Last year, the Promised Land Garden project on the south side of the Cathedral campus harvested more than 60 bushels of produce that was sent to food pantries in the area.

We are, again, looking for individuals, families, groups or multi-families to commit to planting, nurturing and harvesting one 4 x 8 foot raised bed.

#### Here are the basics:

- Gardeners are asked to tend their gardens weekly, keep their beds weed free and watered throughout the growing season.
- When harvested, gardeners are asked to deliver fresh produce to local pantries and soup kitchens.

Please consider this unique service project! So many plusses for participants:

- Great for first-time gardeners! We will teach you. You do not have to be experienced to succeed!
- Got a Green Thumb? What a great way to share your expertise!
- Family Bonding! Everyone can get involved! Summer-long science lessons for the kids.

Volunteer Spotlight – Getting to Know Us By Mary Spesia

The St. Vincent de Paul Society began here at St. Ray's in 2004, and I got involved almost immediately. At the time, I was a mother of three young children, so my participation was limited to attending meetings—but even that gave me an appreciation for the importance of the ministry's work. Today, I'm honored to be serving in my fourth year as President.

I've always loved volunteering, especially when it involves serving the poor. As a parishioner for 26 years, I've also been involved with Daybreak, Religious Education, and served as a Eucharistic Minister and Lector. Each of these ministries has been meaningful in its own way, but all of them have strengthened my faith.

Through my time with the St. Vincent de Paul Society, I've come to realize that if you truly want to understand the struggles of the poor, this is the place to learn. Those we serve are considered our "friends," and meeting with them has given me a balanced perspective on life.

I've become more compassionate and less judgmental. I now better understand the difficult choices people face when living paycheck to paycheck – or no paycheck at all. There are often complex stories behind what might appear to be "bad" decisions—like choosing between repairing a car or paying rent or a utility bill. Life's circumstances can be complicated! I've realized it's not my place to judge the choices others make, but to offer support where I can.

Over the years, I've met many individuals and families in need. I've walked into empty apartments where families were sleeping on the floor. In these moments, we build relationships. They may be short-term, but they are powerful—especially through the shared prayer that brings God into the room with us. Despite their challenges, many of the people we meet have amazing faith. It's humbling.

I've also witnessed the power of hope. Hope for a better day. Hope for enough money to buy gas. Hope for children to have a good meal. Hope for the job interview to result in a job closer to home. Hope for a pillow and bed and warm place to live. Hope for a better tomorrow.

And I've learned that the generosity of our parishioners can truly make a difference. Sometimes, a little help goes a long way: covering a medical bill while someone waits for Social Security benefits to begin; providing an apartment rental deposit when saving that kind of money has been impossible; paying for public transportation so someone can get to work.

When I reflect on those we serve, I also feel hope. Our ministry may not change the world—but it does make life a little easier for someone in need. And sometimes, that's everything.
