### Third Sunday of Lent — Jesus, the Living Water

As we gather on this Third Sunday of Lent, the Church invites us deeper into the heart of our journey with Christ — a journey of conversion, reflection, and new life. Today’s readings are striking in their simplicity and depth, opening before us the profound truth of who Jesus is: *the source of living water*.

In the first reading from Exodus, we hear the Israelites in the desert, weary and thirsty, complaining to Moses: “Why did you ever make us leave Egypt? Was it just to make us die here of thirst?”. In their distress, God instructs Moses to strike the rock at Horeb, and “water

gushed out”. Here we see a foreshadowing — a symbol — of God’s mercy flowing from the rock in the wilderness. Yet, as powerful as this moment is, it is but a sign pointing toward a greater reality that will be revealed in Christ.

In today’s Gospel, Jesus stands at Jacob’s well in Samaria, tired from travel, and asks a simple but startling request: “Give me a drink”. This moment opens a conversation that transforms not only the Samaritan woman but all who enter into the life-giving presence of Jesus. When Jesus speaks of *living water*, he isn’t talking about physical water that quenches thirst for a moment. He is speaking of the *waters of eternal life* — the grace of God poured into every heart willing to receive it.

Jesus tells her, “Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst”. In these words, Christ reveals that the deepest yearnings of the human heart — for love, peace, purpose, belonging, and joy — will only be fulfilled in Him. The living water Jesus offers is none other than the gift of the Holy Spirit, the presence of God within us, renewing us from the inside out.

What a beautiful image for us in this season of Lent! We come before the Lord aware of our own thirsts — thirsts that so often drive us to lesser things: busyness, approval, distractions, or comforts that never truly satisfy. Yet Christ meets us here, at our wells of weariness, and offers a water that does not run dry.

Notice how Jesus first encounters the woman in her need. He does not wait for her to be perfect. He meets her in her ordinary life, at a well in the heat of the day. In the same way, Jesus meets us in the very places of our struggle, our doubts, and our thirst. He does not condemn. He offers water — life-giving water — freely and lovingly. Do you welcome, accept, Christ’s life-giving water?



Our Lenten call, then, is to drink deeply of Christ’s presence. To commit time in prayer, to seek reconciliation in the Sacrament of Penance, to practice mercy, and to draw closer to Him who alone can satisfy the longings of our heart. As we continue our Lenten journey, let us allow Christ to be the source of our refreshment and strength.

May our hearts be open to receive the living water Jesus offers, that we may never thirst again.

**ORDER OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS**  
**The Scrutinies**

It is my privilege along with our OCIA catechist leads, Annette Fernandez, Yasue Barbalho, and Cibele Remigio, to be able to shepherd seven individuals in their initiation into the Catholic faith. They are Julia da Costa, Shannon Murphy, Amanda Menezes Nunes, Bianca Menezes Nunes, Emanuele de Paiva, Ariana Vitoria Xible Silva, and Pedro Neves. As catechumens they were enrolled in the Book of the Elect at the Rite of Election celebrated by Archbishop Richard Henning at the Cathedral of the Holy Cross in Boston on February 22, 2026. They are now known as “the elect”. Through the remainder of Lent, the elect are now in a period of purification and enlightenment before being baptized, confirmed, and receiving their First Holy Communion at the Easter Vigil. This period is marked with special liturgies called Scrutinies which occur on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent. The following Masses have been designated for those liturgies:

### Terceiro Domingo da Quaresma — Jesus, a Água Viva

Ao nos reunirmos neste Terceiro Domingo da Quaresma, a Igreja nos convida a mergulhar mais profundamente no coração da nossa jornada com Cristo — uma jornada de conversão, reflexão e vida nova. As leituras de hoje impressionam pela sua simplicidade e profundidade, revelando-nos a verdade profunda de quem Jesus é: a fonte de água viva.

Na primeira leitura do livro de Êxodo, ouvimos os israelitas no deserto, cansados e sedentos, reclamando a Moisés: “Por que nos fizeste sair do Egito? Foi só para nos deixar morrer de sede aqui?”. Em meio à sua angústia, Deus instrui Moisés a golpear a rocha em Horebe, e “água jorrou”. Aqui vemos um prenúncio — um símbolo — da misericórdia de Deus fluindo da rocha no deserto. Contudo, por mais poderoso que seja esse momento, ele é apenas um sinal que aponta para uma realidade maior que será revelada em Cristo.

No Evangelho de hoje, Jesus está junto ao poço de Jacó, em Samaria, cansado da viagem, e faz um pedido simples, mas surpreendente: “Dá-me de beber”. Este momento inicia uma conversa que transforma não só a mulher samaritana, mas todos os que entram na presença vivificante de Jesus. Quando Jesus fala de água viva, não se refere à água física que sacia a sede momentaneamente. Ele fala das águas da vida eterna — a graça de Deus derramada em todo coração disposto a recebê-la.

**Uma mensagem do nosso clero**  
*Deacon Jared*

Jesus lhe diz: “Quem beber desta água tornará a ter sede; mas quem beber da água que eu lhe der nunca mais terá sede”. Nessas palavras, Cristo revela que os anseios mais profundos do coração humano — por amor, paz, propósito, pertencimento e alegria — só serão satisfeitos nEle. A água viva que Jesus oferece nada mais é do que o dom do Espírito Santo, a presença de Deus em nós, renovando-nos de dentro para fora.

Que bela imagem para nós nesta época da Quaresma! Apresentamo-nos diante do Senhor conscientes de nossas próprias sedes — sedes que tantas vezes nos levam a coisas menores: a correria do dia a dia, a busca por aprovação, as distrações ou os confortos que nunca nos satisfazem de verdade. Contudo, Cristo nos encontra aqui, em nossos poços de cansaço, e nos oferece uma água que nunca seca.

Observe como Jesus encontra a mulher pela primeira vez em sua necessidade. Ele não espera que ela seja perfeita. Ele a encontra em sua vida comum, junto a um poço no calor do dia. Da mesma forma, Jesus nos encontra justamente nos lugares de nossa luta, nossas dúvidas e nossa sede. Ele não nos condena. Ele oferece água — água que dá vida — livre e amorosamente. Você acolhe, aceita, a água que dá vida de Cristo?



Nosso chamado quaresmal, portanto, é beber profundamente da presença de Cristo. Dedicar tempo à oração, buscar a reconciliação no Sacramento da Penitência, praticar a misericórdia e aproximar-nos d'Aquele que, somente Ele, pode satisfazer os anseios do nosso coração. Ao prosseguirmos nossa jornada quaresmal, permitamos que Cristo seja a fonte de nosso revigoramento e força.

Que nossos corações estejam abertos para receber a água viva que Jesus oferece, para que nunca mais tenhamos sede.

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
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
