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Greetings, brothers and sisters. If you're like me, there are probably moments in your life where you've taken particular pride in your accomplishments. If you're a student, college grad, young or older adult, there are likely milestones you've experienced with great joy. At the same time, I can recall plenty of 'near misses', times when I'd hit big bumps in the road and couldn't figure out what would come next. Looking back, I can see how those difficult times became moments for developing my relationship with Jesus. The more it has developed, the more He has continued opening all the doors I've needed, at just the right time. I've learned that I can't do it without Him. There are still 'near misses', but God has kept me safe and moving forward, in my life – and in my relationship with Him.

Our readings this weekend help us contrast humility and self-righteousness. The Ordo, a small booklet used by clergy as a prayer and reading guide for the liturgical year, says "Humility is the recognition that no matter what our accomplishments, we still stand in need of the Lord, that God hears the cry of the poor and the oppressed, especially those who acknowledge their dependency upon Him."

A Message from Our Clergy

Our first reading is from the Book of Sirach. It was written around 185 B.C. by Jesus ben Sira, a Jewish sage in Jerusalem. He lived at a time when the poor and faithful were often neglected or oppressed, and religious practice was becoming more about external appearances than genuine faith. Ben Sira wrote his book to teach wisdom rooted in the fear of the Lord, focusing on right living, justice, and mercy according to the Law. He wanted to emphasize that "The Lord is a God of justice, who knows no favorites." We are reminded of this in our psalm, "The Lord hears the cry of the poor." The poor are not just those with few material goods. They are also those who detach themselves from worldly allures and depend wholly on God. In our second reading, St. Paul, nearing the time of his death, remarks that he has competed well, finished the race, and kept the faith. He also adds an important footnote: "The Lord stood by me and gave me strength." He knows that he didn't do it alone!



In our gospel reading from Luke, we have the Pharisee and the penitent tax collector in the temple area praying. The Pharisee is thanking God in his prayers, but he's really just praising himself. His statements all begin with 'I' as he lauds his accomplishments. This Pharisee hasn't learned that all he has came from God. The tax collector, on the other hand, reflects true humility as he acknowledges his own sinfulness. He knows he needs God's mercy. As Jesus reminds us, "Whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

Lord Jesus, help us to always remember that all that we have is due to your grace and generosity. Help us to learn true humility and use every step of our journeys in faith to increase our dependance upon you.

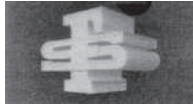

“On the Cultivation of Worth: A Word from St. Augustine to the contemporary heart”

In this increasingly disaffiliated world our kids are leaving God behind. Instead of seeing God as a loving creator, many choose to strike out on the effort of ‘self-creation.’ The trouble is that when we seek to create ourselves we also find ourselves in a situation where we must define our own worth. We live in a world in which our young people, far too often, base their value on passing things (grades, sports, friends, etc.) rather than the unchanging God. When those things pass away our kids are not merely faced with a bad day but their very reason for why they matter is thoroughly shaken. Teens are facing a crisis of worth and we have to respond. This talk will consider the crisis at hand, seeking an answer in the thought of St. Augustine, and discuss what we as parents, educators, coaches, and mentors can do to help our young people ground their worth in the loving God.

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
