



Seventh Sunday of Easter

This Sunday's readings place us in an "in-between" moment. Jesus has ascended to the Father, but Pentecost has not yet arrived. The disciples are waiting, uncertain of what comes next, yet they do not scatter or give up. Instead, the Acts of the Apostles tells us they gathered together constantly in prayer with Mary.

Many of us know what these "in-between" moments feel like. We experience them while waiting for medical results, navigating uncertainty in work or relationships, grieving loss, considering major decisions, or wondering what God is calling us to do next. We often want immediate answers, clear direction, and certainty about the future. Yet Scripture reminds us that some of the most important spiritual growth happens in the waiting.

The disciples did not fully understand what was coming, but they stayed together, remained faithful, and prayed. That is a powerful lesson for us today.

A Message from Our Clergy

Too often, when life becomes uncertain, we isolate ourselves. We stop praying, drift from Mass, or convince ourselves we need to solve everything alone. But the readings remind us that Christians are not meant to walk through uncertainty by themselves. Faith is lived in communion with God and with one another.

Jesus' prayer in the Gospel is especially moving. Before His Passion, He prays not only for Himself, but for His disciples. He prays for their unity, protection, and perseverance. In a divided and exhausted world, that prayer still matters today.

So how can we live these readings practically in our own lives this week?

First, pray together. Families do not need perfect words or long prayers. Even one minute together before dinner, before school, or before bed matters. Spouses can pray for each other. Parents can bless their children. Friends can pray together over the phone. Prayer creates unity because it reminds us we belong to God and to one another.

Second, practice patience with people who are struggling. Everyone carries burdens we cannot fully see. The coworker who seems distant, the family member who is short-tempered, or the neighbor who seems withdrawn may simply be carrying something heavy. The Holy Spirit often works through small acts of patience, listening, and compassion.

Third, resist the temptation to let disagreement become division. Our world constantly encourages outrage and tribalism. Families stop speaking. Friendships fracture. Parish communities become divided over politics, preferences, or personalities. Christians are called to be different. Unity does not mean we always agree, but it does mean we choose love over contempt and reconciliation over resentment.

Fourth, remember that holiness is built through perseverance, not perfection. Saint Peter reminds us not to be ashamed of suffering for Christ. Faithfulness is not about never struggling or never failing. It is about continuing to return to God even when life is difficult. Some of the holiest people are not the ones who appear strongest outwardly, but the ones who quietly continue showing up — continuing to pray, continuing to serve, continuing to trust God one day at a time.

Finally, spend some time this week inviting the Holy Spirit into your life. Before making a decision, entering a meeting, responding to conflict, or beginning your day, simply pray: "Come, Holy Spirit." It is a simple prayer, but one that can transform hearts, relationships, and perspectives.

The disciples waited together, in the "in between", in prayer before Pentecost. They did not yet know how God would move, but they trusted that He would. We are called to do the same. In uncertain times, God does not abandon His people. He prepares them, strengthens them, and reminds them they are never alone.

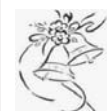

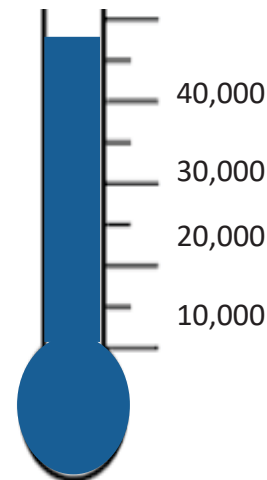

Sétimo Domingo da Páscoa

As leituras deste domingo nos situam em um momento de “entre-tempo”. Jesus ascendeu ao Pai, mas o Pentecostes ainda não chegou. Os discípulos aguardam, incertos quanto ao que virá a seguir; contudo, não se dispersam nem desistem. Pelo contrário, os Atos dos Apóstolos nos relatam que eles se reuniam constantemente em oração com Maria.

Muitos de nós sabemos qual é a sensação desses momentos de “entremeio”. Nós os vivenciamos enquanto aguardamos resultados médicos, lidamos com a incerteza no trabalho ou nos relacionamentos, vivenciamos o luto por uma perda, ponderamos grandes decisões ou nos perguntamos o que Deus nos chama a fazer em seguida. Frequentemente, desejamos respostas imediatas, uma direção clara e certeza quanto ao futuro. Contudo, as Escrituras nos lembram que parte do crescimento espiritual mais importante acontece justamente na espera.

Uma Mensagem do Nosso Clero

Deacon Jared

Os discípulos não compreenderam plenamente o que estava por vir, mas permaneceram juntos, mantiveram-se fiéis e oraram. Essa é uma lição poderosa para nós hoje.

Com demasiada frequência, quando a vida se torna incerta, nós nos isolamos. Paramos de rezar, nos afastamos da Missa ou nos convencemos de que precisamos resolver tudo sozinhos. Mas as leituras nos recordam que os cristãos não foram feitos para atravessar a incerteza sozinhos. A fé é vivida em comunhão com Deus e uns com os outros.

A oração de Jesus no Evangelho é especialmente comovente. Antes de Sua Paixão, Ele ora não apenas por Si mesmo, mas por Seus discípulos. Ele ora pela unidade, proteção e perseverança deles. Em um mundo dividido e exausto, essa oração ainda importa hoje.

Então, como podemos viver essas leituras de forma prática em nossas próprias vidas nesta semana?

Primeiro, orem juntos. As famílias não precisam de palavras perfeitas nem de orações longas. Mesmo um minuto juntos antes do jantar, antes da escola ou antes de dormir faz diferença. Os cônjuges podem orar uns pelos outros. Os pais podem abençoar seus filhos. Os amigos podem orar juntos por telefone. A oração gera união, pois nos lembra de que pertencemos a Deus e uns aos outros.

Em segundo lugar, exercite a paciência com as pessoas que estão passando por dificuldades. Todos carregam fardos que não conseguimos ver plenamente. O colega de trabalho que parece distante, o familiar de temperamento difícil ou o vizinho que parece retraído podem estar, simplesmente, carregando algo pesado. O Espírito Santo frequentemente age por meio de pequenos atos de paciência, escuta e compaixão.

Em terceiro lugar, resista à tentação de permitir que o desacordo se transforme em divisão. Nosso mundo incentiva constantemente a indignação e o tribalismo. Famílias deixam de se falar. Amizades se rompem. Comunidades paroquiais se dividem por questões de política, preferências ou personalidades. Os cristãos são chamados a ser diferentes. A unidade não significa que concordemos sempre, mas significa escolher o amor em vez do desprezo, e a reconciliação em vez do ressentimento.

Em quarto lugar, lembre-se de que a santidade é construída por meio da perseverança, não da perfeição. São Pedro nos recorda que não devemos nos envergonhar de sofrer por Cristo. A fidelidade não consiste em nunca enfrentar lutas ou nunca falhar; consiste em continuar retornando a Deus, mesmo quando a vida se mostra difícil. Algumas das pessoas mais santas não são aquelas que aparentam ser as mais fortes exteriormente, mas sim aquelas que, silenciosamente, continuam presentes — continuando a rezar, continuando a servir, continuando a confiar em Deus, um dia de cada vez.

Por fim, dedique algum tempo nesta semana para convidar o Espírito Santo para a sua vida. Antes de tomar uma decisão, entrar em uma reunião, lidar com um conflito ou começar o seu dia, simplesmente ore: “Vem, Espírito Santo”. É uma oração simples, mas capaz de transformar corações, relacionamentos e perspectivas.

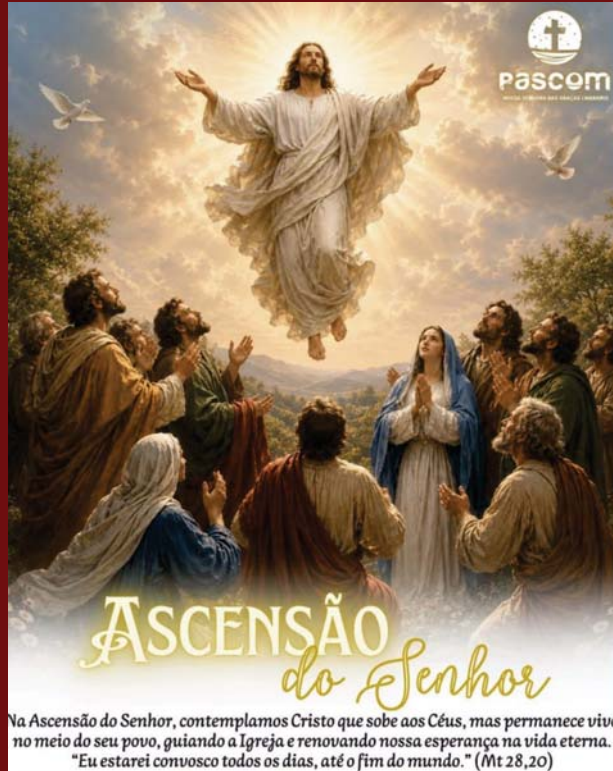
Os discípulos esperaram juntos, no “entre-tempo”, em oração, antes do Pentecostes. Eles ainda não sabiam como Deus agiria, mas confiavam que Ele o faria. Somos chamados a fazer o mesmo. Em tempos incertos, Deus não abandona o Seu povo. Ele o prepara, o fortalece e o lembra de que nunca está sozinho.


