This Sunday's readings call us to examine the direction of our lives and the choices that flow from our hearts. St. Paul, in his letter to Timothy, offers the theme that unites the Word of God this week: *"But you, man of God, pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Compete well for the faith. Lay hold of eternal life."* These words are not abstract advice; they are a concrete summons to live with integrity and hope in the midst of a world that can easily distract us with comfort, wealth, and indifference.

The prophet Amos speaks forcefully against those "complacent in Zion" who rest on ivory couches, dine sumptuously, and remain deaf to the plight of the poor. His words remind us that when we close our eyes to the needs of others, our hearts grow numb. Wealth and comfort are not evil in themselves, but when they lead to self-satisfaction and blindness to suffering, they become stumbling blocks to righteousness. Amos warns that complacency leads to ruin because it turns us inward and away from God's justice.

In contrast, Paul's exhortation to Timothy is filled with energy and direction: *pursue, compete, lay hold.*

The Christian life is not passive; it requires effort, discipline, and courage. But notice how Paul frames

the competition: not in terms of domination or self-advancement, but in righteousness, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. These are not the typical virtues of a worldly contest. They are the marks of one who knows that eternal life is the true prize, already given in baptism and to be claimed fully in Christ.

A Message from Our Clergy

Jesus' parable of the rich man and Lazarus drives the point home with unforgettable imagery. The rich man, clothed in purple and feasting daily, never noticed the poor man lying at his gate. Lazarus longed for scraps, but no one offered him comfort. In the end, their fates were reversed: Lazarus was carried to the bosom of Abraham, while the rich man found himself in torment. The parable is not meant to frighten us but to awaken us to the urgency of compassion. To "compete well for the faith" is to open our eyes, to see Christ in those who suffer, and to act with love and mercy.

Together, these readings remind us that discipleship is not about securing comfort in this life but about preparing for eternal life by how we love here and now. Amos cautions us against complacency. Paul urges us to run the race with virtues that endure. Jesus warns us that ignoring our neighbor leads to spiritual death.

So, how do we respond? By living each day with eyes wide open to the needs around us. By cultivating habits of prayer, generosity, patience, and gentleness. By remembering that the faith we profess is meant to be lived visibly and concretely. To pursue righteousness and love is to live in such a way that our confession of faith is credible before God and neighbor alike.

Let us then compete well for the faith, with confidence that the crown of eternal life awaits those who run the race with Christlike love. St. Michael the Archangel, whose feast we celebrate on Monday, September 29, pray for us!

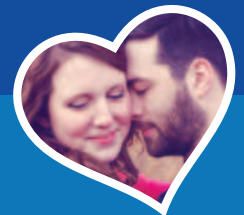
