

# **PASTOR'S LETTER**



# **MISSIONARY OCTOBER**

The Catholic Church, in addition to celebrating the Month of the Rosary this month, is especially dedicated to awakening and reviving the missionary spirit in all the faithful worldwide. This month has important significance for the mission, as the American continent was discovered, thus opening a new path in the history of Evangelization. During this month, this missionary animation increases, with everyone participating in prayer, sacrifice, and providing financial support for the missions, so that the Gospel may be proclaimed throughout the world. As we know, the mission of the Church is to proclaim the Gospel throughout the world, and therefore, we call "missions" those territories where the Word of God has not yet reached, or where it is just beginning. To continue this work, the personal help of those who feel called to the "mission" is necessary, as well as the financial support of the universal Church. As members of the Church, we are entrusted with this mission through baptism, and, driven by the Holy Spirit, we are called and sent to evangelize. For this reason, the Church invites all Christians to live our faith, aware of the responsibility we have for evangelization in the world. We can all contribute our grain of sand. Our prayer accompanies the journey and work carried out by missionaries, so that grace may make the proclamation of the Word fruitful. Likewise, our daily sacrifice, accepted with faith and in the hands of Christ, also has salvific value. We can do much from our smallness in every act or sacrifice. An example of this is Saint Thérèse of Lisieux, who was proclaimed Patron of the missions, without leaving her small cell. World Mission Sunday, known as "Domund," is celebrated throughout the world on the penultimate Sunday in October. On this day, the universal Church collaborates and prays in a special way for missionaries and the missions. These days are celebrated to help and support missionaries in their evangelizing work. They spread the messages of Jesus, usually in very poor and disadvantaged places, where social, educational, and development work is also carried out. The collections raised are distributed to all missionaries and dioceses in mission territories who request them. This distribution is carried out equitably through a Superior Council of the Pontifical Mission Societies, made up of the national directors of all the countries where this institution is established. They have five objectives: 1. To make known the missionary activity of the Church. 2. To make people understand the importance of missions in today's world. 3. To stimulate the missionary fervor of all the faithful and promote missionary vocations. 4. To promote

"Domund" was Pope Pius



XI. Already Cardinal Archbishop of Milan, he had established a diocesan secretariat dedicated to the missions, extending the Work of Propagation of the Faith throughout the country. Shortly after being elected Pope, he proclaimed these Societies (the Work of Propagation of the Faith, the Work of the Holy Childhood, and the Work of the Indigenous Clergy) as Pontifical and declared them the principal official instrument of missionary cooperation of the Catholic Church, thus giving rise to the Pontifical Mission Societies. In 1925, the Vatican inaugurated a Missionary Exposition, thus promoting missionary vocations and arousing the interest of the faithful in missionary issues. This took advantage of the influx of pilgrims during the Holy Year. A year later (1926), he published the encyclical "Rerum Ecclesiae." In it, he reaffirmed the urgency and importance of the missionary objectives planned at the beginning of his pontificate and expressed his resolve to shorten the time required to achieve them. That year, the Pontifical Mission Societies requested that Pius XI institute a World Mission Day. In response to this request, the Pope agreed and called it for the penultimate Sunday in October, choosing this Sunday to be the Sunday before the feast of Christ the King. Thus was born "World Mission Day" on April 14, 1926, later known as "Domund." It was Monsignor Ángel Sagarminaga, the first National Director of the Pontifical Mission Societies in Spain (1943), who promulgated it as such, a fruit of his missionary spirit. The fundamental purpose of Missionary October is to promote the missionary spirit throughout the Church and a concrete commitment to the missions, both those carried out in our country and in other parts of the world.

# Stewardship A Disciple's Response Jesus' Way: Part 2

#### THE STEWARD'S REWARD

People trying to live as stewards reasonably wonder what reward they will receive. This is not selfishness but an expression of Christian hope. Peter raises the question when he says to Jesus, "We have given up everything and followed you" (Mk 10:28).

Christ's response is more than Peter or any other disciple could reasonably hope or bargain for:
There is no one who has given up house or brothers or sisters or mother or father or children or lands for my sake and for the sake of the gospel who will not receive a hundred times more now in this present age: houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions, and eternal life in the age to come. (Mk 10:29-30)

That is to say: Giving up means receiving more, including more responsibility as a steward; among the consequences of living this way will be persecution; and even though discipleship and stewardship set the necessary terms of Christian life in this world, they have their ultimate reward in another life.

Start, though, with the here and now. To be a Christian disciple is a rewarding way of life, a way of companionship with Jesus, and the practice of stewardship as a part of it is itself a source of deep joy. Those who live this way are happy people who have found the meaning and purpose of living.

For a long time religious believers—to say nothing of those who do not believe—have struggled with the question of what value to assign human activity. One solution is to consider it a means to an end: do good here and now for the sake of a reward in heaven. Another solution passes over the question of an afterlife: do good here and now for the sake of making this a better world.

Vatican Council II points to a third solution. It recognizes that human activity is valuable both for what it accomplishes here and now and also for its relationship to the hereafter. But, more important, it stresses not only the discontinuity between here and now and hereafter, but also the astonishing fact of continuity.

God's Kingdom already is present in history, imperfect but real (cf. Mt 10:7; Lumen Gentium, no. 48; Gaudium et Spes, no. 39). To be sure, it will come to fulfillment by God's power, on his terms, in his own good time.

And yet, by their worthy deeds in this life, people also make a limited but real human contribution to building up the kingdom. They do so with an eye to present happiness and also to the perfect fulfillment which the Kingdom— and themselves as part of it—will enjoy in the life to come. The Council, therefore, teaches that the purpose of the human vocation to "earthly service" of one's fellow human beings is precisely to "make ready the material of the celestial realm" (Gaudium et Spes, no. 38).

In Christ, God has entered fully into human life and history. For one who is Christ's disciple there is no dichotomy, and surely no contradiction, between building the Kingdom and serving human purposes as a steward does. These are aspects of one and the same reality—the reality called the Christian life.

God's Kingdom is not an earthly kingdom, subject to decline and decay; it is the everlasting Kingdom of the life to come. But that "life to come" is in continuity with this present life through the human goods, the worthy human purposes, which people foster now. And after people have done their best, God will perfect human goods and bring about the final fulfillment of human persons. "The throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him. They will look upon his face, and his name will be on their foreheads. Night will be no more, nor will they need light from lamp or sun, for the Lord God shall give them light, and they shall reign forever and ever" (Rev 22:3-5).


