



If you've been thinking about entrusting yourself to Mary for the first time or if you're looking to deepen and renew your devotion - this is the perfect retreat to make.




GETTING OUR HOUSE READY FOR EASTER

POPE LEO PROCLAIMS JUBILEE YEAR of St. Francis with Plenary Indulgences

To mark the 800th anniversary of the death of St. Francis of Assisi, Pope Leo XIV has proclaimed a Special Jubilee Year of St. Francis to be observed from January 10, 2026 to January 10, 2027. This Jubilee invites the faithful to renew their commitment to holiness, peace, and evangelical charity following the example of the Seraphic Patriarch.

During the Jubilee Year, the faithful may obtain a Plenary Indulgence, under the usual conditions, by making pilgrimages to churches, monasteries and oratories administered by the Franciscan Order and diocesan churches with St. Francis of Assisi is the titular patron, as well as through prayer and spiritual union for those unable to travel.

The indulgence is also applicable for the souls in Purgatory. The decree calls all Christians to embody mercy, humility, and peace in a world marked by division, echoing the enduring spiritual legacy of St. Francis of Assisi.



The blessing of the food for the Easter feast will take place in church on


Saturday, April 4th at 12:00 noon.

This is a beloved tradition borrowed from those of Eastern European backgrounds. The foods in the baskets are rich in Easter symbolism and serve to do more than whet one's appetite after the long season of Lenten fasting.

Traditional items are listed below. The baskets are sprinkled with holy water and a prayer of blessing is said.

Traditionally the baskets are adorned with boxwood and dried flowers. Covering the basket is a cloth that is meant to symbolize the burial cloth that wrapped Jesus' body in the tomb. These are often embroidered and passed down from one generation to another, as is often, the gift of our faith.

Load the Basket with traditional items.



You might want to put in some of the traditional items:

- **Bread**— symbolizing Jesus, the Bread of Life
- **Easter Eggs**— symbolizing our new life in Christ
- **Salt**— to remind Christians that they are to "season" the Earth
- **Meat**— symbolizing joy and abundance
- **Candle**- symbolizing Christ, the Light of the World
- **ribbons**— symbolizing joy and celebration
- **any other items** you want to put in (chocolates, desserts, whatever)

NEW PARISHIONERS

We warmly invite you to join our parish family. To register, stop by the parish office or see the parish website at www.stjohnwinfield.org.

BAPTISMS

Baptisms are usually celebrated on the first and third Sunday of the month after the 12:00 noon Mass. Special events and holidays may alter the schedule. There is a three month waiting period for new parishioners to schedule a baptism. Contact the parish office for information.

PASTORAL CARE OF THE SICK

Hospitals do not inform churches when parishioners are patients. Tell hospital staff you want to be added to the Catholic census so that hospital ministers know to visit. Contact the parish office Ext 0 to be added to the prayer list. Ext 610 to receive Eucharist from a Minister of Care.

FUNERALS

Arrangements for a funeral are usually made through the Funeral Director at a funeral home of your choice. Contact the parish office with any questions.

MARRIAGE REQUIREMENTS

Diocese requirements include a formal engagement preparation period of at least six months before the date of the wedding and attendance in a marriage preparation program. St. John the Baptist requires either the bride, groom or parents of either to be registered as parishioners for at least three months before contacting us to set a date. There are a number of additional requirements. To begin the marriage process, either the bride or groom must contact the parish office.
