WHAT IS A “SPIRITUAL COMMUNION”?

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You.

During the time when the priest is preparing to distribute Communion to our congregation, the lector will read the Prayer of Spiritual Communion.

The Eucharistic Liturgy is the summit of the Church's worship. It is a sacramental communion with God the Father through the Son Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit. For Catholics watching our livestream, who are unable to be physically present in church to receive the sacrament, there is a Spiritual Communion in and with Jesus Christ. We should prepare for a spiritual communion in the same way we prepare to receive Jesus in the Eucharist. We should mentally collect our thoughts and prepare our hearts as best we can. Anytime Catholics are unable to receive the Eucharist, they can make an act of Spiritual Communion.
