THE CHAIR OF SAINT PETER –

Feast Day: February 22nd

The Feast of the Chair of St. Peter celebrates the papacy and St. Peter as the first bishop of Rome. St. Peter's original name was Simon. He was married with children and was living and working in Capernaum as a fisherman when Jesus called him to be one of the Twelve Apostles. Jesus bestowed to Peter a special place among the Apostles. He was one of the three who were with Christ on special occasions. He was the only Apostle to whom Christ appeared on the first day after the Resurrection. Peter, in turn, often spoke on behalf of the Apostles. When Jesus asked the Apostles: "Whom do men say that the Son of Man is?"

Simon replied: "Thou art Christ, the Son of the Living God."

And Jesus said: "Blessed are you, Simon: because flesh and blood have not revealed it to you, but my Father who is in heaven. And I say to you: That you are Peter [Cephas, a rock], and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it. And I will give to you the keys of the kingdom of heaven. And whatsoever you shall bind upon earth, it shall be bound also in heaven: and whatsoever you shall loose on earth, it shall be loosed also in heaven." (Mt 16:13-20)

WHAT IS A MASS INTENTION?

Whenever a priest celebrates Mass, he has at least two specific intentions. The first intention is to celebrate the Mass according to the rubrics the Church provided for how to say the Mass. The second is to apply the grace of that Mass toward a specific need or intention. This second intention, commonly called "the intention of the Mass," is a special intention offered to God as a prayer of intercession and thanksgiving in and through the Eucharist.

Since the graces of the Mass are infinite, many intentions can be offered up at a single Mass. While a priest may only accept one intention per offering at a single Mass, he may have many other intentions not attached to an offering.

In addition, the faithful may bring their own intentions to the Mass, which they each carry privately and place upon the altar spiritually in prayer.

We are currently scheduling Mass Intentions for 2024. You can request a Mass by email (acarrier@saintmarymag.org), on our website (stmarymagdalenecolumbus.org) or by calling the Parish Office. The suggested stipend for a Mass intention is \$10.00. This signifies the sacrificial nature of giving something of yourself.

¿QUÉ ES UNA INTENCIÓN MASIVA?

Cada vez que un sacerdote celebra Misa, tiene al menos dos intenciones específicas. La primera intención es celebrar la Misa de acuerdo con las rúbricas que la Iglesia proporcionó sobre cómo decir la Misa. La segunda es aplicar la gracia de esa Misa hacia una necesidad o intención específica. Esta segunda intención, comúnmente llamada "la intención de la Misa", son intenciones especiales ofrecidas a Dios como oraciones de intercesión y acción de gracias en y a través de la Eucaristía.

Además, los fieles pueden traer sus propias intenciones a la Misa, que cada uno lleva en privado y coloca sobre el altar espiritualmente en oración. Actualmente estamos programando Misas de Intención para 2024. El estipendio sugerido para una misa de intención es de \$10.00. Esto significa la naturaleza sacrificial de dar algo de ti mismo.
