

PASTOR'S LETTER




SAINT JOHN PAUL II

This October 22nd, we celebrate Saint John Paul II. Carl Joseph Wojtyła was born in Wadowice, Poland, in 1920. His family and childhood were marked by various periods of mourning. In 1939, when Nazi Germany invaded Poland, the Third Reich closed the Jagiellonian University in Krakow, which he attended. So young Karl began working first in a quarry and then in a chemical factory to earn a living and avoid deportation to Germany. In 1942, he felt called to the priesthood, so he attended the formation courses at the clandestine major seminary in Krakow, directed by Archbishop Adam Stefan Sapieha. After the war, Karl was able to continue his studies at the major seminary in Krakow and at the Faculty of Theology of the Jagiellonian University, until his priestly ordination in 1946. In 1948, he received his first assignment in Poland: curate at the parish of Niegowić, near Krakow, and then at the parish of St. Florian in the city. He served as chaplain to university students until 1951 and later taught Moral Theology and Ethics at the major seminary in Krakow and at the Faculty of Theology in Lublin. On January 13, 1964, he was appointed Archbishop of Krakow by Pope Paul VI, who appointed him cardinal three years later. Immediately afterward, he participated in the Second Vatican Council, where he made an important contribution to the drafting of the Constitution Gaudium et Spes. His concern as a pastor was also expressed in the establishment of numerous dioceses and ecclesiastical circumscriptions, in the promulgation of the Codes of Canon Law for Latin and Eastern Churches, and in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Proposing to the People of God moments of spiritual intensity, he inaugurated the Year of Redemption, the Marian Year and the Year of the Eucharist, as well as the Great Jubilee of the year 2000. To reach out to the new generations, he accepted Cardinal Pironio's suggestion to initiate World Youth Days, which began with that first meeting in Rome on March 31, 1985, and from then on, were held every two years in a different city around the world chosen by the Pope, gaining ever greater importance. No Pope, therefore, has met as many people as John Paul II: more than 17.6 million pilgrims attended the Wednesday General Audiences (more than 1,160), not counting all the other special audiences and religious ceremonies and the millions of faithful whom he shook hands with and caressed during his pastoral visits in Italy and around the world. During his long pontificate, the Pope also signed several documents that later entered the Magisterium of the Church. Among the most important are 14 encyclicals,

15 apostolic exhortations, 11 apostolic constitutions, and 45 apostolic letters. These include two encyclicals about work and social doctrine, such as Laborem exercens of 1981 and Centesimus Annus of 1991, on the centenary of Leo XIII's Rerum Novarum. We also recall the 1988 apostolic constitution Pastor bonus, which renewed the organization of the Roman Curia and the tasks of the various dicasteries. Pope John Paul II is also credited with writing five books: Crossing the Threshold of Hope (October 1994); Gift and Mystery: On the Fiftieth Anniversary of My Priesthood (November 1996); Roman Triptych, Meditations in the Form of Poetry (March 2003); Arise! Let's Go! (May 2004) and Memory and Identity (February 2005). John Paul II died in Rome, in the Apostolic Palace of the Vatican on Saturday, April 2, 2005, at 9:37 p.m., the day before the Sunday of Albis, or the Solemnity of Divine Mercy, a feast he instituted. His pontificate was the third longest in history, after that of Peter and Pius IX. The solemn funeral service in St. Peter's Square was held on April 8, with a crowd never before seen in Rome. Beatified in 2011 by his immediate successor, Benedict XVI, he was canonized by Pope Francis on April 27, 2014. He was a pope who traveled more than 1,200,000 kilometers to proclaim the Gospel throughout the world and promote dialogue with all. He made 250 trips in total, including those outside Rome and Castel Gandolfo, of which 104 were outside Italy. On January 25, 1979, he began his

first international trip. which took him to Santo Domingo, Mexico, and the Bahamas. On June 2, he made his first pastoral visit to Poland, one of eight he made to his native country. His last trip was to Lourdes, from August 15 to 16, 2004. He made 146 pastoral visits in Italy. As Bishop of Rome, he visited 317 of the 333 existing parishes. Stewardship A Disciple's Response Stewards of the Church: Part 2

Solidarity and Stewardship

The unity of Christ's covenant calls for human solidarity, but it also goes beyond it, bearing spiritual fruit through union with the Lord. "I am the vine, you are the branches," Jesus says. "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit" (Jn 15:5). As Simone Weil observed, even a small act, like a piece of bread given with love, can save a soul. Yet solidarity faces many obstacles that disciples must work to overcome.

The most basic obstacle is selfishness and lack of love. Without charity, discipleship becomes empty and false: "If anyone says, 'I love God,' but hates his brother, he is a liar" (1 Jn 4:20). Disparities in wealth and power also block unity—between people, social classes, and nations. These are contrary to the virtue of solidarity, which Pope John Paul II described as rooted in charity and modeled on the inner life of the Trinity (Sollicitudo Rei Socialis, no. 40). To meet today's challenges, familiarity with Catholic social teaching is essential for faithful stewardship and discipleship.

Solidarity also includes social justice, described in *Economic Justice for All* as contributive justice. It calls all who are able to create the goods, services, and values necessary for the community's welfare. True productivity, therefore, must be measured not only by goods produced but also by its impact on human dignity, employment, fairness, the environment, and community life (no. 71).

Another serious obstacle is religious division, even among Christians. We remain far from the unity for which Christ prayed: "that they may all be one" (Jn 17:21). Yet God's plan has always been to draw many into one people. To Abram He promised: "All the communities of the earth shall find blessing in you" (Gn 12:23). In Jesus, this promise is fulfilled in the Kingdom of God, open to all. Those who live in the New Covenant find their hearts expanded to embrace all people, especially those in need, in a communion of mercy and love.

Eucharistic Stewardship

The Eucharist is the great sign and source of communion in charity. "Because the loaf of bread is one, we, though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf" (1 Cor 10:17). Here people enjoy a unique union with Christ and , in him, with one another.

~ Stewardship ~ Is what is in our hearts and minds coming out in our hands and feet.

His love—indeed, his very self—flows into his disciples and, through their stewardship, into the whole world. In the Eucharist, Jesus renews his covenant with perfect fidelity to God while enabling us to join in that offering. Here Christians give thanks for God's blessings and strengthen their commitment to one another as members of his covenant community.

To the Eucharistic celebration, disciples bring their lives—their vocations, their stewardship, and their contributions to Christ's work of renewal. In gratitude for gifts received, they seek to share those gifts with others. As Vatican II teaches, authentic Eucharistic celebration must lead to works of charity, mutual help, missionary activity, and Christian witness (Presbyterorum Ordinis, no. 6).

The Eucharist also points beyond this world. It is both the promise and beginning of the heavenly banquet, where the fruits of stewardship will be perfected and transfigured (Gaudium et Spes, no. 39). Jesus assures us: "Whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world" (Jn 6:51). The glory of Christian stewards is to mirror, however imperfectly, the stewardship of Christ himself, who gave and still gives all he has and is to accomplish God's redemptive work.

For Reflection and Discussion

Have you had the experience of being "served and healed" by those you set out to serve and heal?

What are the implications of God's calling us into a love relationship (covenant) and of being a people uniquely his own? What does this say about dignity, equality, unity?

How would you go about connecting the Eucharist with your practice of stewardship?

Is there more to "stewardship within the Church" than donations of "time, talent, and treasure"?

How will "Eucharistic stewardship" develop your convictions about global solidarity—"the world is God's village on earth"?

What does the word of God say to you about covenant, community, solidarity—about being Eucharistic stewards?
