

PASTOR'S LETTER




SOLEMNITY OF CHRIST THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE

The liturgical year is a symbol of the journey of our lives: it begins and ends with our encounter with Jesus, King and Lord, in the Kingdom of Heaven, when we will enter it through the narrow gate of "Sister Death" (Saint Francis). At the beginning of the liturgical year, on the First Sunday of Advent, we are shown beforehand the goal toward which we are directing our steps. It is as if, facing an exam, we had been given the answers a year in advance; this would have been a rigged exam. In the liturgy, however, it is a gift from Jesus, the Master, because it allows us to know which path to take (Jesus, the Way), which thought to follow (Jesus, the Truth), and which hope to let guide us (Jesus, the Life). In the year 325, the first ecumenical council was held in the city of Nicaea, in Asia Minor. On this occasion, the divinity of Christ was defined against the heresies of Arius: "Christ is God, Light from Light, true God from true God." 1600 years later, in 1925, Pius XI proclaimed that the best way for civil society to obtain "just liberty, tranquility and discipline, peace and concord" is for people to recognize, publicly and privately, the kingship of Christ (Encyclical Quas primas, December 11, 1925). In the early 20th century, in Mexico, Russia, and many parts of Europe, atheist regimes threatened not only the Catholic Church and its faithful, but civilization itself. Pope Pius XI's encyclical Quas primas gave Catholics hope and the assurance that Christ the King would reign forever. Pope Pius XI said that Christ 'reigns in the minds of men, not so much because of the sublime and highest degree of his science as because He is the Truth and because men need to drink from Him and obediently receive the truth' ('Quas Primas,' 6). Quas primas remains true. The Holy Father speaks directly to the problem of what he called 'secularism,' by which he meant the attitude of those who sought to eradicate Christian influence from political life. In recent years, aggressive secularist campaigns have attempted to marginalize the Church and other religious institutions. When our nation is beset by civil unrest, racial tension, and a pandemic, we do well to turn to Our Lord, who reigns over all peoples and nations. The original date of the feast was the last Sunday of October, that is, the Sunday

immediately preceding All Saints' Day; but with the 1969 reform, it was moved to the last Sunday of the liturgical year to emphasize that Jesus Christ, the King, is the goal of our earthly pilgrimage. The biblical texts change in the three liturgical cycles, allowing us to fully grasp the figure of Jesus. It should not be forgotten, moreover, that the possibility of attaining the Kingdom of God was already won by Christ himself, and that it is preserved in and through the Church. In other words, the Church founded by Jesus is the guarantee that victory is always possible and that the gates of heaven are always open. It is the Holy Spirit whom Christ entrusted with granting the graces necessary for all to attain holiness and transform the world according to his holy will. Christ the King calls us today, once again, to "establish his kingdom on earth," so that the world, with our cooperation, may be transformed according to the divine plan of love. This task begins by letting Christ reign in every heart. This is not a proclamation or rhetorical declaration, but a real and serious call to conversion. Let us embrace Grace and reject sin. Let us not allow evil to advance. Happy Solemnity of Christ the King!

It is the personal responsibility of each one of us as stewards of the Church. All members of the Church have their own roles to play in carrying out its mission:

- ◆ Parents, who nurture their children in the light of faith;
- Parishioners, who work in concrete ways to make their parishes true communities of faith and vibrant sources of service to the larger community;
- ♦ All Catholics, who give generous support time, money, prayers, and personal service according to their circumstances—to parish and diocesan programs and to the universal Church.

OBSTACLES TO STEWARDSHIP

People who want to live as Christian disciples and Christian stewards face serious obstacles.

In the United States and other nations, a dominant secular culture often contradicts religious convictions about the meaning of life. This culture frequently encourages us to focus on ourselves and our pleasures. At times, we can find it far too easy to ignore spiritual realities and to deny religion a role in shaping human and social values.

As Catholics who have entered into the mainstream of American society and experienced its advantages, many of us also have been adversely influenced by this secular culture. We know what it is to struggle against selfishness and greed, and we realize that it is harder for many today to accept the challenge of being a Christian steward.

It is essential, therefore, that we make a special effort to understand the true meaning of stewardship and live accordingly.

What Identifies a steward?

Safeguarding material and human resources and using them responsibly are one answer; so is generous giving of time, talent, and treasure. But being a Christian steward means more. As Christian stewards, we receive God's gifts gratefully, cultivate them responsibly, share them lovingly in justice with others, and return them with increase to the Lord.

A STEWARD'S WAY

The life of a Christian steward models the life of Jesus. It is challenging and even difficult, in many respects, yet intense joy comes to those who take the risk to live as Christian stewards. Women and men who seek to live as stewards learn that "all things work for good for those who love God" (Rom 8:28).

Central to our human and Christian vocations, as well as to the unique vocation each one of us receives from God, is that we be good stewards of the gifts we possess. God gives us this divine-human workshop, this world and Church of ours.


