



Greetings, brothers and sisters. Our readings this weekend focus on healing, gratitude and salvation for all people. There are some interesting aspects to our scriptures this weekend, so I invite you to explore these thoughts along with me as we dig in!

In our first reading from 2 Kings, we read the story of Naaman, a very wealthy commander in the Syrian army, but he's afflicted with leprosy. Just prior to our passages today, he is referenced as bringing lavish gifts to Israel – the material wealth of millions of dollars in today's money, in hopes of being healed. Following Elisha's instructions, he plunges into the Jordan seven times, and he is cleansed of his leprosy. It's natural that he'd return with all his family and friends to Elisha to give him thanks and offer a 'gift'. Elisha steadfastly refuses this – twice! By rejecting the gift, Elisha demonstrates that God's mercy and healing are **free gifts of divine grace**, not things that can be earned

or purchased. If Elisha had accepted payment, Naaman and others might have thought that prophets performed miracles for money. Refusing the gift ensured that the glory went to **the Lord alone**, not to a man. Because his gift to Elisha would not be accepted, Naaman instead humbly asks for two mule-

loads of earth. Why? In the ancient Near East, people believed that gods were tied to specific lands. Each nation had its own deity who was worshiped on that soil. By asking for **earth from Israel**, Naaman was symbolically bringing a piece of the Lord's land back home, so he could worship the true God of Israel **on holy ground**, even in a foreign country. How beautiful is that! In a mildly related way, I have a personal 'rugged' Rosary that has accompanied me to several sacred places. When I pray with it, I'm reminded of those places it has touched as it moves me to prayer.



Naaman is a Syrian and not from the Jewish community. In his healing, we see once more that God's mercy extends beyond Israel to all nations. We hear this echoed in the refrain from the psalm – *The Lord has revealed to the nations his saving power*. This theme is presented again in a favorite scripture passage from Luke, the healing of the ten lepers. Only one – the Samaritan and an outsider, returns to give thanks. Luke's Gospel constantly emphasizes the universal reach of God's salvation — that it extends beyond the boundaries of ethnic Israel to include Gentiles, sinners, and outcasts.

Lord, when we feel like the outsider, the sinner or the outcast – especially when we believe we're far from you, help us to know that your love and mercy for us are unconditional and ever present. Heal us of our hurts, fears and worries, and free us to approach the font of your mercy with gratitude for all that you have bestowed upon us. Enable us to surrender to your incomparable love, grow in faith, and trust in your goodness and plans for us.
