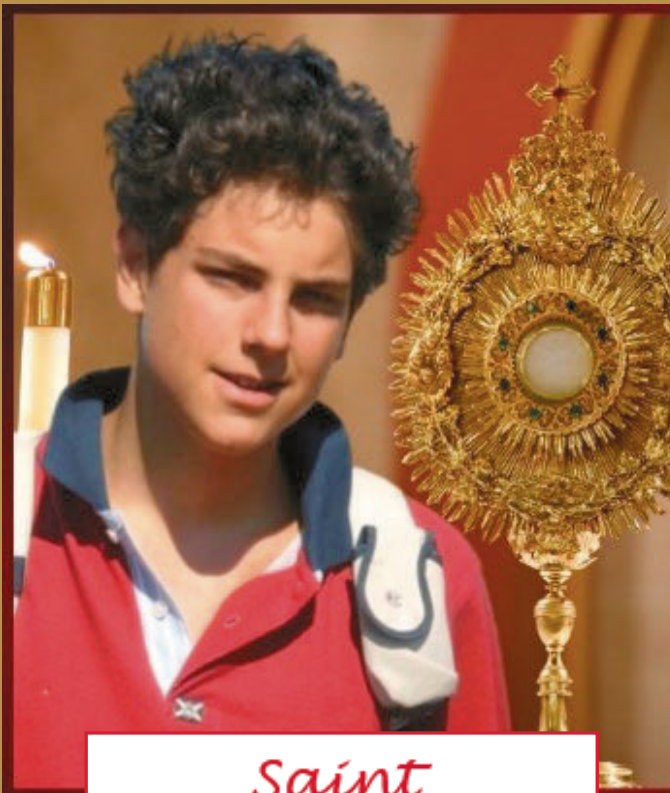

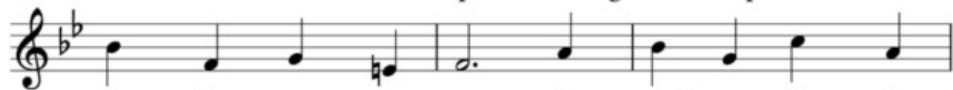

The Cost of Discipleship: Loyalty and Obedience to Christ

This Sunday's readings speak with a single voice about the seriousness of following Jesus Christ. They remind us that discipleship is not casual but costly. It demands loyalty, obedience, and a willingness to let Christ reorder every part of our lives.

The Book of Wisdom begins with a sobering question: *"Who can know God's counsel, or who can conceive what the Lord intends?"* Human reasoning, the passage reminds us, is timid and uncertain. Left to ourselves, we are weighed down by earthly concerns. But God's Spirit is given to us, and through that Spirit, we gain the courage and wisdom to walk in God's ways. Discipleship begins with humility: acknowledging that we cannot chart our own course to salvation (Anyone who knows me knows this is a hard one for me. I like to be in control of everything.). It is the Lord who makes straight the paths of those who surrender to Him.

In the second reading, Paul's short but powerful letter to Philemon provides a living example of this surrender. Paul appeals to Philemon not by command, but by love. He asks that Philemon receive Onesimus, his runaway slave, not as property but as a beloved brother in Christ. To accept this would mean upending cultural expectations and worldly advantage. For Philemon, obedience to Christ required letting go of power, embracing forgiveness, and welcoming the radical equality of the Gospel. True discipleship demands that same willingness in us: to see others not through the lens of status or convenience but as fellow heirs of Christ (Is that how we look at everyone?).

A Message from Our Clergy

The Gospel takes us to the heart of the matter. Jesus turns to the crowds and speaks words that are startling, even shocking: *"If anyone comes to me without hating father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple."* Jesus is not calling us to despise our families. Rather, He is teaching us that love of Him must come first, before even our most cherished relationships. Our loyalty to Christ must be absolute. He goes further: *"Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple."*

Carrying the cross is not an occasional burden or a symbol of piety; it is a daily act of obedience. It means placing Christ at the center of every decision, every priority, every relationship. It means, as Jesus illustrates with the builder and the king, counting the cost. Before setting out to follow Him, we must recognize that this path will demand everything: our possessions, our comforts, our pride, even our very lives.

The readings leave no room for half-measures. To be a disciple is not simply to admire Jesus, but to obey Him with fidelity and courage. The cost is great—but so is the reward. For in surrendering all to Christ, we gain all: the wisdom of God, the communion of the saints, and the eternal joy of the Kingdom.

May we, strengthened by the Spirit, respond with loyalty and obedience to our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

ABOUT THE COVER

Saint Carlo Acutis is being canonized a Saint on September 7, 2025! He died on October 12, 2006 at the age of 15, and was beatified on October 20, 2020. His feast day is October 12. St. Carlo has been popularly called "the patron saint of the Internet" because of his interest in computers and because he built a website that documented miracles related to the Eucharist. <https://www.miracolieucaristici.org/en/liste/list.html>

Saint Pier Giorgio Frassati is being canonized a Saint on September 7, 2025! He was exceedingly generous to the poor. He loved mountain climbing, and appreciated the arts. He died of Polio at the age of 24. His intercession has been attributed to two miracles so far. He is the official patron saint of World Youth Day and Italian Confraternities. His feast day is July 4 which also marks the date of his death in 1925, which was designated as his feast day following his beatification by Pope John Paul II in 1990.

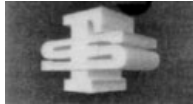

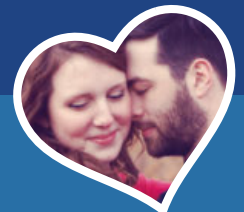
