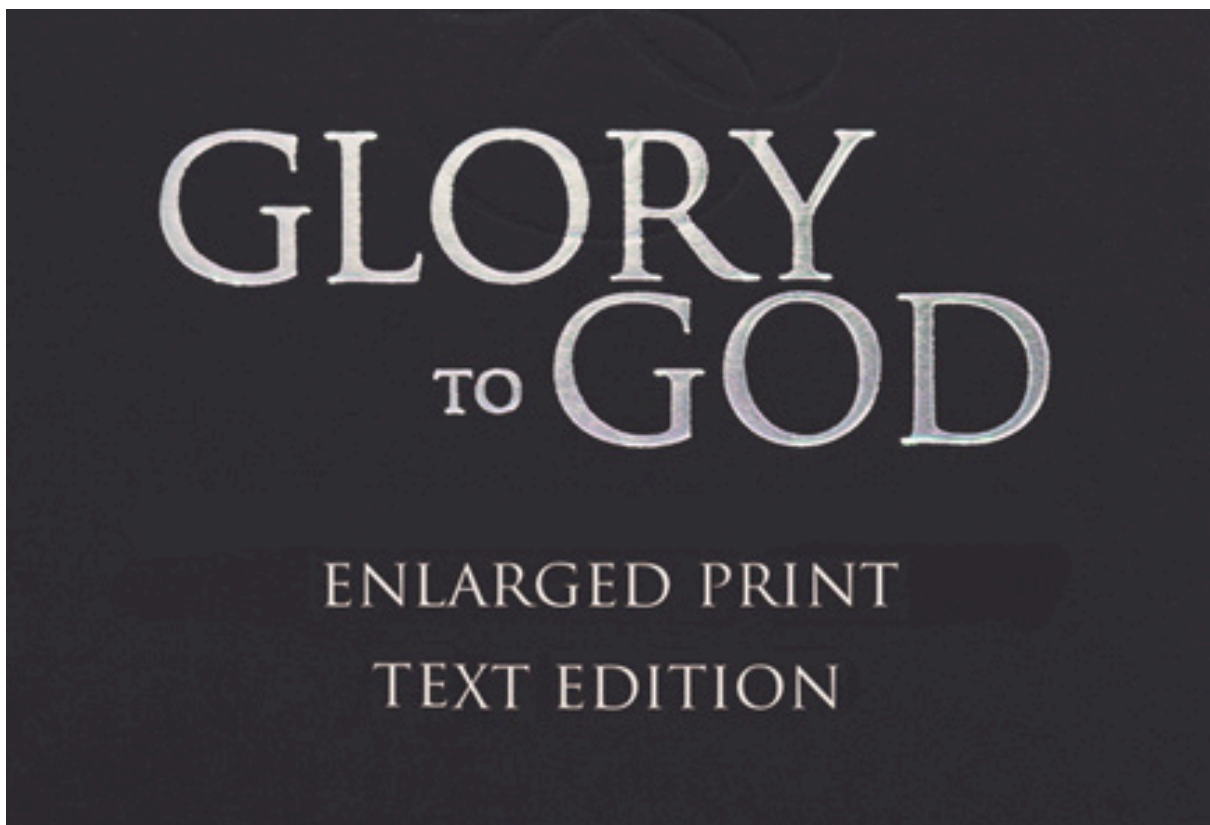

We Give Thee but Thine Own 708



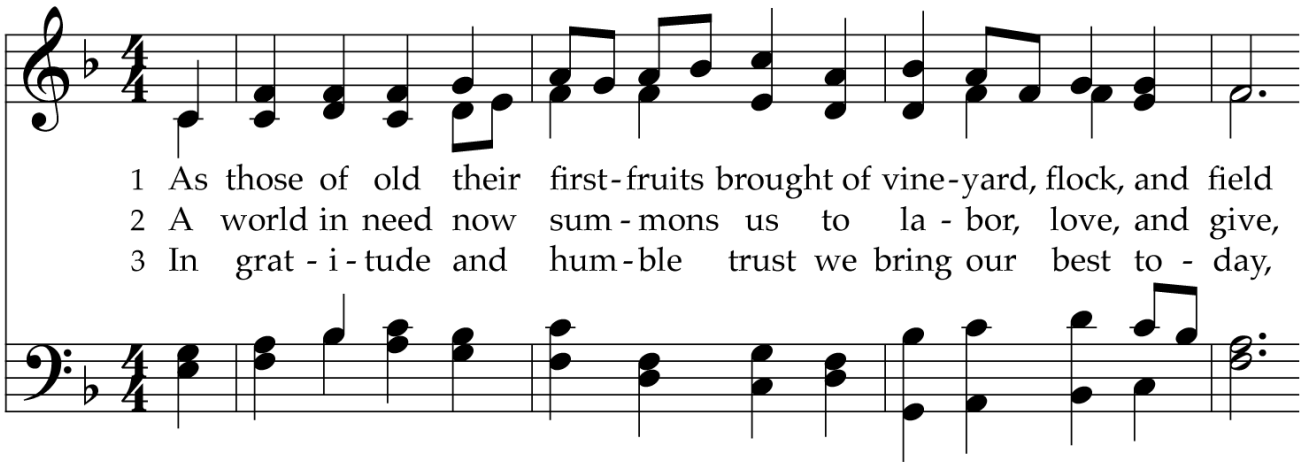
1 We give thee but thine own, what - e'er the gift may be;

4 And we be - lieve thy word, though dim our faith may be;



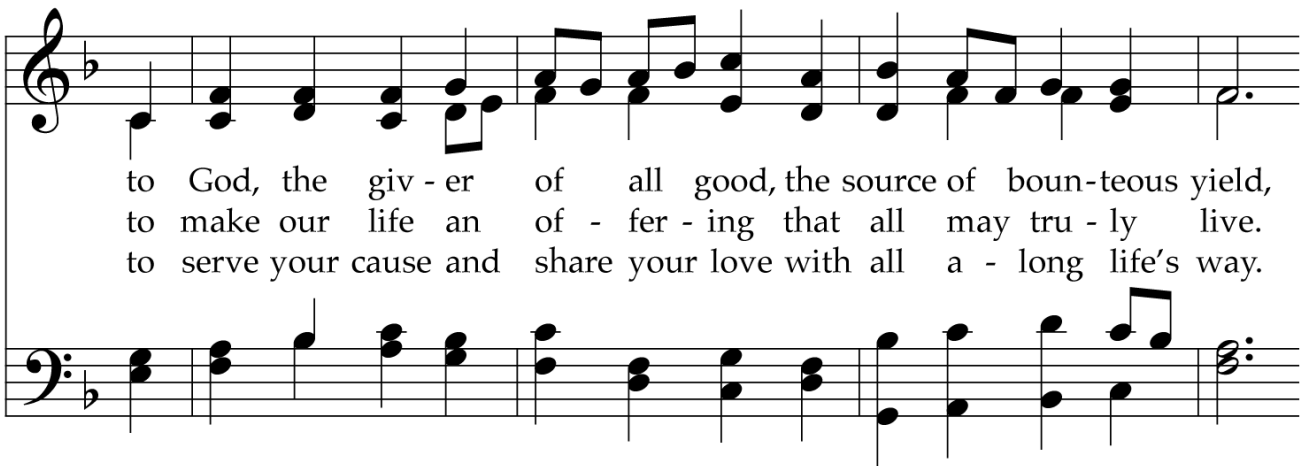
all that we have is thine a - lone, a trust, O Lord, from thee.

what - e'er we do for thine, O Lord, we do it un - to thee.



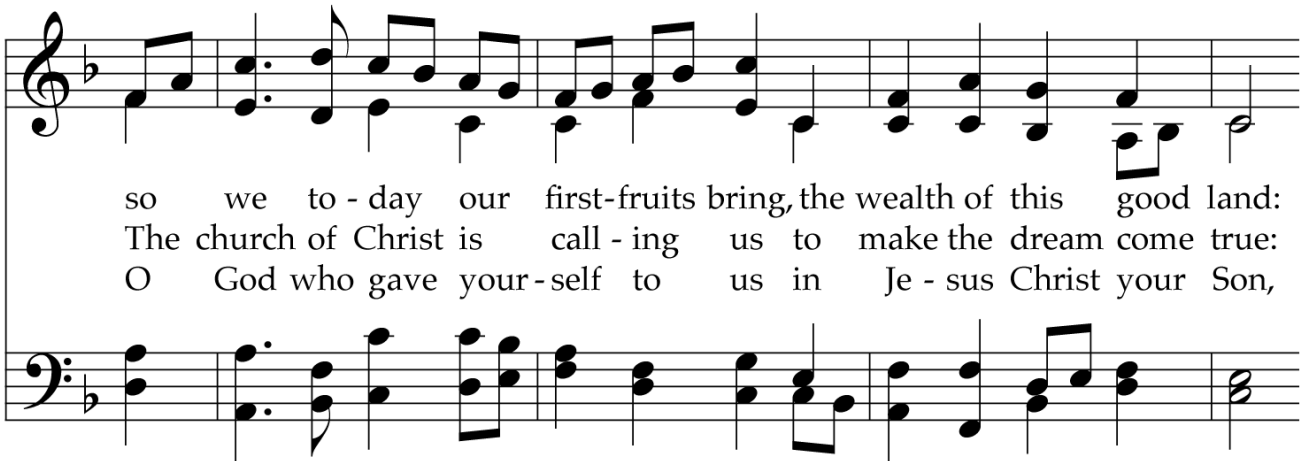

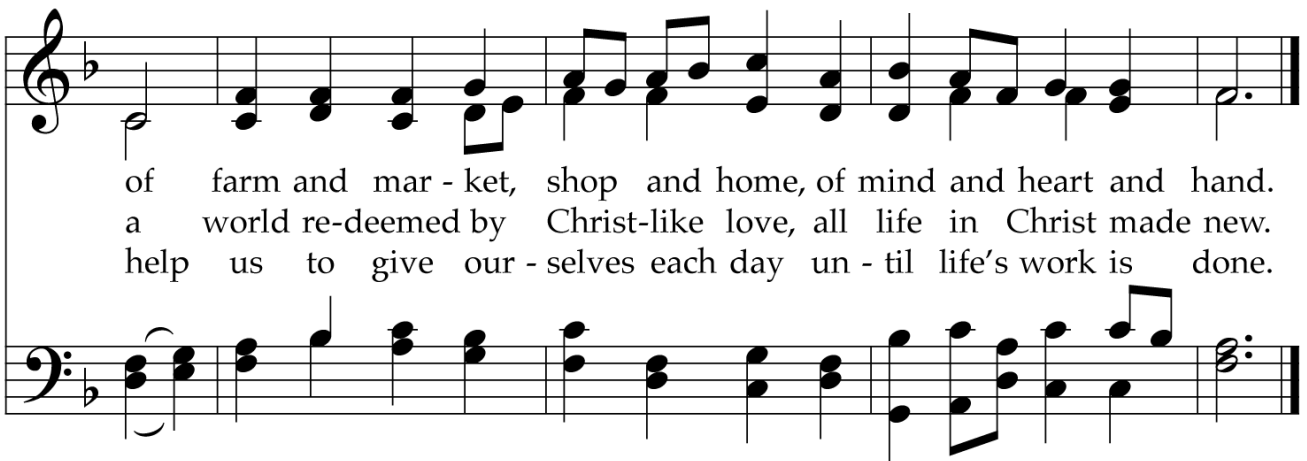
