CITY SURVEY TO BE MAILED TO FARMINGTON RESIDENTS



Residents of Farmington will soon receive the bi-annual Resident Survey in the mail.

The survey assesses public opinion regarding a variety of services provided by the City and is used to obtain other useful information about residents.

Survey results will be used in preparing the 2027 and 2028 operating budgets and for updating the five-year capital improvement plan. Your input also provides feedback that will guide implementation of new programs and changes to existing services.

Residents are asked to return the surveys in the postage-paid envelope they will receive by July 15, 2026. You may also scan and return a PDF file of the completed survey to survey@farmington-mo.gov.

Results will be compiled and available at farmington-mo.gov by October 31, 2026.

This summer, it's important to avoid blowing grass clippings and leaves into Farmington streets. It not only violates City ordinance, but leaves and grass left in the street can also wash into storm drains and nearby streams, adding nutrients that contribute to harmful algal blooms.

Yard debris can also clog storm drains and increase the risk of localized flooding during heavy rain.

Residents are encouraged to blow or sweep clippings back onto their property, bag them, or take to the City's disposal site at 3875 Pimville Road. The site is available only to residents living within Farmington city limits, and commercial disposal is not permitted.
