JANUARY 18, 2026 –**SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME****Introduction to the Liturgy of the Day**

WHAT IS A “SPIRITUAL COMMUNION”?



The Eucharistic Liturgy is the summit of the church's worship. It is a sacramental communion with God the Father through the Son Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit. **For Catholics watching our livestream**, who are unable to be physically present in church to receive the Sacrament, there is a Spiritual Communion in and with Jesus Christ.

We should prepare for a Spiritual Communion in the same way we prepare to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. We should mentally collect our thoughts and prepare our hearts as best we can. Anytime Catholics are unable to receive the Eucharist, they can make an act of Spiritual Communion.

During the time the priest is preparing to distribute Communion to our congregation, the lector will read the *Prayer of Spiritual Communion*.
