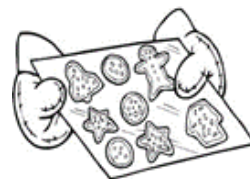

NEW BACKGROUND CHECK REQUIREMENTS

The Diocese of Columbus now requires all volunteers, including coaches and officials, to renew their fingerprint background check every five years.

If you were last fingerprinted in 2020 or earlier, you need to update your fingerprints with the Diocese.

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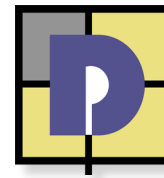


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
