# MINISTER'S LETTER

# Dear Friends,

When I sat down this time last year to write my Letter for our Church Magazine, we had been in lockdown for almost a year and we were still not back into the Church building for worship. None of us could have imagined how the global Coronavirus pandemic would play out nor the impact across all our lives it would make.

In the end our 'church' was never closed, though our building was closed for 15 months and when it did eventually open it was of course with many restrictions. Bit by bit, step by step we have returned to more normal practise and soon we may be worshipping as before, without any mandatory regulations – keep praying.

I am sure I am not alone in looking forward to a different daily focus from risk assessments and worship protocols. That said we already have a shared focus for our time ahead – it has been set by the General Assembly and instructed from the Presbytery – and that focus is mission.

In truth, mission is primarily God's work, not ours – we serve a missionary God who is at work in the world by his Holy Spirit and he is the one who brings in the harvest. However that doesn't mean for one minute that us making mission plans is unimportant – in fact through the process of prayer and listening we can become more receptive to the unexpected guidance and prompting of God.

In many ways missionary work is simple, and scripture gives us great guidance and encouragement:

# "So the word of God spread. The number of disciples increased rapidly." Act 6 v7

We are all called to play our part. New presbytery mission plans are in hand and we each have to share in spreading the Good News and pray hard for the return of our faithful, as well as being ready to welcome new disciples through our doors. As we journey through the season of lent and onwards to our resurrection celebrations we must never forget that we are Easter People – people full of hope. The Easter cross always bears hope and hope is our encouragement.

On behalf of the Manse Family I wish everyone the fullness of God's love and rich blessings this Easter time and always.

#### **WORSHIP at NOPC**

At Nairn Old Parish Church we have been back to 'in-person worship' since the end of May 2021. This means we have safely been meeting and worshipping together for the past 9 months without incident.

Our worship protocols are the result of the Kirk Session agreeing a regular Risk Assessment and we are pleased that the protocols have kept us all safe – even when regulations had to tighten up during the Omicron variant outbreak before Christmas.

At the time of writing, we ask for everyone attending to undertake a 'lateral flow test' on the morning before attending – anyone who feels in any way unwell is asked not to attend but rather to recover at home. On arrival at the church, hand sanitising and registration for the Test and Protect register is still in place. People are free to choose their own seat, taking into account that we still have every other pew cordoned off and social distancing is still encouraged. Face coverings are still a mandatory requirement for the congregation. Only the Choir may unmask for singing and the Minister for the conduct of worship.

We are very pleased that hospitality after worship is now available and the fellowship enjoyed by those who attend is very much appreciated.

In the not too distant future we anticipate that the regulations will be further relaxed, but be assured that the Kirk Session will always be mindful of assessing any risks and will cautiously move forward.

We are so looking forward to returning to more normal days and seeing more of our church family feel confident to return to Sunday worship.

#### **FINANCIAL REPORT**

# FEBRUARY 2022

This has been another difficult year for our congregation owing to the continued imposed restrictions as a result of the COVID 19 pandemic. We have had no Hall lets, minimal Fund raising, tea collections down and some members not attending because of Face Covering regulations and consequently our overall INCOME is down on last year's figure by almost £6,000.

Having said that, our congregation must be congratulated on the Christmas Gift envelopes £2,130, Smartie Tubes £2,005, Easter Gift envelopes £3,662 and thanks to those of you who have responded to the strategy of reviewing their weekly givings. There is no substitute for regular weekly or monthly offerings.

The most important item to report is that all the target for MAMA due to the GENERAL TRUSTEES of £64,081 has been met in full.

Our MAMA figure for 2022 is £70,375 and this will be a real challenge but with effort and the continued support of a loyal and faithful congregation it can be done as we learn to give prayerfully, sacrificially and spiritually for the Lord's work here and throughout the mission of the Church of Scotland.
