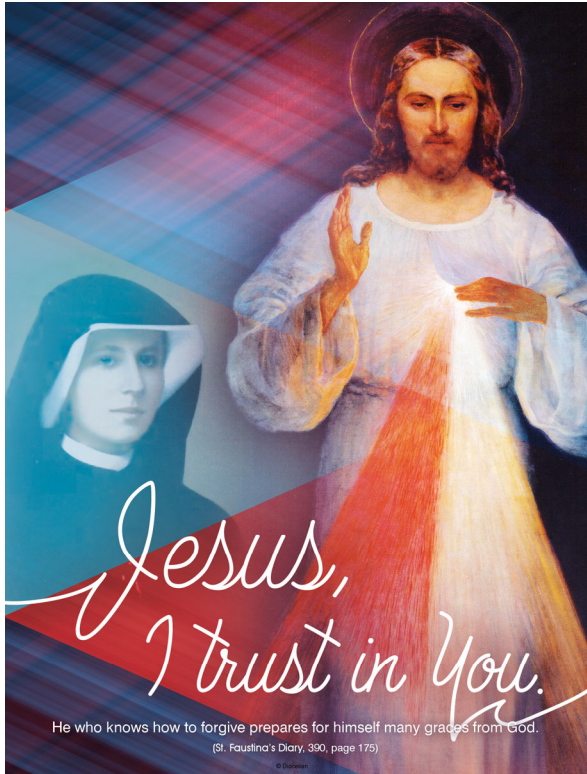

The message of The Divine Mercy is simple. It is that God loves us — all of us. And, he wants us to recognize that His mercy is greater than our sins, so that we will call upon Him with trust, receive His mercy, and let it flow through us to others. Thus, all will come to share His joy. The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering **ABC**:

**A** - Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.

**B** - Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.

**C** - Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that the graces of His mercy are dependent upon our trust. The more we trust in Jesus, the more we will receive.

This message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread.

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls"

On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday.

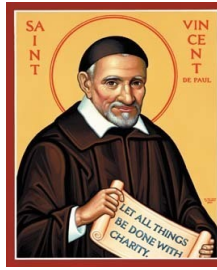




# Online Giving

The Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord normally falls on March 25, but since that date fell on the Monday of Holy Week this year, this feast was transferred to **Monday, April 8**. It is not a holy day of obligation to attend Mass.

The Annunciation celebrates the coming of the Archangel Gabriel to the Virgin Mary and announcing to her that she is to be the mother of the Savior.

On this feast, we switch to white vestments and pray the Gloria at the beginning of the Mass, both are symbols of the joy that accompanies the incarnation — Christ becoming human and choosing to be born as one of us. Even during the solemn penitential season of Lent, the Church acknowledges the coming of the Savior with hope and joy.

### Bishop Hicks' Column

April 2024  
FAITH-INSPIRED MOVIES



When looked at the vicar general in the Archdiocese of Chicago, I had a colleague who would frequently tell me to be more Catholic. It was never about the faith itself, but about the way we lived it. In 2018, he recommended *Love and Mercy*. I've since then taken it to heart as a guide of how to live the faith in our daily lives.

Heck what was so inspiring, Helena Kowalska entered the convent in 1925 and took the name of Sister Maria Faustina. She lived at several places in the Holy Spirit in Chicago. Her life was full of love and service to others. We encourage her humble existence and faithfulness, one experienced in the most ordinary ways. Jesus that daily revealed God's forgiveness, mercy, and kindness here for humanity. These experiences prompted her to pen her now famous diary, *Divine Mercy in My Soul*.

She also spent with a beautiful vision of Jesus, that most of all was recognizable in the Divine Mercy image. I encourage you to look at the image and see how it is so full of light. There is a symbol of the blood and water that flowed from Jesus' side, which signify the greatest of mercy and forgiveness. Of course, the key also is the sacrament of the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

The title of the image is included with the spiritual words of our Lord: "Jesus, I trust in You."
