

† **Lenten Mission:** We invite you to join us for our Parish Mission April 5-8, 2025 with John Angotti.

† **Mass, Confession and Adoration** The Holy Mass is the highest form of prayer! This Lent, we encourage you to rededicate yourself to attending Mass, perhaps during the week as well as Sunday. Reconciliation is available every Thursday evening from 6:00-7:00pm and Saturdays beginning at 3:00pm and Friday, April 11 from 3:00-7:00pm. Adoration is offered on Saturdays from 8:30—9:30am, Thursdays from 6:00—7:00pm and every second Tuesday from 5:00—7:00pm. Come sit in silence with our Lord and spend time with Him, free from distraction.

† **Pray the Rosary** One way we can grow in holiness this Lent is by incorporating the Rosary into our daily practices and Lenten observances. Meditating on the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary will assist you in your love for Jesus and His sacrifice.

† **Stations of the Cross** Stations of the Cross will be held on Fridays during Lent at 7:00pm in the Cathedral. Good Friday stations will be prayed at 6:00pm.

† **Community Care and St. Vincent de Paul** Almsgiving and caring for those in need are part of our Christian Lenten Discipline. We encourage you to make this a habit by sacrificing non-essential spending for a greater good. Consider supporting our St. Vincent de Paul Society, our micro pantry or by volunteering at one of our local food pantries.

† **Hallow** We have again partnered with Hallow to present "Lent Pray40 Prayer Challenge." Pray each day, be inspired by meditations, and deepen your relationship with Jesus.



† **Rice Bowls** Rice Bowls are often thought to be a project for younger kids, but the bowl now comes with a calendar of useful activities that can be done by anyone or with a little creativity, adapted into something for adults as well. Visit csrcricebowl.org to learn more.

How do we fast?



When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal.

Am I excused from fasting and abstinence?

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.



Sleep Tight

For most of us, climbing into a warm, cozy bed at night is something we take for granted. Yet, for too many families in our community, a comfortable place to sleep is something they simply don't have.

As Society of St. Vincent de Paul volunteers make home visits, we often witness firsthand the stark realities of life's hardships. We've met parents whose children sleep on the floor, sometimes sharing a single blanket and pillow. Others have recently found housing but have no bed to rest in at night.

Without a proper bed, exhaustion sets in, affecting work, school, health, and overall well-being.

Determined to help, we sought a community partner to address this growing need. It didn't take long to know exactly who to call. Citywide Mattress has long been known for its generosity, and when we reached out, Ross Brocies was immediately eager to help. Having grown up watching his father, Rick, support the community in countless ways, Ross knew this was an opportunity to continue that legacy.

After a quick call to his dad, there was no hesitation—Citywide Mattress would provide quality mattresses, free delivery, and a deeply discounted price to make this initiative possible.

This partnership is already changing lives. A bed was recently delivered to William, a 51-year-old widower who had been homeless. Overcome with emotion, he sobbed with gratitude. Two twin beds and a full bed were delivered to Juanita, whose 8- and 10-year-old daughters will now have a warm, safe place to sleep—giving them the stability they need to focus on school and simply be kids.

Generosity comes in many forms. Thanks to the financial support of our parishioners and our new partnership with Citywide Mattress, twelve people can now truly "sleep tight" tonight.



At the end of the National Eucharistic Congress last year, Bishop Cozzens announced there would be a National Eucharistic Pilgrimage from Indianapolis to Los Angeles in 2025.

Upon being asked, Bishop Hicks gratefully accepted the honor for the Diocese of Joliet to be the first Diocese on the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage St. Katharine Drexel Route.

The Diocese of Joliet will receive the Eucharist from the Pilgrims and Chaplains coming from a Mass in Indianapolis, IN on Sunday, May 18 and we will present the Eucharist to the Diocese of Peoria at St. Patrick Parish in Seneca, IL on Monday May 19.
