



LYON COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE MEDIA RELEASE

- On Sunday, February 15, 2026, around 6pm, Deputy Bobby Beeler responded to an ATV theft complaint, at a residence off KY 819 (Sunnyside Loop). His investigation revealed a family was preparing for an auction and had placed numerous auction items in a field area. At some point prior to the report, unknown persons stole a blue/white, 2005 Yamaha, Model: YFM50RTL (50cc), four-wheeler valued at \$2,000, from the property. - On Tuesday, February 17, 2026, around 3:25am, Chief Deputy Sam Adams responded to a burglar alarm complaint at a Kuttawa business. His investigation determined that two unidentified perpetrators forcibly entered McConnell Health Mart Pharmacy on Cedar Street, doing damage to a door before trying to steal items within the business. - On Wednesday, February 18, 2026, around 1:25pm, deputies served a Scott County indictment warrant on Ryan T. Crawley (41) of Georgetown for the following offenses:
 - Murder
 - Kidnapping (victim death)
 - Tampering with Physical Evidence (2 counts)

Crawley is awaiting extradition back to Scott County pertaining to this indictment.

- On Thursday, February 19, 2026, around 8am, a Kuttawa resident made a report to Chief Deputy Sam Adams concerning a scam and theft. She reported initially being contacted by telephone whereby a person represented themselves to be a Verizon cellular agent. The victim had recently purchased a new phone and believed the call was related to the sale. The person claiming to be the cellular agent told the victim they would send her a link to her phone, which she received. Apparently, when the victim clicked on this link, the scammer was able to fully control her phone and withdraw thousands of dollars from her bank account, which she routinely accessed from an application on her smartphone. The victim's phone was placed into SOS mode which rendered the victim unable to stop nor control the phone's functions. Sheriff White reminds everyone to always be cautious and verify caller identities before sharing any information or clicking on any link sent to you.
- On Friday, February 20, 2026, around 8:33am, a Kuttawa resident reported being a victim of a scam incident. He reportedly received documentation from PayPal customer service claiming he owed a balance of \$555.03. The victim reported never being a customer of PayPal. The investigation is continuing by Chief Deputy Sam Adams.

- On Friday, February 20, 2026, around 9:35am, Bryer L. Blakley (25) of Calhoun turned himself in to Sheriff Brent White in Eddyville. Blakley was the subject of a Lyon District Court bench warrant for Failure to Appear in court for an illegal hunting citation. Blakley was arrested by Sheriff White and he later posted a cash bond before being released from custody with a pending court date.
- On Friday, February 20, 2026, around 2:15pm, the Sheriff's Office received a call about a trespassing incident off Green Road. The initial complaint indicated a neighbor saw a man trespassing on a friend's property and witnessed him urinating in the open. That witness yelled for the man to leave the property and she then contacted the property owner who responded to her property and stopped to speak to the individual on Green Road where she observed him walking. When the property owner asked the male subject if he was the person previously trespassing on her property, he became angry and pulled a knife from his waistband and brandished it at the female property owner.

The female fled the scene and contacted the Sheriff's Office. Photographs of the male subject were obtained and utilized to identify the subject. The suspect was later located at a residence off KY 810 South. The male was identified as Brian C. Goodson (42) of Kuttawa. A knife matching the description provided by the victim was recovered at the residence. Goodson was detained and transported to the Sheriff's Office. He was later arrested and charged with Wanton Endangerment-1st Degree. Goodson was lodged in the Crittenden County Detention Center.
