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Enduring Faith

In this Sunday's readings, we are reminded that faith is not meant to be easy—it is meant to be enduring. Each passage challenges us to look beyond appearances and comfort, and to see how steadfast faith anchors us amid uncertainty, chaos, and change.

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus warns His followers that the great temple—an awe-inspiring symbol of God's presence—will one day fall. He speaks of wars, earthquakes, and persecution, but He doesn't call His disciples to fear. Instead, He calls them to *perseverance*: "By your perseverance you will secure your lives." Jesus' message is clear: faith is not proven when everything is stable, but when everything is shaken.

Paul reminds the community of the importance of *steadfast work and discipline*. He encourages believers not to grow weary, not to be idle, but to contribute to the good of the community. Faith and labor are bound together—the outward work of our hands reflects the inward work of our hearts. In our modern world, where distractions are constant and convenience is prized, Paul's message calls us back to purpose: to live faithfully through our daily actions, even in the small things.

Finally, we hear of the coming day of the Lord—a day both of justice and hope. Evil and arrogance will be burned away, but for those who revere God's name, "*the sun of justice will rise with its healing rays*." It is a promise of restoration, not destruction—a reminder that God's justice brings wholeness and light to those who remain faithful.

These readings, taken together, form a powerful invitation: to hold fast to our faith even when the world feels unstable; to live our faith with purpose and integrity; and to trust that, through perseverance, God's justice and healing will prevail.

As we approach the end of the liturgical year and prepare our hearts for Advent, may we find strength in God's enduring promise—that even amid trial and change, His light will never fail.

ATUALIZAÇÃO DA NOVA CALDEIRA

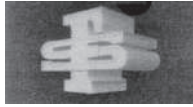
