



LYON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE MEDIA RELEASE

- On Monday, April 6, 2026, around 4:40pm, Sheriff Brent White served a Lyon Circuit Court bench warrant for Contempt of Court on Shane L. Jones (53) of Kuttawa. Jones' original charges include Possession of Controlled Substance-1st Degree (Methamphetamine), Possession of Marijuana, and Drug Paraphernalia. Jones was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.

- On Monday, April 6, 2026, around 5:45pm, Deputy Bobby Beeler made contact with a female from Arizona at the Five Star convenience center in Eddyville. The female was identified as Brandi Fay Dean (44) of Arizona. She was charged with Failure of Owner to Maintain Required Insurance-1st Offense and License to be in Possession. During the encounter, Dean was determined to be in a mental health crisis. She was subsequently transported to an area hospital where she was later admitted for mental health and medical treatment.
- On Tuesday, April 7, 2026, around 8:15am, SRO Deputy Jason Young was contacted by the High School Principal regarding a student who entered the school and was suspected to be under the influence of an intoxicated substance. Deputy Young's investigation determined the juvenile student was under the

influence of a controlled substance. The 17-year-old male student was detained and charged with Public Intoxication. He was released to a parent/guardian by the authority of the Court Designated Worker.

- On Tuesday, April 7, 2026, around 6:43pm, Deputy Bobby Beeler arrested Laycee C. Hunter (33) of Eddyville on a McCracken District Court bench warrant for Failure to Appear on a traffic case where she was convicted for Operating on a Suspended/Revoked License. Hunter was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.

- On Thursday, April 9, 2026, around 3:45pm, Sheriff Brent White charged Thomas J. Prevatte (46) of Princeton on a Lyon Circuit Court indictment warrant charging him with offenses which occurred on February 24, 2026. The charges were levied by a recent Lyon County Grand Jury and are as follows:
 - Theft by Unlawful Taking Auto (<\$10,000) by Complicity
 - Theft by Unlawful Taking All Others (<\$10,000) by Complicity
 - Trafficking Controlled Substance-1st Degree by Complicity (> 2 grams of Methamphetamine)
 - Drug Paraphernalia – Buy/Possess by Complicity
 - Criminal Attempt – Fleeing/Evading Police – 1st Degree (motor vehicle)
 - Wanton Endangerment – 1st Degree
 - Wanton Endangerment – 1st Degree (police officer)
 - Criminal Mischief – 1st Degree
 - Terroristic Threatening – 3rd Degree
 - No Registration Plates
 - No Registration Receipt
 - Failure of Non-owner to Maintain Required Insurance-1st Offense
 - Operating on Suspended/Revoked License
 - Failure to Wear Seat Belts
 - Operating Motor Vehicle Under Influence-Controlled Substance-2nd Offense
