, anxiety about the future. And we see a culture that often feels quick to judge, but slow to forgive. Into all of this, the Church dares to proclaim: With the Lord there is mercy. With Him, redemption is not partial—it is full.

Notice something important in the Gospel. Jesus does not avoid the pain. He does not rush past it. He enters into it. He weeps with Martha and Mary. He stands at the tomb. God meets us *there*—in the depths. But He does not leave us there. He calls Lazarus by name. And that detail matters. Because it reminds us that God’s mercy is not abstract—it is personal. He calls each of us out of whatever binds us. He calls us by name out of sin, out of despair, out of anything that keeps us from life. And yet, there is one more detail: Lazarus comes out, but still bound. Jesus then tells the community, “Untie him and let him go.”

Redemption is God’s work—but it is also ours. In a world that often binds people with labels, grudges, and division, we are called to be the ones who help “untie” one another—with forgiveness, with compassion, with patience.

This is where the Gospel meets our world today. If there is conflict, we can be instruments of reconciliation. If there is suffering, we can be present. If there is division, we can choose mercy over judgment.

Lent is not simply about giving things up—it is about allowing God to raise us up.

As we approach Holy Week, the question is not whether God is offering mercy—He always is. The question is whether we are ready to receive it... and to extend it.



Because the same voice that called Lazarus out of the tomb is calling each of us now: Come out. Be free. Live.

And with the Lord—always—there is mercy, and fullness of redemption.



ABOUT THE COVER

The Annunciation by Murillo, 1655–1660, St. Petersburg.

The **Annunciation** from Latin *annuntiatio*; is, according to the Gospel of Luke, the announcement made by the archangel Gabriel to Mary that she would conceive and bear a son through a virgin birth and become the mother of Jesus Christ, the Messiah and Son of God, marking the Incarnation. According to Luke 1:26 the Annunciation occurred in the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy with John the Baptist. Many Christians observe this event with the Feast of the Annunciation on March 25, an approximation of the northern vernal equinox nine full months before Christmas, the traditional birthday of Jesus.

SUNDAY, APRIL 12—Divine Mercy Chaplet Prayer Service, 3:00 p.m., Upper Church.

In preparation for the Feast of The Divine Mercy, the Lord asked Sister Faustina to make a novena of prayer from Good Friday to the following Saturday. These nine days of prayer (the word 'novena' means nine) before the Feast of Mercy are like the nine days of prayer in the upper room before the day of Pentecost: (see Acts 1:14).

For each of the nine days, our Lord gave Sister Faustina a different intention; all mankind, especially sinners; the souls of priests and religious; all devout and faithful souls; those who do not believe in Him and those who do not yet know Him; the souls of the separated brethren; the meek and humble souls and the souls of the little children; the souls who especially venerate and glorify His mercy; the souls detained in purgatory; souls who have become lukewarm.

I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fount of My Mercy that they may draw therefrom strength and refreshment and whatever grace they have need of in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death (Diary 1209).



Brazilian & Portuguese Community Information

Essas palavras brotam do Salmo 130: “Das profundezas clamo a ti, Senhor.” (Catholic Gallery) Elas não são proferidas com consolo, mas com luta, com dor, com um lugar que muitos de nós conhecemos muito bem.

As leituras deste domingo nos conduzem à história de Lázaro. Jesus está diante de um túmulo. Ele chora. E então, num momento que muda tudo, Ele chama Lázaro da morte para a vida. (Catholic Daily Readings)

Esta não é apenas uma história de milagre — é uma promessa. É a promessa de que Deus não nos abandona nos túmulos que encontramos na vida — sejam eles de tristeza, pecado, medo, divisão ou incerteza. E em nosso mundo hoje, vemos muitos desses túmulos.

Uma mensagem do nosso clero
Deacon Jared

Vemos guerras e violência persistindo em algumas partes do mundo. Vemos divisões em nossas comunidades e em nossa nação. Vemos famílias carregando fardos silenciosos — problemas de saúde, perdas, ansiedade em relação ao futuro. E vemos uma cultura que muitas vezes se mostra rápida em julgar, mas lenta em perdoar. Em meio a tudo isso, a Igreja ousa proclamar: Com o Senhor há misericórdia. Com Ele, a redenção não é parcial — é plena.

Observe algo importante no Evangelho. Jesus não evita a dor. Ele não passa por ela rapidamente. Ele a enfrenta. Ele chora com Marta e Maria. Ele permanece junto ao túmulo. Deus nos encontra ali — nas profundezas. Mas Ele não nos abandona ali. Ele chama Lázaro pelo nome. E esse detalhe importa. Porque nos lembra que a misericórdia de Deus não é abstrata — é pessoal. Ele chama cada um de nós para fora de tudo o que nos aprisiona. Ele nos chama pelo nome para fora do pecado, do desespero, de tudo o que nos impede de viver. E, no entanto, há mais um detalhe: Lázaro sai, mas ainda amarrado. Jesus então diz à comunidade: “Desatem-no e deixem-no ir”.

A redenção é obra de Deus, mas também é nossa. Num mundo que muitas vezes aprisiona as pessoas com rótulos, ressentimentos e divisões, somos chamados a ser aqueles que ajudam a "desatar" uns aos outros — com perdão, compaixão e paciência.

É aqui que o Evangelho encontra o nosso mundo hoje. Se há conflito, podemos ser instrumentos de reconciliação. Se há sofrimento, podemos estar presentes. Se há divisão, podemos escolher a misericórdia em vez do julgamento.

A Quaresma não se trata simplesmente de renunciar a coisas — trata-se de permitir que Deus nos levante.

Ao nos aproximarmos da Semana Santa, a questão não é se Deus está oferecendo misericórdia — Ele sempre oferece. A questão é se estamos prontos para recebê-la... e para estendê-la.



Porque a mesma voz que chamou Lázaro para fora do túmulo está chamando cada um de nós agora: Saiam. Sejam livres. Vivam.

E com o Senhor — sempre — há misericórdia e plenitude de redenção.
