CCB was established in Helsinki, in 1990 when NGOs from the countries of the Baltic Sea Region became united to cooperate in activities concerning the Baltic Sea environment.

Our main goal is to promote the protection and improvement of the environment and natural resources of the Baltic Sea Region for present and future generations.

We are a politically independent, non-profit association that unites 27 Member and Observer organizations, as well as partners and individual experts in all countries of the Baltic Sea Region.

CCB was created in 1990 to join people from all countries in the Baltic Sea catchment area in a common cause: to improve our shared environment, to learn from each other and to understand each other's culture and tradition.

3 Concrete co-operation projects in the field

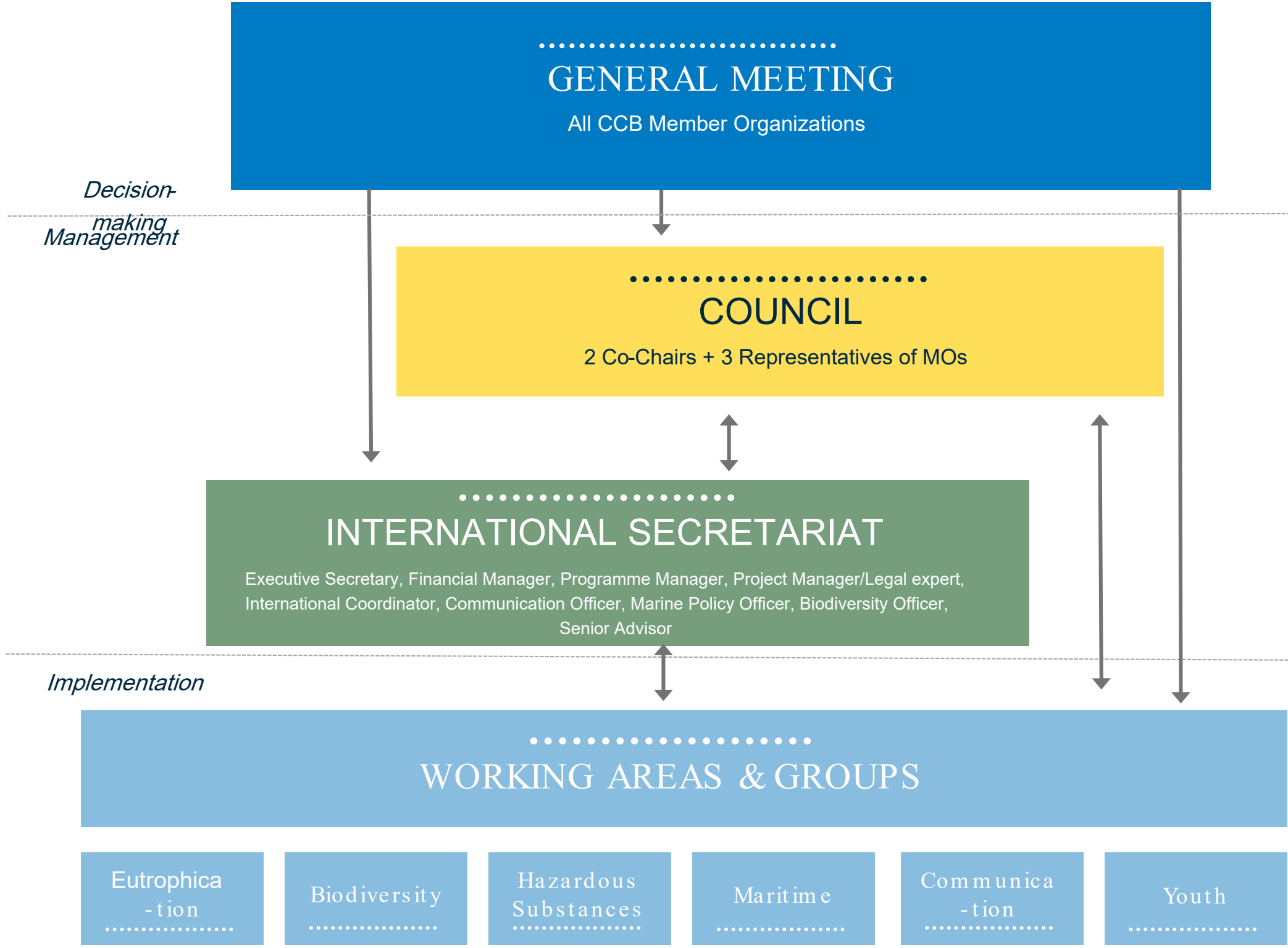
CCB and its Member Organizations have undertaken a number of field projects covering a wide range of issues.

4 Support to Member Organizations

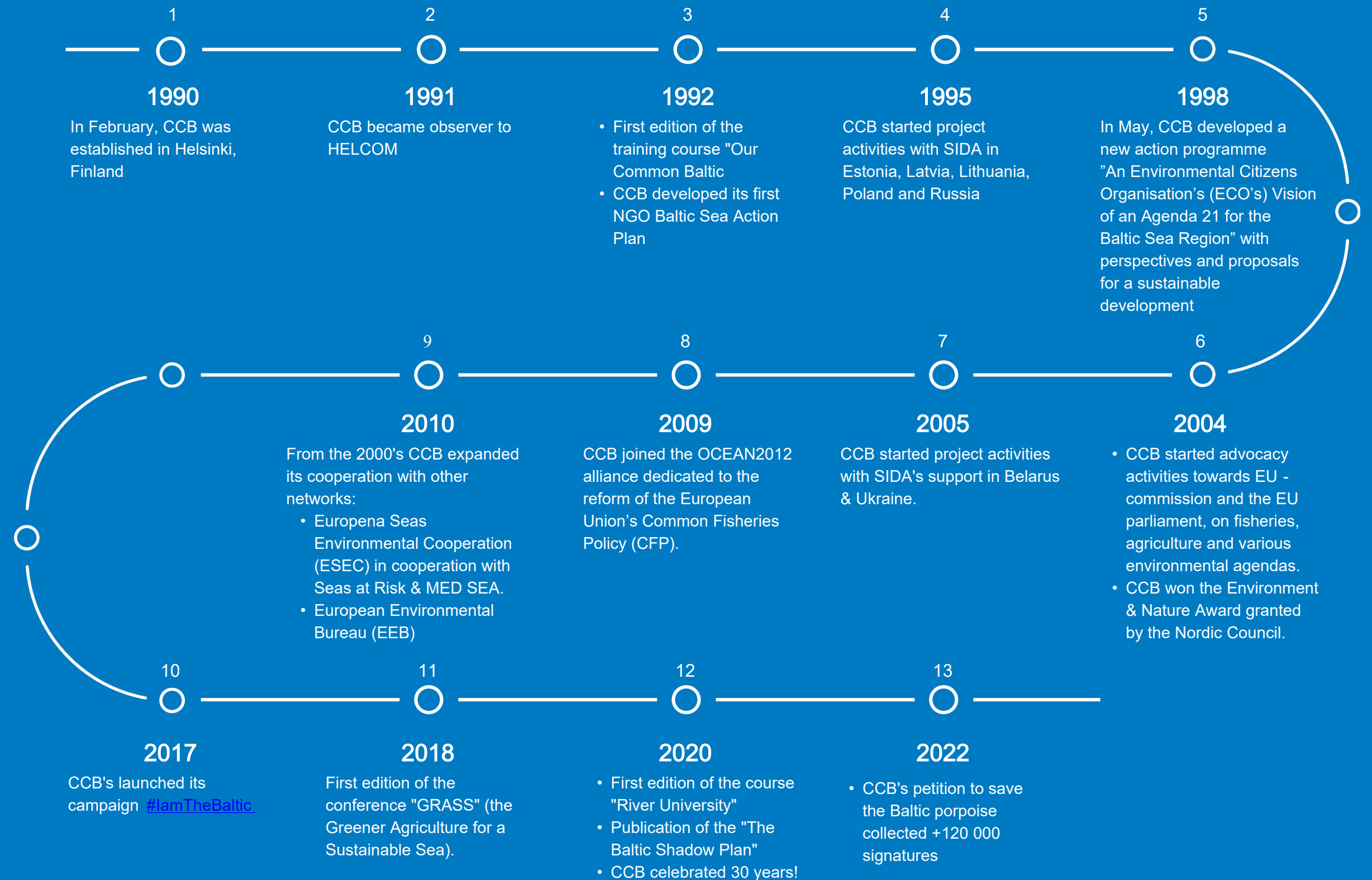
CCB gathers and distributes information about different activities (meetings, conferences, cooperation projects, options for funding).
