



This weekend, we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. At first glance, it may seem strange to “exalt” something as brutal and humiliating as the cross. Yet, in Christ, the cross is transformed—from an instrument of torture into the very means of our salvation. The readings this Sunday lead us into the mystery of how God’s love is revealed most fully in the cross of Christ.

Our first reading from the Book of Numbers recalls the Israelites in the desert, complaining and despairing in their journey. As punishment, they encounter serpents, and many die. Yet God offers healing through a paradox: those bitten must look upon a bronze serpent lifted high on a pole to be saved. What once symbolized death becomes, by God’s command, the means of life. This foreshadows the cross—where sin and death are nailed, and life and salvation flow forth.

St. Paul in Philippians gives us the great hymn of *kenosis* (one of my favorite words and concepts from Diaconal Formation), or “self-emptying.” Though Jesus was in the form of God, he did not cling to equality with God. Instead, he emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, humbling himself even to the point of death on a cross. This is divine love made visible—not grasping at power, but surrendering in obedience and love. Because of this, God exalts him, and “at the name of Jesus every knee should bend.” The cross is exalted because it reveals the depth of God’s humility and the triumph of his love.

A Message from Our Clergy

In the Gospel, Jesus himself draws the connection between the bronze serpent and his own cross: “Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up.” To be “lifted up” means both to be crucified and to be glorified. On the cross, Christ is lifted high so that all who look to him in faith may have eternal life. And John makes clear the motive: “For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son... not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him.” The cross is love lifted high.

When we sing “Lift High the Cross,” we proclaim this paradoxical truth: what once was shame is now glory, what once was defeat is now victory, what once was death is now life. The cross is not simply a reminder of suffering; it is the sign of God’s relentless love for us and the banner of our salvation. To lift high the cross is to exalt the love that stoops so low, empties itself so fully, and rises so gloriously.

This feast invites us not only to venerate the cross but also to imitate Christ’s *kenosis*. In our homes, workplaces, and parish, we are called to humble ourselves, to serve, and to give of ourselves in love. When we embrace the small crosses of daily life with trust, we unite ourselves to the great mystery of the Cross of Christ. And in doing so, we share in his exaltation.

May we, then, lift high the cross in our lives, not as a burden, but as the radiant sign of God’s saving love.




