

PASTOR'S LETTER




THE APOSTLES SIMON AND JUDE

This October 28, we celebrate the feast of Saints Simon and Jude, Apostles. Christ's disciples, or apostles, were the foundation stones of His church. In Revelation 21:14, we are told that the twelve foundations of the wall of the New Jerusalem will have the names of the twelve disciples (or apostles) inscribed on them. It is evident, then, that our Lord attributes great importance to these men. As we study these courageous first century lives and what discipleship meant in Christ's time, we can expect help in developing a 21st-century, Spirit-led discipleship as Christ must have intended it to be. The information about the apostles is based on what is told about these 12 men in the New Testament, along with the most respected traditions, which we know constitute historical affirmations and are valuable in the study of the lives of these men who changed the meaning of the world. Jesus is among the people, welcomes them, speaks to them, heals them, shows them God's mercy. From among the people, he chooses the Twelve Apostles to be with him and unite with him in the concrete situations of the world. And the people follow him, listen to him, because Jesus speaks and acts in a new way, with the authority of one who is authentic and consistent, of one who speaks and acts with truth, of one who gives the hope that comes from God, of one who is the revelation of the Face of a God who is love. Every building in the world has its foundations. No house can stand without solid foundations. That's why before starting to build, you must dig as deep as possible to lay a solid foundation for the building. And if you want a tower, then you must dig very deep to have a solid foundation. Christ wants to do the same today. His mission is to save humanity, but he knows that with such a short life, he cannot do it. That's why he decides to build a city, where he can be found at any time of day. That's why, after a night of prayer in personal dialogue with his Father, he lays the first foundations of his project; the apostles. There are twelve of them, and to this day those foundations are firmly established. They continue in the person of the Holy Father and all the Cardinals and Bishops, who are the direct successors of the first apostles. The entire weight of the city of God rests on them, and we must turn to them when needed. They are the foundation of the Church. They represent Christ to us, and we must follow them with faith. According to New Testament records, the apostle Judas asked Jesus at the Last Supper, "How is it that you will reveal yourself to us, and not to the world?" Judas was interested in making Christ known to the world. Not as a suffering Savior, but

rather as a ruling King. We can clearly see from Jesus' answer that the path of power can never be replaced by the path of love. It has been said that Judas went to preach the Gospel in Edessa near the Euphrates River. There he healed several, and many believed in the name of the Master. From there, Judas went to preach the Gospel in other places. The symbol chosen for him is the ship because he was a missionary taught to be a fisher of men. The New Testament tells us virtually nothing about the Apostle Simon except that he was a Zealot. The Zealots were fanatical Jewish nationalists who had heroic disregard for the suffering involved and the struggle for what they considered the purity of their faith. The Zealots hated the Romans. Simon the Zealot. the man who once might have killed out of loyalty to Israel, became the man who saw that God's will has no forced service. Tradition says he died a martyr's death. His apostolic symbol is a fish on a Bible, indicating that he was a fisherman who became a fisher of men through preaching. With this about the apostles, let us keep in mind the words of Pope Francis: This evening we are the multitude of the Gospel; we too try to follow Jesus to listen to him, to enter into communion with him in the Eucharist, to accompany him and for him to accompany us. Let us ask ourselves: how do I follow Jesus? Jesus speaks in silence in the Mystery of the

Eucharist, and each time reminds us that following him means going out of ourselves and making our lives not our possessions, but a gift from him and to others (Homily of His Holiness Francis, May 30, 2013).



Stewardship is our response to God's generosity. It helps us answer the questions of:

- · What have I been given?
- What might be if I develop my God-given gifts?
- How can I use them in service to others?
- · What can I give back?

Please prayerfully consider how you will respond to the call for this year's parish stewardship, which supports our parish, our ministries and extends the mission of our Church to help others encounter Jesus Christ.

STEWARDSHIP

Stewardship A Disciple's Response Living as a Steward: Part 1

The measure of a life well lived is the virtue that continues to grow in the lives of those who were touched by it.

CREATION AND STEWARDSHIP

While stewardship is not the entirety of Christian life, it reveals a profound truth: God desires human beings to share in his work of creation, redemption, and sanctification. This partnership is not by our own strength but through the Spirit, who empowers us as at Pentecost to continue proclaiming the Good News.

The story of salvation begins with God as Creator. He formed humankind in his image and likeness and entrusted us with the task of cooperating in his ongoing work. From the beginning, God gave a mandate: "Fill the earth and subdue it. Have dominion over...all living things" (Gn 1:28). This "dominion" is not domination but stewardship—cultivating and caring for creation (Gn 2:15).

Work, therefore, is not a punishment for sin but a fundamental part of human vocation. Although sin distorts our experience of it, work remains essential to human dignity, happiness, and fulfillment. It is the concrete way we participate in God's creative plan and show responsible care for the world.

Vatican II reminds us that human progress is not opposed to God's power but is a reflection of his greatness and the flowering of his design (Gaudium et Spes, 34). In this way, every achievement rooted in truth and goodness becomes an act of stewardship, a sign of our cooperation with God.

Stewardship is lived uniquely by each person, expressed in many forms according to one's vocation. Yet at its heart, it always means working with God, caring for his creation, and allowing our lives to serve his ongoing work in the world.

COLLABORATORS IN CREATION

To be a steward of creation begins with reverence for the gift of life—our own and that of others—and a willingness to serve and protect all that sustains and enhances life. Vatican II calls this the "surpassing ministry of safeguarding life," reminding us that from the moment of conception, life must be guarded with the greatest care (Gaudium et Spes, 51).

This stewardship also means opening our eyes to life's value, which is often overlooked. It includes a joyful appreciation of nature, whose beauty endures despite human abuse, and a commitment to ecological responsibility. True ecological stewardship recognizes our human interdependence and solidarity. It calls us to confront poverty, reduce reliance on war and weapons, and embrace simpler lifestyles marked by moderation, sacrifice, and care for others, as Pope John Paul II urged.

Stewardship also involves cultivating creation through human work—whether in art, science, business, physical labor, or acts of service. No task is too ordinary to reflect God's presence. A simple act done with love—whether in a classroom, a factory, or at a supermarket checkout—can become a moment of collaboration with God


In all these ways, stewardship means living not for ourselves alone but as partners with God, caring for life, creation, and one another.


