

Dear Friends,
Peace be with you.

Today, December 18, 2025, it was officially announced that I will be installed as the 11th Archbishop of the Archdiocese of New York on Friday, February 6, 2026.

I want to begin by expressing my heartfelt gratitude to Pope Leo XIV for this appointment. Growing up in the south suburbs of Chicago, just a stone's throw from where he grew up, and having spent part of my priesthood in missionary work in Latin America, I feel a deep connection to him. His leadership is a guiding light for me, and I accept this new role with humility and an open heart.

I am also grateful to Cardinal Christophe Pierre, our apostolic nuncio, for his trust. When he called to share this news, I told him I simply wish to do God's will. Receiving his phone call on the feast of Saint Juan Diego is a reminder that sometimes God calls us to things that feel beyond us, but with grace and faith, we can answer yes.

I also want to offer a heartfelt thank you to Cardinal Timothy Dolan for his more than 17 years of leadership in New York. I have been touched by his gracious support and encouragement.

These past five years in Joliet have been a true blessing for me. I have felt grateful, happy, and deeply blessed to serve as your bishop. Together we have catechized, evangelized, and put our faith into action. The relationships we have built, the faith we have shared, and the journey we have walked together are treasures I will carry with me to New York.

As you continue to read, share, and embrace my pastoral letter, "MAKE," I ask you to let it keep guiding you. Please do not let it sit on a shelf, gathering dust. Instead, continue to implement it as a living, breathing call to be disciples who MAKE disciples.

I have much to learn in New York, and I will serve there as I have served here, with all my heart. I trust in God's will and count on your prayers. Know that as you pray for me, I am praying for you, with immense gratitude and love.





Assisted Suicide Law

Illinois has recently become the twelfth state to pass legislation that allows terminally ill patients to consider "end-of-life" options. Governor J.B. Pritzker has approved a bill enabling adults with a terminal diagnosis and a prognosis of six months or less to request a prescription for medication that they can self-administer to end their lives. This legislation, referred to as "Deb's Law," is scheduled to take effect in September 2026. However, the Catholic Bishops of Illinois have voiced strong opposition, contending that the bill neglects critical issues regarding access to quality care and does not adequately safeguard vulnerable individuals from potential coercion. As you know, the Catholic Church firmly upholds the dignity of every human life from conception to natural death. Assisted suicide contradicts our moral teaching and threatens the well-being of the poor, the elderly, and those with disabilities. 



Year End Giving

Thank you to all who have helped support St. Raymond this past year. Your generous gifts to our parish and its ministries is a wonderful example of your faith and commitment to our parish community and the Lord.

The final months of the year are traditionally considered the season of giving. In addition to the gifts we give to the important people in our lives, this season of generosity is also the prime time to show support for the causes we love. When we look back at the days and months of the years and the countless blessings we have received, we hope that you will consider special ways to give back to the Lord for all He has given you. Please prayerfully remember St. Raymond, your spiritual home, as you discern your year-end gifts.

Although there may still be time to make several different types of charitable gifts, based on your unique situation and tax considerations, some gift types may be more practical than others. Here are a few ideas provided by the Diocese of Joliet, that you may want to consider, in addition to traditional monetary donations, which are always greatly appreciated.

1 Save taxes on appreciated stock

When you donate stocks that are worth more than what you originally paid for them, you can claim deductions for their full fair market value and eliminate any tax on the appreciation.

2 Avoid hassles & costs associated with selling real estate

Like securities, if you try to sell appreciated property you will be subject to capital gains tax on the appreciation. By donating the property to charity, you can enjoy tax savings and relieve yourself from the hassles of selling or maintaining it.

3 Put an insurance policy to good use

An old policy you no longer need can make a big impact on our work. To qualify as a deductible gift, we must become the policy owner. For most types of insurance policies, your tax deduction is usually the cost basis or the fair market value of the policy-whichever is less. It is more common to donate policies that require continued premiums to be paid. When you donate these, the future premiums are tax deductible as you pay them.

4 Tax-free donations of Required Minimum Distribution for an IRA

Individuals starting at age 70½ can transfer up to \$108,000 from their IRA's to charity, tax-free. The gift counts as the required minimum distribution for the year but it is not included in the adjusted gross income. This can be a great way to avoid having to pay taxes on your RMD if you want to support a charity, and it gives you a tax break even if you do not itemize your deductions.

5 Employer Matching Gifts

Companies frequently match their employees' monetary contributions. If your employer has this type of program, please consider utilizing it on behalf of St. Raymond Grade School. Many corporations offer employee matching gift programs for educational purposes.

6 Charitable Gifts from Your Will or Trust

An easy way to make a gift to St. Raymond is to include a bequest in your will or trust. You can give a specific sum, a percentage of your gross estate or your residuary estate.


