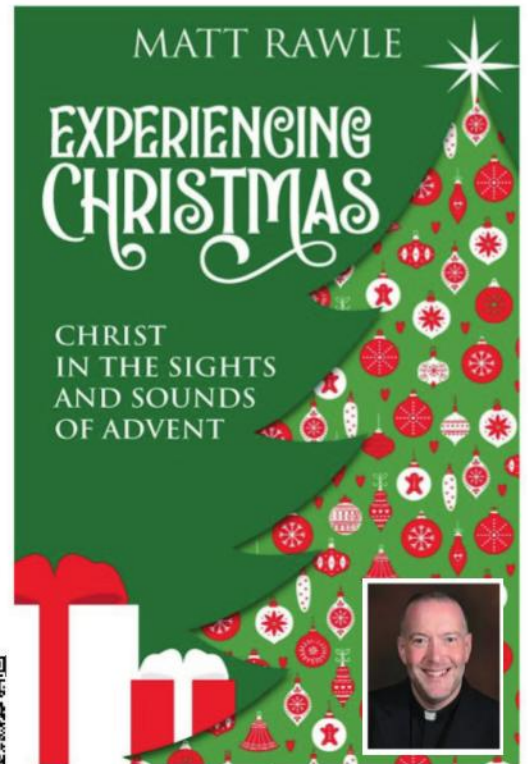
Experiencing Christmas by Matt Rawle.

ACCEPTING THE POPE'S INVITATION TO BE "MISSIONARIES OF HOPE AMONG THE PEOPLES"

The World Mission Rosary was first promoted in 1951 by Venerable Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, then National Director of The Pontifical Mission Societies in the United States. He envisioned a rosary that would embrace the whole world in prayer, assigning each decade a color representing a region of the world where the Church continues its mission work.

Celebrating World Mission Sunday - October 19

The Colors and Their Meanings:

- **Green** – for Africa, signifying its lush forests and rich natural resources
- **Red** – for the Americas, recalling the fire of faith and the blood of martyrs
- **White** – for Europe, symbolizing the seat of the Holy Father and the heart of tradition
- **Blue** – for Oceania, representing the vast waters surrounding its many islands
- **Yellow** – for Asia, evoking the sunrise and the light of the East

Praying five decades of the Rosary each day with these regions in mind is a concrete way to respond to Christ's call to go and make disciples of all nations and to be missionaries of hope among the peoples.

Dear Friends,

On October 19th, we celebrate World Mission Sunday, when we join Catholics around the world in supporting the missionary work of the Church - a day of prayer, reflection, and financial support for the Church's missionary work in 1,124 territories. These are regions of the world where the Church is still young, growing, and often facing poverty, conflict, or persecution. Just as we are recommitting ourselves today to MAKE disciples in the Diocese of Joliet, World Mission Sunday, reflects Jesus' great commission, to 'go and make disciples of all nations' (Matthew 28:19).

This year's theme, "Missionaries of Hope Among the Peoples," invites us to reflect deeply on the meaning of hope in the Christian life. Our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV, echoes this theme in his first apostolic exhortation, "Dilexi Te" ("I Have Loved You"), when he says, "God has a special place in his heart for those who are discriminated against and oppressed, and he asks us, his Church, to make a decisive and radical choice in favor of the weakest." So, let's join Our Holy Father and help him care for our brothers and sisters in missionary lands all across the globe. This second collection supports:

- ♦ The formation of seminarians and future religious sisters and brothers
- ♦ The education of children in Catholic schools
- ♦ Healthcare and pastoral care in remote and underserved regions
- ♦ The training of catechists and lay leaders
- ♦ The construction of churches, chapels, schools, and mission centers

The invitation to be "Missionaries of Hope among the peoples" is not for just some of us - it belongs to all of us by baptism. When we give, we are not simply making a donation - we are participating in a spiritual and missionary act of love, sustaining the Church where it cannot yet sustain itself. And when we pray for the missions, especially during World Mission Month, we are united with those bringing Christ's hope to the peripheries of the world.

Christian hope is not a vague optimism; it is the fruit of divine love - alive in us and active through us. That is why our missionary efforts are powerful acts of hope, especially for those suffering from poverty, violence, or religious persecution.

POP UP PARISH YOUTH CHOIR

WHAT: The "Pop Up" Parish Youth Choir is designed for busy families. We will schedule this choir to sing at Mass 3-4 times per year. As a parent of two children who are now 21 and 18 years old, I understand that activities and sports can cause scheduling conflicts. Each "Pop Up" choir will be its own entity. This first time, your student will commit to 4 dates. If they cannot participate this time around, no problem! They can sign up for the "Pop Up" choir in January, which will be a 3 date commitment. Still doesn't fit your schedule? No problem. We will have another "Pop Up" choir in the spring.

WHO: Any parishioner in grades 3-8 is welcome to join.

WHEN: We will rehearse 11:15-11:45 AM (*between the 10 AM and 12 PM Masses*) just FOUR times: Oct. 19th, Oct. 26th, Nov. 2nd, and Nov. 9th. THEN, on Nov. 9th, we still stay after our rehearsal and provide the music at the 12 PM Mass. This choir concept keeps your weekdays open for other activities. For the rehearsals, you may either attend the 10 AM Mass and stay after to rehearse, or arrive early to rehearse and stay after for the 12 PM Mass.

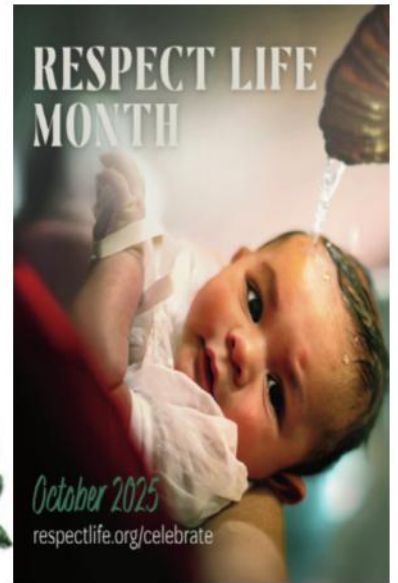

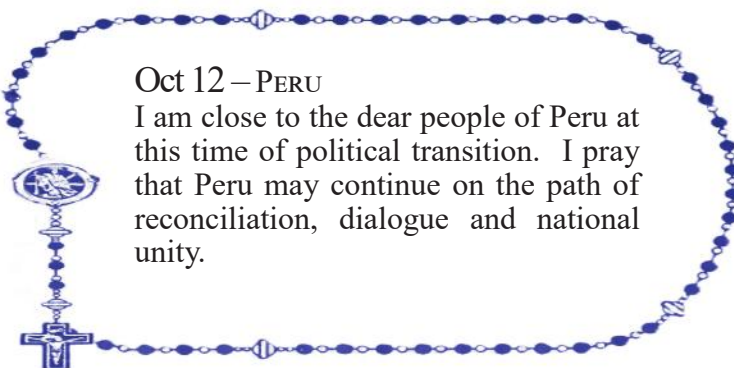

BAPTISMS

Baptisms are usually celebrated on the third Saturday of the month at 12:00 noon. Special events and holidays may alter the schedule. There is a three month waiting period for new parishioners. Contact the parish office for information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Hospitals do not inform churches when parishioners are patients. Tell hospital staff you want to be added to the Catholic census so that hospital ministers know to visit. Contact the parish office Ext 1 to be added to the prayer list, or to receive Eucharist from a Minister of Care.

FUNERALS

Arrangements for a funeral are usually made through the Funeral Director at a funeral home of your choice. Contact the parish office with any questions.

MARRIAGE REQUIREMENTS

Diocese requirements include a formal engagement preparation period of at least six months before the date of the wedding and attendance in a marriage preparation program. St. John the Baptist requires either the bride, groom or parents of either to be registered as parishioners for at least three months before contacting us to set a date. There are a number of additional requirements. To begin the marriage process, either the bride or groom must contact the parish office.
