EL BUEN PASTOR

Reflexión sobre Juan 10,11-18

En este Domingo del Buen Pastor, Jesús dice: "Tengo otras ovejas que no son de este redil. También a ellas tengo que apacentar, y oirán mi voz, y habrá un solo rebaño y un solo pastor". Estas palabras nos recuerdan la misión de diálogo ecuménico e interreligioso de la Iglesia, que San Juan Pablo II afirma que "forma parte de la misión evangelizadora de la Iglesia (Redemptoris Missio, 56).

Si bien Jesús pide una unidad, una unicidad para su rebaño, los fines de estos diálogos con otros cristianos y personas de otras religiones (o sin fe) suelen enmarcarse en tres objetivos:

- Ayudar a personas de distintas religiones a convivir en paz y armonía, una tarea cada vez más urgente en un mundo cada vez más multicultural, multirreligioso y laico;
- Trabajar juntos al servicio de la humanidad, sabiendo que los problemas a los que se enfrentan nuestro mundo y nuestras comunidades son tan grandes que es necesario el esfuerzo de todos, juntos, para ayudar a los necesitados; y
- Compartir valores espirituales, un testimonio mutuo de creencias y una exploración de las riquezas de nuestras respectivas tradiciones, ayudando a todos a profundizar en sus compromisos religiosos, responder con mayor sinceridad a la llamada de Dios y caminar juntos hacia la verdad.

GOOD SHEPHERD

Reflection on John 10:11-18

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, Jesus says, “I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd.” These words call to mind the Church’s mission of ecumenical and interreligious dialogue, which St. John Paul II states “is part of the church’s evangelizing mission (Redemptoris Missio, 56).

While Jesus calls for a unity, a oneness for His flock, the aims of these dialogues with other Christians and people of other faiths (or of no faith) usually fall within three objectives:

1. To help people of different religions to live together in peace and harmony, a task which is ever more urgent in a world becoming increasingly multicultural, multireligious, and secular;
2. To work together in the service of humankind, knowing that the problems which our world and communities face are so great there is need for the efforts of all, together, to reach out to those who are in need; and
3. To share spiritual values, a mutual witness to beliefs, and an exploration of the riches of our respective traditions, helping all to deepen their religious commitments, respond with greater sincerity to God’s call, and walk together toward the truth.
