



LYON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE MEDIA RELEASE

- On Friday, May 15, 2026, around 11:57am, Deputy Bobby Beeler and other first responder agencies responded to Dulaney Road for a single vehicle collision involving a motorcycle. The investigation revealed a 13-year-old Cadiz juvenile was operating a mini-bike when he lost control in a gravel driveway causing a collision and resulting in injuries to him. The juvenile was flown to an out-of-state hospital by Air Evac for treatment of his injuries. The Eddyville Fire Department, Lyon County EMS, and Lyon County Emergency Management assisted Deputy Beeler at the scene.
- On Saturday, May 16, 2026, around 4:23pm, Deputy Bobby Beeler responded to a two-vehicle, non-injury collision on US 62 in Kuttawa. His investigation revealed a 2025 Chevrolet Tahoe, driven by Brian Moodie (64) of Grand Rivers was behind a West bound truck and trailer that attempted to make a U-turn, when Moodie's vehicle collided with the trailer in tow by a 2024 Ram 3500 truck driven by Nathanael Boone (52) of Madisonville. No injuries were reported in the collision. Chief Deputy Sam Adams assisted Deputy Beeler at the scene.
- On Tuesday, May 19, 2026, around 4:58pm, Deputies and State Troopers were dispatched to a residence on Hylan Drive for a disturbance complaint. Deputy Bobby Beeler's investigation resulted in the arrest of Cameron A. Sanders (20) of Hopkinsville. He was charged with Assault-4th Degree (domestic violence) for assaulting a juvenile family member. Sanders was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.
- On Tuesday, May 19, 2026, around 10:19pm, Deputy Bobby Beeler responded to a single vehicle collision at the intersection of KY 818 North and KY 293 for a single vehicle collision. His investigation revealed a 1999 Ford Ranger, driven by Cynthia M. Attaguile (38) of Princeton, ran off the roadway and collided with an embankment due to ponding water on the roadway, at the intersection. No injuries were reported in the collision.

- On Tuesday, May 19, 2026, just before midnight, Deputy Bobby Beeler was dispatched to a loud party complaint off Oriole Drive in Old Eddyville. His investigation determined multiple teenagers were gathered on property they did not have permission to be upon. Hayden J. Schenk (18) of Fredonia was arrested due to it being his second incident within a two-month period for trespassing on property he did not have permission to be upon. Schenk was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center and his vehicle was impounded. The other teenagers were trespassed from the property. The Eddyville Police Department assisted Deputy Beeler at the scene.
- On Wednesday, May 20, 2026, around 8am, Deputy Josh Travis served a Hopkins District Court bench warrant on Edward G. Bell (26) of Earlington. Bell was a listed fugitive pertaining to an assault case in Hopkins County. He awaits extradition back to Hopkins County.
- On Thursday, May 21, 2026, around 5:50am, Chief Deputy Sam Adams responded to a Kuttawa business for a two-commercial vehicle collision. His investigation revealed a 2024 Freightliner, driven by John T. Conner (66) of Napa, CA was driving through a parking lot when he misjudged his clearance when turning, and collided with the front of a parked 2000 Freightliner, occupied by Rivera Rodrigues of Miami, FL. No injuries were reported in the collision.
- On Thursday, May 21, 2026, around 2:47pm, Chief Deputy Sam Adams responded to a two-vehicle collision on US 62 West near Dustin Road. His investigation revealed a 2015 Chevrolet Trax, driven by Dema Genseal (86) of Princeton, was East bound when she attempted to pass another motorist and sideswiped a West bound 2018 Honda CR-V, driven by Thomas R. Smothers (55) of Benton. Smothers had to take evasive action to avoid a head-on collision. No injuries were reported in the collision.
- On Thursday, May 21, 2026, around 5:52pm, Sheriff Brent White was dispatched to a complaint on Hylan Drive involving a subject who was reportedly at a residence he was court-ordered to be away from. Sheriff White conducted a traffic stop on a 2002 Dodge pickup truck that departed the residence as he was arriving. The driver, Cameron A. Sanders (18) of Hopkinsville was the subject of the court order and he was arrested and charged with Driving on a DUI Suspended License-1st Offense and Failure to Wear Seat Belts. Additionally, he was found to have violated multiple court ordered conditions of his recent release from custody. Due to these violations, he was also charged with Contempt of Court and lodged again in the Crittenden County Detention Center.

- On Thursday, May 21, 2026, around 9:25pm, Sheriff Brent White responded to three collisions on I-24 near the 37-mile post on the East bound side of the interstate. His investigation revealed a large commercial vehicle tire was in the East bound lanes of travel and multiple vehicles collided with the tire, causing damage to each vehicle. Wendy Delgado (31) of Florida City, FL was driving a 2018 Nissa Versa. She was not injured in the collision. Mikail Latif Sheikh (32) of Springfield, IL was driving a 2019 Toyota Camry. Neither him nor his passenger were injured in the collision. A third, non-injury commercial vehicle collision, was investigated by Kentucky State Police.
- On Friday, May 22, 2026, at 3:12am, Deputy Bobby Beeler's continuing investigation resulted in Cameron A. Sanders (18) of Hopkinsville being charged with the Class D Felony of Intimidating a Participant in the Legal Process. Sanders is accused of violating multiple bond conditions within hours of release from custody previously, and he reportedly continued to conduct acts which included assault upon his previous victim, menacing acts, threats of bodily injury upon the victim and witnesses to these incidents in an attempt to have them be untruthful and/or refrain from cooperating with law enforcement. Sanders remains lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center under a no-bond court order.
- On Saturday, May 23, 2026, at 7:20pm, Deputies and Troopers were dispatched to an assault complaint on Lawwill Road off KY 810 South. Prior to the arrival of officers, another 9-1-1 call reported that one of the involved parties was intoxicated and had fled the scene in a GMC pickup truck. Sheriff Brent White and an Eddyville Police Department Officer located this vehicle off Waschick Road at a campground and detained the driver. He was identified as David L. Warner (57), of Kuttawa. Deputy Bobby Beeler charged Warner with DUI-3rd Offense and Operating on Suspended or Revoked Operator's License. Warner was also charged by Kentucky State Police (KSP) with Assault involving the incident on Lawwill Road. That investigation is continuing by KSP. Warner was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.
- On Sunday, May 23, 2026, around 9:30pm, Kentucky State Police received multiple 9-1-1 calls regarding a disturbance and fight at the corner of 4th Street and Lake Barkley Drive in Kuttawa. Deputies, Troopers, Eddyville Police Dept., and Forest Service Law Enforcement personnel were dispatched due to the reported large crowd fighting. Two vehicles reportedly fled the scene and both were located on Stubbs Road off Lake Barkley Drive by Sheriff's Office personnel. Approximately six persons were detained initially, most were juveniles or teenage/young adults; three of whom were injured. Lyon County EMS transported a 16-year-old male juvenile to Mercy Hospital in Paducah for treatment of his injuries. Two of those injured refused transport to a hospital. Statements were collected, evidence was obtained, and the remaining juveniles/teenagers were released to the custody of adult caretakers.

The investigation revealed the young adults and teenagers were driving by a group of tenants at a local rental residence when words were exchanged which upset several of those at the residence. When the young adults and teenagers drove by again, an object was thrown at one of the vehicles resulting in both vehicles stopping in the roadway and some exiting the vehicles. A physical altercation with multiple persons from the rental residence and those in the vehicles commenced. Portions of the altercations were captured on video.

Sheriff Brent White charged Jason L. Walker (46) of Ashland City, TN with Assault-4th Degree (child abuse) for the assault on the 16-year-old male who was transported to the hospital. Walker was detained and interviewed before being charged and released with a June court date in Lyon District Court.

The investigation is continuing by the Lyon County Sheriff's Office. If anyone has video or specific information pertaining to this incident, they are asked to call 270-388-2311.

Note: initial social media reports pertaining to this incident incorrectly identified one of the assault suspects as a Lyon County High School athletic coach. This person was 'not' involved in anyway in this incident and was confirmed to not be in Lyon County when this incident occurred. The person who was initially identified on social media as this coach was in fact, proven to be Mr. Walker, who was charged in this incident.

- On Sunday, May 24, 2026, just after midnight, Deputies, Officers, and Troopers were dispatched to a local campground off KY 93 South for a disturbance complaint. Upon arrival, they located an upset and intoxicated female who was yelling in the campground and causing a disturbance. She was identified as Karlee D. Pecka (31) of Newburgh, IN. Pecka was arrested by Deputy Bobby Beeler and charged with Disorderly Conduct-1st Degree and Alcohol Intoxication in a Public Place-1st or 2nd Offense. She was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.
