# WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR



Thank you for your interest in the *Bilingual Economic Development Network of Newfoundland and Labrador* (RDÉE TNL).

At RDÉE TNL, our main objective is to help improve the financial situation of francophones in Newfoundland and Labrador and of those who wish to move here. To do so, our main areas of expertise are:

- Employability and recruitment;
- Economic immigration;
- Tourism;
- Entrepreneurship.

2020-2021 was the first year of implementation of our three-year strategic plan. Our initial projections based on pre-COVID economic conditions had to be radically readjusted. The challenges we faced were unprecedented.

To achieve our goals, we had to reinvent ourselves: we sought training on new management tools and began collaborating with previous as well as new partners to create services that ultimately provided revenues for 29 French-speaking clients, exceeding our target of 25 set out in our strategic plan. In addition, these efforts had a positive impact on 14 of our partners' clients.

However, during this period, an abrupt halt to tourism and group activities such as cooperative entrepreneurship prevented us from reaching some of the objectives we had set before the pandemic.

But not to worry, because this year we have already resumed these activities and we aim to exceed our projections. With all of the preparation mentioned above, we are excited to get back to normal!

# ₩IRTUAL JOB FAIR

We hosted our 1st virtual job fair in partnership with the St. John's Board of Trade, Axis, Eventide and Connector NL: 38 job seekers and 5 employers attended, with 3 contracts offered during

the event.

### **Embassy Liaison Tour**

Interactive teleconferences presented by the IRCC to employers and community organizations of the province to showcase their programs that support Francophone immigration and, at the same time, to meet and better understand the community their programs are targeted to. 318 participants in total.

### Port au Port tourism planning sessions

2 virtual sessions were presented in collaboration with TCAR to discuss the region's challenges: lack of access to high-speed internet and lack of computer literacy. Recommendations for a future action plan were proposed to the 5 francophone organizations represented.

# **W**IRTUAL JOB FAIR

October 23, 2020

As part of the Semaine de l'immigration francophone, RDÉE Canada organized a teleconference with 3 panellists (including our Eastern agent), 5 entrepreneurs and more than 50 participants, to discuss the different challenges faced by francophone immigrant entrepreneurs.

#### Virtual Job Fair MUN / CNA

RDÉE TNL was present on this virtual campus organized by the universities of the region to promote our employability services and job offers from francophone organizations. We collected more than 36 resumes from bilingual candidates.

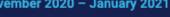
#### Cellular tower on the Port au Port Peninsula

After many months of work in partnership with Bell, ARCO and the region's cellular committee, cell phone service has become available in Mainland and Three Rock Cove.

### **VIRTUAL JOB FAIR**

Organized by RDÉE Canada, this event represents all provinces and territories. 400 candidates (permanent residents. temporary permits, working holiday visas, and student permits) were selected from 17 countries, with 68% of job seekers already in Canada.

# Canada

RDÉE TNL participated in this 3-day virtual fair. It is a major annual event for employers interested in finding candidates outside of Canada through Francophone immigration. 8000 participants this year.

### **Digital Literacy Sessions**

Part of the Women's Economic Council's entrepreneurial project "Her Own Boss" funded by the IRCC, 5 workshops aimed at training newcomers to manage their own business. RDÉE TNL offered its support in French for the workshops on computer skills, such as online marketing tools. 3 regular participants.

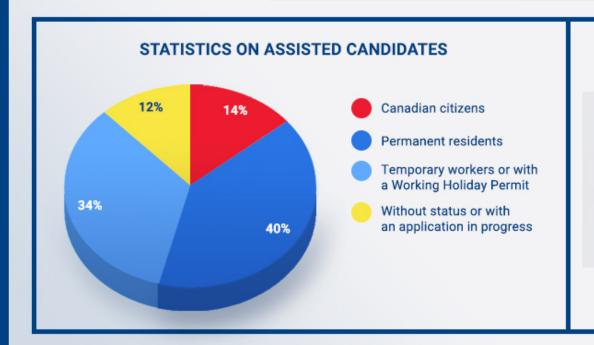


At the various recruitment events we attended this year, we represented a total of 83 employers from the province:

- At Destination Canada, 4000 job candidates showed interest in the 101 job offers we published.
- At RDÉE Canada's Virtual Job Fair, 103 candidates showed interest in the 83 job offers we published.
- In total, around 4500 candidates showed interest in our services.

To follow up on this interest, we worked with candidates who met one or more specific criteria:

- 88 candidates had a migratory and/or citizenship status.
- 36 candidates had a profile that was in high demand in the province.
- 12 other candidates were of strong interest, but without a migratory status.



#### SERVICES OFFERED

- 19 clients assisted with resume and cover letter writing
- 394 periodic mailings of job offers according to profile
- Participation in / organization of 7 virtual job fairs

All in all, during the period from April 2020 to March 2021, 29 clients found work thanks to the RDÉE TNL.
