CHILDREN'S OFFERTORY ENVELOPES

Every day, children in our society are bombarded with hundreds of advertising messages. For the most part these messages tell our children that they are not good enough unless they wear the right clothes, drink the right soda, or carry the right cellphone. It is important that in church, our children hear a different message!

Our children need to hear the stewardship message—that God has given them many unique and special gifts—Jesus loves them just as they are. They need to understand that they have something to share with the rest of the world. For this reason, we will offer the Children's Offertory Envelope Program, which will allow our children to place their own gifts to God in the Offertory basket each week. This program **IS NOT** to raise more money for our parish. The purpose is to teach the children the joy of giving and the fact that they need to be good stewards and give back to God out of gratitude for all that God has given to them. Every child will have the opportunity to participate by personally filling out their weekly envelope and placing it in the offertory basket at Mass. On the envelope, they can share how they lived their faith each week. The children can write down a gift of time to prayer, or the talent that they have shared that week in service to others.

One of the primary purposes of this effort is to teach children that it does indeed feel good to give. It is good for children's self-esteem to know that they have something to offer back to the Church. For that reason, it is more important that a child puts in a nickel, dime, quarter or even a dollar from his or her own allowance and feels more proud of that contribution than putting in money from Mom's or Dad's wallet, which is meaningless to the child.

Por esta razón, ofreceremos el Programa de Sobres del Ofertorio para Niños, que permitirá a nuestros niños colocar sus propios regalos a Dios en la canasta del Ofertorio cada semana. Este programa **NO ES** para recaudar más dinero para nuestra parroquia. El propósito es enseñar a los niños el gozo de dar y el hecho de que necesitan ser buenos mayordomos y retribuir a Dios en gratitud por todo lo que Dios les ha dado. Cada niño tendrá la oportunidad de participar llenando personalmente su sobre semanal y colocándolo en la canasta del ofertorio en la Misa. En el sobre, pueden compartir cómo vivieron su fe cada semana. Los niños pueden escribir un regalo de tiempo para la oración, o el talento que han compartido esa semana en el servicio a los demás.

WHAT IS A MASS INTENTION?

Whenever a priest celebrates Mass, he has at least two specific intentions. The first intention is to celebrate the Mass according to the rubrics the Church provided for how to say the Mass. The second is to apply the grace of that Mass toward a specific need or intention. This second intention, commonly called “the intention of the Mass,” is a special intention offered to God as a prayer of intercession and thanksgiving in and through the Eucharist.

Since the graces of the Mass are infinite, many intentions can be offered up at a single Mass. While a priest may only accept one intention per offering at a single Mass, he may have many other intentions not attached to an offering.

In addition, the faithful may bring their own intentions to the Mass, which they each carry privately and place upon the altar spiritually in prayer. You can request a Mass by email at acarrier@saintmarymag.org, on our website at stmarymagdalencolumbus.org, or by calling the Parish Office. The suggested stipend for a Mass Intention is \$10.00. This signifies the sacrificial nature of giving something of yourself.

HAPPY 4TH OF JULY!

FIRST FRIDAY DEVOTION:

Typically, nine consecutive Fridays in reparation to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Our Lord appeared to St. Margaret Mary Alcoque, a French nun in the Visitation Order, and gave her the special task to spread devotion to His Most Sacred Heart at a time when religion was growing cold in the hearts of mankind. For those who did this faithfully, he made what St. Margaret Mary referred to as the “Great Promise.” *“I promise you in the unfathomable mercy of my heart that my omnipotent love will procure the grace of final penitence for all those who receive communion on nine successive first Fridays of the month; they will not die in my disfavor, or without having received the sacraments, since my divine heart will be their sure refuge in the last moments of their life.”*

FIRST SATURDAY DEVOTION:

Typically, five consecutive Saturdays in reparation to the Immaculate Heart of Mary

The practice of the First Saturday devotion was requested by **Our Lady of Fatima**, who appeared to three shepherd children in Fatima, Portugal, multiple times starting in 1917. She said to Lucia, the oldest of the three children: *“I shall come to ask...that on the First Saturday of every month, Communions of reparation be made in atonement for the sins of the world.”*

Later she repeated her request to Sr. Lucia, the only one still living of the three young children, while she was a postulant sister living in a convent in Spain: *“Look, my daughter, at my Heart, surrounded with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce me at very moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. You at least try to console me, and say that I promise to assist at the hour of death, with the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five Decades of the Rosary, and keep me company for 15 minutes while meditating on the 15 Mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me.”*

GREATER DIFFICULTY, GREATER REWARD

While keeping up with these devotions over five or nine consecutive months is not easy, the reward for making the effort is eternal!
