Pentecost May 24, 2026

Pentecost is often called the birthday of the Church, but it is also a reminder that the Church was never meant to function on human strength alone. Before Pentecost, the disciples were afraid, uncertain, and hiding behind locked doors. After receiving the Holy Spirit, they became bold witnesses who carried the Gospel into the world. The difference was not their own courage or intelligence. The difference was the Holy Spirit.

In the Gospel, Jesus breathes on the disciples and says, "Receive the Holy Spirit." In the first reading from Acts, the Spirit comes like a strong driving wind and tongues of fire. These are powerful images because the Holy Spirit is not passive. The Spirit moves, strengthens, transforms, and sends people outward with purpose.

Sometimes Catholics can unintentionally think of the Holy Spirit as vague or secondary compared to the Father and the Son. Yet the Holy Spirit is fully God and deeply active in our daily lives. The Spirit gives wisdom when we do not know what to do, courage when we are afraid, peace when life feels chaotic, and strength when we feel exhausted. The Holy Spirit is not simply an idea we acknowledge at Confirmation (which was last weekend for our youth); the Spirit is God dwelling within us.

Many of us live with locked doors in our hearts just like the disciples did. We lock doors because of fear, anxiety, resentment, grief, disappointment, or uncertainty about the future. We may look calm externally while internally carrying stress about finances, family, health, work, or relationships. Pentecost reminds us that God does not abandon us behind those locked doors. The Holy Spirit enters precisely into those places where we feel weak or stuck.

A Message from Our Clergy

The second reading reminds us that there are different gifts but the same Spirit. Not everyone is called to serve in the same way, but every person has been given gifts that can build up the Church and the world. Some people lead publicly. Others quietly care for family members, volunteer, encourage others, teach children, listen patiently, or bring peace into tense situations. The Holy Spirit works through all these acts.

So how can we become more aware of the Holy Spirit in practical ways this week?

Begin each morning with a simple prayer: "Come, Holy Spirit." Before checking your phone or rushing into the day, invite God into your thoughts, conversations, and decisions. It takes only a few seconds, but it changes our posture from self-reliance to openness to God.

Pay attention to where the Spirit may be nudging you. Perhaps there is someone you need to forgive, encourage, call, or help. The Holy Spirit often speaks quietly through our conscience, compassion, and moments of conviction.

Use your gifts intentionally. Too many people underestimate the good they can do. A kind word, a meal for someone struggling, mentoring a student, visiting someone lonely, or volunteering in the parish are all ways the Spirit works through ordinary people.

Pray for unity and peace. Pentecost brought together people from many nations and languages who suddenly understood one another. Our world desperately needs that spirit of unity today. Families, workplaces, communities, and even the Church can become divided by anger and suspicion. The Holy Spirit helps us listen, understand, and love even when we disagree.

Remember that the Holy Spirit is not given only for our comfort. The Spirit is given to send us outward, to challenge us. Jesus tells the disciples, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." Pentecost is not just about what God does within us; it is about what God wants to do through us.

The same Holy Spirit who empowered the apostles is alive in the Church today. The question of Pentecost is not whether the Spirit is present. The question is whether we are willing to let the Spirit move in our lives.

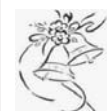

Important Reminder—Proper Receiving of Holy Communion

Catholic parishioners who are properly spiritually disposed, without mortal sin, are welcome to receive Communion at Mass with great reverence.

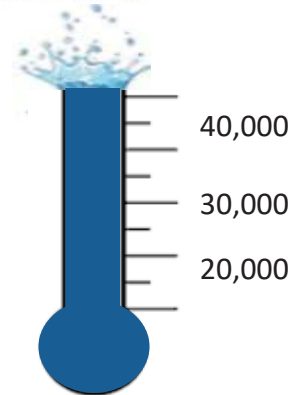
One option to do this is the encouraged use of the kneelers to receive Communion on the tongue. If you elect to receive Communion in the hand, please place one hand under the other and present an open palm of the hand to receive the Eucharist. Do not grab or take the Eucharist from the minister. When the minister says “The Body of Christ”, the proper response is “Amen”. The Eucharist must be fully consumed immediately in front of the minister. You must not remove it from your mouth or ‘carry’ the host back to your pew. Our ministers are trained to monitor for this.

Catholics who are not properly disposed, and non-Catholic friends and visitors are encouraged to come forward with arms crossed over the chest, to receive a blessing from either the priest or the deacon.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping to make receiving Communion a reverent act of spiritual worship.

Brazilian & Portuguese Community Information

Pentecostes, 24 de maio de 2026

O Pentecostes é frequentemente chamado de o aniversário da Igreja, mas é também um lembrete de que a Igreja nunca foi destinada a funcionar apenas com a força humana. Antes do Pentecostes, os discípulos estavam amedrontados, incertos e escondidos atrás de portas trancadas. Após receberem o Espírito Santo, tornaram-se testemunhas ousadas que levaram o Evangelho ao mundo. A diferença não foi a sua própria coragem ou inteligência. A diferença foi o Espírito Santo.

No Evangelho, Jesus sopra sobre os discípulos e diz: “Recebi o Espírito Santo”. Na primeira leitura, dos Atos dos Apóstolos, o Espírito vem como um vento forte e impetuoso e como línguas de fogo. Essas são imagens poderosas, pois o Espírito Santo não é passivo. O Espírito move, fortalece, transforma e envia as pessoas para fora, com um propósito.

Às vezes, os católicos podem, involuntariamente, conceber o Espírito Santo como algo vago ou secundário em comparação ao Pai e ao Filho. No entanto, o Espírito Santo é plenamente Deus e atua profundamente em nosso cotidiano. O Espírito nos concede sabedoria quando não sabemos o que fazer, coragem quando sentimos medo, paz quando a vida parece caótica e força quando nos sentimos exaustos. O Espírito Santo não é simplesmente uma ideia que reconhecemos na Confirmação (que, para a nossa juventude, ocorreu no último fim de semana); o Espírito é Deus habitando em nós.

Muitos de nós vivemos com portas trancadas em nossos corações, exatamente como fizeram os discípulos. Trancamos as portas por medo, ansiedade, ressentimento, luto, decepção ou incerteza quanto ao futuro. Podemos parecer calmos por fora, enquanto, internamente, carregamos o peso do estresse relacionado às finanças, à família, à saúde, ao trabalho ou aos relacionamentos. O Pentecostes nos lembra que Deus não nos abandona por trás dessas portas trancadas. O Espírito Santo entra precisamente naqueles lugares onde nos sentimos fracos ou estagnados.

A segunda leitura nos lembra que existem dons diferentes, mas o mesmo Espírito. Nem todos são chamados a servir da mesma maneira, mas a cada pessoa foram concedidos dons que podem edificar a Igreja e o mundo. Algumas pessoas lideram publicamente. Outras cuidam discretamente de familiares, fazem trabalho voluntário, encorajam os outros, ensinam as crianças, ouvem com paciência ou levam a paz a situações tensas. O Espírito Santo age por meio de todos esses atos.

Então, como podemos nos tornar mais conscientes do Espírito Santo de maneiras práticas nesta semana?

Comece cada manhã com uma oração simples: “Vem, Espírito Santo”. Antes de verificar o celular ou mergulhar na correria do dia, convide Deus para os seus pensamentos, conversas e decisões. Leva apenas alguns segundos, mas muda a nossa postura, passando da autossuficiência para a abertura a Deus.

Preste atenção para onde o Espírito pode estar o impulsionando. Talvez haja alguém que você precise perdoar, encorajar, ligar ou ajudar. O Espírito Santo frequentemente fala de modo suave, por meio de nossa consciência, compaixão e momentos de convicção.

Use seus dons intencionalmente. Muitas pessoas subestimam o bem que podem fazer. Uma palavra gentil, uma refeição para alguém em dificuldade, orientar um estudante, visitar alguém solitário ou ser voluntário na paróquia — todas essas são formas pelas quais o Espírito age por meio de pessoas comuns.

Ore pela unidade e pela paz. O Pentecostes reuniu pessoas de muitas nações e línguas que, de repente, passaram a se compreender. O nosso mundo necessita desesperadamente desse espírito de unidade hoje. Famílias, locais de trabalho, comunidades e até mesmo a Igreja podem ser divididos pela raiva e pela suspeita. O Espírito Santo nos ajuda a ouvir, compreender e amar, mesmo quando discordamos.

Lembre-se de que o Espírito Santo não nos é dado apenas para o nosso conforto. O Espírito nos é dado para nos enviar para fora, para nos desafiar. Jesus diz aos discípulos: “Assim como o Pai me enviou, também eu envio vocês.” O Pentecostes não diz respeito apenas ao que Deus faz dentro de nós; diz respeito ao que Deus quer fazer por meio de nós.

O mesmo Espírito Santo que capacitou os apóstolos está vivo na Igreja hoje. A questão do Pentecostes não é se o Espírito está presente. A questão é se estamos dispostos a deixar o Espírito agir em nossas vidas.


