**ASH WEDNESDAY** is the first day of Lent and it occurs forty-six days (forty days not counting Sundays) before Easter. It is a moveable feast because it is dependent on the Sunday of Easter. It is always the seventh Wednesday before Easter.

On Ash Wednesday, ashes are placed on our foreheads as a sign of repentance. The ashes used are gathered from the Palms from the previous Palm Sunday. They are burned and mixed with sacred oils. The priest makes a sign of the cross on the forehead of the congregants and recites the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

### WHAT IS A MASS INTENTION?

Whenever a priest celebrates Mass, he has at least two specific intentions. The first intention is to celebrate the Mass according to the rubrics the Church provided for how to say the Mass. The second is to apply the grace of that Mass toward a specific need or intention. This second intention, commonly called "the intention of the Mass," are special intentions, offered to God as prayers of intercession and thanksgiving in and through the Eucharist.

Since the graces of the Mass are infinite, many intentions can be offered up at a single Mass. While a priest may only accept one intention per offering at a single Mass, he may have many other intentions not attached to an offering.

In addition, the faithful may bring their own intentions to the Mass, which they each carry privately and place upon the altar spiritually in prayer.

We are currently scheduling Mass Intentions for 2024. You can request a Mass by email at [acarrier@saintmarymag.org](mailto:acarrier@saintmarymag.org), on our website at [stmarymagdalenecolumbus.org](http://stmarymagdalenecolumbus.org) or by calling the Parish Office. The suggested stipend for a Mass Intention is \$10.00. This signifies the sacrificial nature of giving something of yourself.

El Miércoles de Ceniza se coloca ceniza en la frente en señal de arrepentimiento. Las cenizas utilizadas se recogen de las palmeras del Domingo de Ramos anterior. El sacerdote hace la señal de la cruz en la frente de los feligreses y recita las palabras: "Recordad que sois polvo, y al polvo volveréis".
