Our Daily Itinerary

Day 1, Tuesday, October 8: Depart the USA under our own travel arrangements

Each person will be making their own flight arrangements to the city of Thessaloniki in northern Greece.

Day 2, Wednesday, October 9: Arrive Thessaloniki

Upon your arrival in Thessaloniki, you can easily catch a taxi to our hotel. Check-in time is 3:00pm. If you arrive earlier and your room is not yet ready, you are welcome to check your luggage with the bell stand. We gather this evening for a welcome reception at our hotel, followed by dinner.(D)

Note: Those parties wishing to arrive a day earlier in Thessaloniki will need to book the own reservation for this pre-night at the Monasty Hotel in Thessaloniki (pending availability). Please make your pre-night reservation in the same category of rooms as our group reservation: Classic Rooms.

Day 3, Thursday, October 10: Thessaloniki: Visit of the site and leisure

This morning, after breakfast, we visit this ancient city. Founded around 315 BC by King Cassander of Macaedon, the king named the new city after his wife Thessaloniki, a half-sister of Alexander the Great. At

the time of the Apostle Paul's arrival, Thessaloniki had a population of about 200,000 people and served as an important economic and political part of the Roman Empire. There was a large synagogue here — a religious center for the Jewish part of population of the smaller towns, which surrounded Thessaloniki and which had only church-houses.

About 50 AD, while on his second missionary journey, Paul spoke to the Jewish population from the city's chief synagogue on three Sabbaths and sowed the seeds for Thessaloniki's first Christian church. During Paul's time in the city, he convinced some people among both Jews and Greeks to adopt Christian beliefs, as well as some of the city's leading women. However, Jews who kept their faith banned Paul and his companions from their midst. Because they were no longer welcome, Paul, Silas and Timothy were eventually sent out of Thessaloniki by the new Christian converts. The men eventually continued their travels, and Paul wrote two letters to the new church at Thessaloniki, probably between 51AD and 53AD, the First Epistle to the Thessalonians and the Second Epistle to the Thessalonians.

Today, we will visit the Greek Orthodox Church of Saint Demitrius, named for a 4th century Thessalonian Christian martyr. We see as well the Church of Hagia Sophia, modeled on the church of the same name in

Constantinople, dating from the 8th century. It is one of the oldest standing churches in Thessaloniki and a UNESCO World Heritage site monument.

We will celebrate Mass at the local Catholic parish of the Immaculate Conception, followed by the afternoon on your own to explore. Take some time to enjoy watching the life of the city at the Aristotelous Square, viewing the Rotunda of Galerius, used as a church for over 1200 years, and The Arch of Galerius built in 298 to 299 AD. Dinner this evening is served at a local restaurant. (B, D)

Day 4, Friday, October 11: Thessaloniki: Excursion to Philippi and Kavala

After breakfast, we set out to Philippi, the site where the apostle Paul came and established a strong church. The New Testament records a visit to the city by the Paul during his second missionary (AD 49 or 50). On the basis of the Acts of the Apostles and the Letter to the Philippians, early Christians concluded that Paul had founded their community. Accompanied by Silas and Timothy, Paul is believed to have preached for the first time on European soil in Philippi. According to the New Testament, Paul visited the city on two other occasions, in 56 and 57. Later he sent his Letter to the community at Philippi. Of all the churches Paul founded, probably none was so near and dear to him as the church at Philippi (Acts 16:9-33). We will celebrate an outdoor Mass here.

Philippi was built on the Via Egnatia, the Roman road which ran from Rome to Byzantium. We see the river where Lydia is thought to have been baptized, the ruins of a prison where Paul and Silas had been kept, the Agora, the 5th century Basilica and the Theater. Following the baptism of Lydia, the first Christian church in Europe was established here. We continue to the nearby port of Kavala, the ancient port of Neapolis (Acts 16:11) for a late lunch in the seaside port. We return to our hotel in Thessaloniki for dinner on our own this evening. (B, L)

Day 5, Saturday, October 12: Thessaloniki / Veria (St. Paul) / Vergina (Museum of the Royal Tombs / Kalambaka

This morning, after breakfast and check-out, we celebrate Mass in a local church in Thessaloniki, then we travel first to Veria, also known as Berea. During the Roman Empire, Veria became a place of worship for the Romans. Within the city there was a Jewish settlement where Paul, after leaving Thessalonica and his companion Silas, preached to the Jewish and Greek communities of the city in AD 50/51 and 54/55. Acts 17 10-15 records:

As soon as it was night, the brothers sent Paul and Silas away to Berea. On arriving there, they went to the Jewish synagogue. Now the Bereans were of more noble character than the Thessalonians, for they received the message with great eagerness and examined the

Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true. Many of the Jews believed, as did also a number of prominent Greek women and many Greek men. When the Jews in Thessalonica learned that Paul was preaching the word of God at Berea, they went there too, agitating the crowds and stirring them up. The brothers immediately sent Paul to the coast, but Silas and Timothy stayed at Berea. The men who escorted Paul brought him to Athens and then left with instructions for Silas and

Paul returned through the area of Berea during his third missionary journey, and despite the earlier opposition, many of the Bereans were converted. Sopater, one of Paul's traveling companions, was from Berea. We stop at the site, where tradition holds, Paul stood and delivered his sermons.

After some time for lunch on our own, we continue on to Vergina and the Museum of the Royal Tombs. The Royal Tombs were built by the ancient Kingdom of Macedon. The underground museum contains the burial cluster of Philip II of Macedon, and are a UNESCO World Heritage Site. After our visit, we continue on to our hotel in Kalambaka, situated at the foot of the stunning Meteora peaks. We check-in to our hotel for dinner and the evening. (B, D)

Day 6, Sunday, October 13: Kalambaka: Visit of the monasteries of Meteora

Today will visit the breathtaking Byzantine monasteries of Meteora. Derived from the Greek word "meteorizome," meaning "to hang in the air," the structures seem to do just that. Perched on a mountain of strangely shaped pinnacles in the Peneus Valley, they are far removed from the world and its distractions. During their heyday in the 15th and 16th centuries, the number monasteries grew to 24. The buildings were decorated with frescoes and icons from the great artists of the day.

Colossal symmetrical gray and reddish boulders, as though pushed upwards from the bowels of mother earth by an invisible hand, sustain breathtaking beautiful monasteries perched precariously high above the ground. Originally the only access was by means of very long ladders which could be drawn up when not in use, or in a basket or net suspended on ropes from a winch which was mounted in a winching tower above the void below: according to travelers in the past the ropes were not replaced until they broke. Steps have now been cut in the rock face, and there is a fine modern road serving the main monasteries.

We will reach the monasteries by climbing the stairs – no ropes for this group! The monasteries are veritable Byzantine museums exhibiting superb icons, old manuscripts and unique mosaics and frescoes. After our visit of two of the monasteries, we return to our hotel for some time at leisure to explore the village. Mass today will be celebrated in a room at our hotel. Dinner follows. (B, D)

Day 7, Monday, October 14: Kalambaka / Delphi (Oracle of Delphi) / Athens

This morning, after breakfast and check-out, we board our motor coach for Athens, stopping first at Delphi, one of the most important religious sanctuaries of the ancient Greek world, home to Apollo and the most famous oracle of antiquity. Its history dates to the Mycenaean period and in Homer's Iliad, the site was referred to as Pytho. The oracle or the Pythia as it was called was a woman over 50 who abandoned normal life and lived her life in seclusion to serve the many who came to have their questions answered. The Pythia would pronounce her prophesies while the priests wrote them down and translated them to the people. Among the most noted to come with questions were King Croesus and King Midas. After our visit, we gather for lunch at a local restaurant, then we continue on to our hotel in Athens for check-in and dinner. Mass will be celebrated at a church in Athens. (B,L,D)

Day 8, Tuesday, October 15: Athens: Visit of the Agora & Parthenon

After breakfast at our hotel, we begin with Mass at the Cathedral of St. Denis. After Mass, we enjoy a tour of the city of Athens, including the agora, where Paul addressed the Athenians. According to the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 17:16-34), while he was waiting for his companions Silas and Timothy to arrive, Paul was distressed to see Athens full of idols. His sermon at the Areopagus, the high court in Athens, is the most dramatic and fullest reported speech of his missionary career.

We also visit the famed Acropolis (the ancient citadel) located on a rocky outcrop above the city, and the Parthenon, Hadrian's Arch and the Temple of Zeus. We enjoy lunch together at a restaurant in the Plaka area. The balance of the day is at leisure to explore the city. Dinner is on our own to explore the local restaurants. (B, L)

Day 9, Wednesday, October 16: Athens: Excursion of Corinth

This morning after breakfast, we journey to Corinth. Here Paul spent 18 months, preaching to the Jews and Gentiles. The site is overlooked by an Acropolis housing the remains of the Temple of Aphrodite, goddess of love. In Corinth, Paul worked with Aquila and Priscilla, and his trial by Gallio took place in the agora. The community he founded here caused him much grief and prompted him to write at least four letters. We celebrate our Mass today in Corinth, with a reflection on Paul the Missionary. After our visit and Mass, we have lunch at a local seaside restaurant. We return to Athens for the afternoon at leisure, with dinner on our own to explore the local restaurants. (B, L)


Day 10, Thursday, October 17: Athens: Visit of the Byzantine and Christian Museum & leisure time in the Plaka

This morning after breakfast, we celebrate Mass at the Cathedral of St. Denis. After Mass, we visit the Byzantine and Christian Museum. The museum has over 25,000 artefacts in its possession. The artefacts date from between the 3rd and 20th century AD, and encompass the entire Greek world, as well as regions in which Hellenism flourished. The balance of the day is at leisure to shop and explore the city. Tonight we gather for a farewell dinner at a local restaurant. (B, D)

Day 11, Friday, October 18: Return to the USA

This morning after an early breakfast, we bid farewell to our fellow pilgrims. The concierge at our hotel will be able to arrange private transfers to the airport for those interested, at an additional cost. (B)

Note: While no changes are anticipated, there may be unforeseen occasions when certain alterations become necessary to this itinerary. All Masses are subject to local church schedules and substitution with alternate Mass sites if churches mentioned are not available.

How to Register: Registrations are processed in the order received and many groups fill up quickly, so please register soon. Deadline for initial registration is **March 1, 2024**. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

ACCEPTANCE OF TERMS & CONDITIONS: Any payments made by a Traveler or on behalf of the Traveler ("Traveler", "you") to Catholic Travel Centre (CTC) toward any CTC tour shall constitute acceptance of all Terms & Conditions provided herein.

PAYMENT TERMS: All payments shall be made on the dates indicated in the payment schedule, noted in the Registration Information section. Late payments are subject to a non-refundable \$150 fee, and may result in cancellation. A Traveler registering within 120 days prior to departure must provide full payment by cashier check, plus a non-refundable late registration \$150 fee. CTC reserves the right to cancel registrations not paid in full 105 days prior to tour departure and to charge fees per the Cancellation Policy. A non-refundable \$75 fee is charged on all returned payments. Travelers agree not to dispute any credit card charges associated with this trip before contacting CTC first to resolve their concerns. CTC retains the right to dispute any chargeback that is improper and recover any costs, including attorney's fees related to improper chargebacks. Additionally, in the event of an improper chargeback, CTC retains the right to cancel any travel reservation related to that improper chargeback NOTE: Credit card charges will not show as "travel expense" on your credit card statement, but will appear as "specialty services", "shopping" or another designation.

CHANGES IN FORM OF PAYMENT: To change from Cash Discount to Standard pricing, the difference between prices plus an additional \$75 fee applies. After a Traveler's credit card has been charged for any portion of the tour, s/he is ineligible for the Cash Discount Price.

PARTIAL PACKAGES NOT AVAILABLE: Tour Packages are offered as described in this brochure, at the stated price. Partial package purchase is not available.

INDIVIDUAL CANCELLATION POLICY: CTC's cancellation policy is in effect upon first payment toward any CTC tour. A Traveler's cancellation must be provided in writing either by email, fax, or registered mail to CTC. The cancellation by the Traveler is effective on the date of the cancellation email, fax, or date of postmark. The Traveler forfeits the following fees to CTC based on the date of cancellation notice: anytime up to 120 days prior to departure, \$500 fee; 119 to 90 days prior to departure, \$500 fee plus 25% of Land Cost; 89 to 60 days prior to departure, \$500 fee plus 50% of Land Cost; 59 days or fewer, all payments by Traveler made to CTC are forfeited, and there are no refunds. In event of individual cancellation, no name changes or substitutions are permitted. No shows: Land only passengers who do not show for first hotel night will be considered as tour cancellations: their hotel reservations will automatically be cancelled and cannot be reinstated.

PRICES: If the group does not reach the size advertised, the price or programming will be adjusted accordingly. Pricing is based on exchange rates and fares applicable at the time of quotation and is subject to change. Fuel surcharges are subject to increase up to 30 days prior to departure.

PASSPORT: A valid passport is required of all U.S. citizen passengers. Travelers of other nationalities should inquire with the appropriate embassies, and such Travelers are responsible for securing their own visas if required in addition to their valid passport. Travelers' passports must be valid for six (6) months following the return date of the trip. CTC expressly denies any responsibility for any losses incurred due to insufficient validity of a Traveler's passport.

The Traveler agrees not to hold CTC, our suppliers, or the group leaders responsible should they contract any illness during or after their travel.

ITINERARY: The itinerary presented in this brochure represents what CTC is planning for this trip; however, the itinerary is subject to final confirmations and changes in local schedules. While no changes are anticipated, CTC, at its sole discretion, reserves the right to change the itinerary, as it deems necessary or advisable. FINAL TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: Travelers receive travel documents by email approximately two weeks prior to departure. Bulk items such as luggage and names tags will be shipped by CTC to group leaders for distribution.

A limited number of single rooms are available and are subject to a single room supplement fee. Triple rooms are not always available and are discouraged because of cramped quarters; no price reduction for triple rooms. Meals are either menu of the day or buffet. Included meals are as shown in the itinerary (B=Breakfast, L=Lunch, D=Dinner).

LAND ONLY PASSENGERS: Travelers arranging their own airline ticket must meet the group at the first hotel of the itinerary.

BAGGAGE & PORTERAGE: Baggage is at Traveler's risk. Porterage for one piece of luggage is included at hotels.
