

PASTOR'S LETTER




SAINT CECILIA

This November 22nd, we unite with the Church in honor of Saint Cecilia. Tradition tells that Cecilia, a young Roman noblewoman, was martyred around the year 230 during the reign of Alexander Severus and the papacy of Urban I. Her veneration is ancient; the feast day in her memory was already being celebrated in 545. To learn about her martyrdom, one can read the Passio Sanctae Caeciliae, a text that has more legendary-literary than historical connotations. According to the Passio, Cecilia married the patrician Valerian for convenience, telling him on their wedding night that she had converted to Christianity and taken a vow of perpetual virginity. Valerian, of his own volition, accepted catechesis and baptism from Pope Urban I. His brother Tiburtius then joined him, also embracing the Christian faith. Both brothers were arrested on the orders of Prefect Turtius Almachius and, after being tortured, were beheaded along with Massimo, the officer who had taken them to prison and who, during the journey, had also converted. Almachius then decided to murder Cecilia as well. This was no easy task, considering the young Christian woman's great popularity. Fearing repercussions from a public execution, he decided to subject her to a summary trial and then ordered her to be imprisoned in her own house, locking her in a cauldron at an extremely high temperature, staging a death by asphyxiation. After more than 24 hours, the guards miraculously found her alive, enveloped in a heavenly dew. Almachio then ordered her beheading, but the executioner failed to sever her head after three forceful attempts. Cecilia died after three days of agony, bequeathing all her possessions to the poor and her house to the Church. Though unable to speak, she continued to profess her faith in the Triune God with her fingers, and this is how she was sculpted by Maderno in the celebrated statue kept beneath the central altar of the Basilica that bears her name. According to the Golden Legend, the medieval collection of hagiographic biographies compiled and written in Latin by the Dominican Jacobus de Varagine, which includes several narrative passages from the Passion, it was Pope Urban I, with the help of some deacons, who buried the young martyr's body in the Catacombs of Saint Callixtus, in a place of honor near the Crypt of the Popes. Then in 821, Pope Paschal I, a great devotee of the Saint, invoked as "the Virgin Cecilia who always carried the Gospel of Christ on her breast," moved the relics to the crypt of the Basilica of Saint Cecilia in Trastevere, which was built in her honor. On the eve of the Jubilee of 1600, during the restoration work on the Basilica commissioned by Cardinal Paolo Emilio Sfrondati, the sarcophagus containing the body of the young Saint was discovered in a perfect state of preservation, wrapped in a silk and gold dress. What is Saint Cecilia's connection to music? At the end of the Middle Ages, an explicit and documented link between the Saint and music was found. In a piece of music from the Passio, according to some, and in the entrance antiphon of the Mass for her feast day, according to others, the lyrics read: "...while the organs played, she sang in her heart only to the Lord." A

misinterpretation of the text allowed the iconography of the Saint to spread, enriched with musical elements, throughout various parts of Europe from the mid-14th century onward. One work of art that represents this connection between Saint Cecilia and music is Raphael's painting entitled: The Ecstasy of Saint Cecilia, which he painted for the Church of San Giovanni in al Monte in Bologna, depicts the saint carrying a portable organ in one hand and various musical instruments at her feet. This work cemented the Roman martyr's connection with music, as she was already invoked and celebrated as the patron saint of musicians and singers. The Academy of Music, founded in Rome in 1584, bears her name. Although the account of her martyrdom seems like the product of pious imagination, it is historically true that Valerian and Tiburtius were martyrs and were buried in the Catacombs of Praetos. After the trial, narrated in detail by the author of the Passion, Cecilia was condemned to beheading, but the executioner's three powerful blows failed to sever her head: this was because, according to the account, Cecilia had asked the Lord for the grace of seeing Pope Urban before she died. Awaiting this visit, Cecilia spent three days in agony, professing her faith.

Stewardship A Disciple's Response To be a Christian Steward: Part 1

DISCIPLES AS STEWARDS

Let us begin with being a disciple—a follower of our Lord Jesus Christ. As members of the Church, Jesus calls us to be disciples. This has astonishing implications:

- ♦ Mature disciples make a conscious decision to follow Jesus, no matter what the cost.
- ♦ Christian disciples experience conversion—life shaping changes of mind and heart—and commit their very selves to the Lord.
- ♦ Christian stewards respond in a particular way to the call to be a disciple. Stewardship has the power to shape and mold our understanding of our lives and the way in which we live.

Jesus' disciples and Christian stewards recognize God as the origin of life, giver of freedom, and source of all things. We are grateful for the gifts we have received and are eager to use them to show our love for God and for one another. We look to the life and teaching of Jesus for guidance in living as Christian stewards.

STEWARDS OF CREATION

The Bible contains a profound message about the stewardship of material creation: God created the world, but entrusts it to human beings. Caring for and cultivating the world involves the following:

- ♦ Joyful appreciation for the God-given beauty and wonder of nature;
- ◆ Protection and preservation of the environment, which would be the stewardship of ecological concern;

Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in me will also do the works that I do" John 14:12

- ♦ Respect for human life—shielding life from threat and assault, doing everything that can be done to enhance this gift and make life flourish; and
- ♦ Development of this world through noble human effort—physical labor, the trades and professions, the arts and sciences. We call such effort "work."

Work is a fulfilling human vocation. The Second Vatican Council points out that, through work, we build up not only our world but the Kingdom of God, already present among us. Work is a partner-ship with God—our share in a divine human collaboration in creation. It occupies a central place in our lives as Christian stewards.

STEWARDS OF VOCATION

Jesus calls us, as his disciples, to a new way of life—the Christian way of life—of which stewardship is part. But Jesus does not call us as nameless people in a face less crowd. He calls us individually, by name. Each one of us—clergy, religious, lay person; married, single; adult, child—has a personal vocation. God intends each one of us to play a unique role in carrying out the divine plan.

The challenge, then, is to understand our role—our vocation—and to respond generously to this call from God. Christian vocation entails the practice of steward ship. In addition, Christ calls each of us to be stewards of our personal vocations, which we receive from God.




