

#### **PASTOR'S LETTER**



#### NATIVITY OF THE LORD

The Church, in its mission to go throughout the world bringing the Good News, has chosen to dedicate a time to deepen, contemplate, and assimilate the Mystery of the Incarnation of the Son of God; this time is known as Christmas. Close to the ancient Jewish festival of lights and seeking to give a Christian meaning to the pagan celebrations of the winter solstice, the Church took advantage of the moment to celebrate Christmas. During this time, Christians, through Advent, prepare to receive Christ, "the light of the world" (Jn 8:12), into their souls, rectifying their lives and renewing their commitment to follow Him. During the Christmas season, as in the Easter Triduum of Holy Week, we celebrate the redemption of humankind through the presence and self-giving of God. But unlike the Easter Triduum, in which we remember the passion and death of the Savior, at Christmas we remember that God became man and dwelt among us. Just as the sun dispels the darkness at dawn, the presence of Christ breaks through the darkness of sin, the world, the devil, and the flesh to show us the way to follow. With his light, he shows us the truth of our existence. Christ himself is the life that renews the fallen nature of humanity and of nature itself. Christmas celebrates this renewing presence of Christ who comes to save the world. The Church, in her role as mother and teacher, through a series of feasts, seeks to make people aware of this event so important for the salvation of her children. Therefore, it is necessary that all the faithful live with a true understanding of the richness of the real and profound experience of Christmas. Today the Light has entered the world. Today, as more than two thousand years ago, the Light pierces the darkness of night and the shadows and illuminates us. This Light has a face and a name for us: Jesus Christ, announced by the prophet Isaiah: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light" (Christmas Eve Mass, Isaiah 9:1-6). He is the Light of the world that illuminates the darkness (John 1:9, 3, 19, Gospel of Christmas Day). He is the Hope that does not disappoint (Rom 5:5); Jesus, root and offspring of David (2Sam 7:8ff, God's promise to King David, Fourth Sunday of Advent; Rev 22:16); Jesus is the bright morning star (Rev 22:16). This is Christmas: a fact, an event that has changed the course of history. God became man to make us children of God (St. Irenaeus). An event so important, so decisive, that the liturgy allows us to savor it almost in slow motion, offering us not one, but four Christmas Masses: the Vigil Mass (around 6:00 p.m.), the Evening Mass (usually between 9:00 p.m. and

midnight), the Dawn Mass (between 7:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m.), and the Daytime Mass (between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.). Four Masses to relish all the joy of this Event that surprised and disrupted human plans. This is the joy of Christmas: "Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord" (Lk 2:11, Gospel of the evening). The Lord Jesus draws near to us to tell us not to be afraid, to break the indifference we have toward one another, because God, in his Son Jesus, has committed himself to humanity wounded by sin in order to save us. The text from Luke, which we heard at the evening Mass, is rich in chronological and historical details: "A decree from Caesar Augustus ordered that a census be taken of the entire world... this took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria..." (Luke 2:1-2). Details that might leave us indifferent, so eager are we to hear the news that Jesus has been born; but these are not secondary details, because they indicate that the birth of Jesus does not belong to the world of fables, but is a fact fully embedded in history. The Nativity of our Lord Jesus reminds us that God is present in all the situations in which we believe He is absent or in which we believe He cannot be present. Faith impels us to look at this time with greater serenity and hope: God is here, so present that, in fact, He is asking us to examine our ways. He invites us to remember that He came to save us, and that in Him we can be saved only if we walk together, if we learn to care for one another. We are invited to become "mangers," where others can feed on the bread of friendship, love, mercy, and hope. The Lord offers himself to us so that we may bring him to them through the witness of our lives. As Christians, we are invited to embrace the hope of this disoriented and lonely humanity, to be sentinels of the new dawn... so that the darkness of this time may be pierced by the Light that comes from the Lord Jesus, who is the Lord Jesus. He is the decisive reality of our existence. From the Lord Jesus, who drew near to us, let us learn to become brothers and sisters, sharing solidarity and inner closeness, so that we may praise God with the angels, saying: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

#### **Stewardship Note: A Life of Discipleship**

Welcoming Christ means embracing a lifelong call to **stewardship and discipleship**. As we end Advent and begin the Christmas season, we reflect on how we can live our faith more intentionally:

- offering our time in prayer and service,
- using our God-given talents in ministry and community life,
- sharing our material blessings to support the mission of the Church,
- living with humility, compassion, and generosity

A true disciple welcomes Christ not only in prayer, but in daily life—becoming His hands, His heart, and His witness in the world.

#### **Closing Prayer:**

Lord Jesus, Emmanuel, I welcome You into my heart and home. Fill me with Your peace and help me live as Your faithful disciple. Guide my use of time, talent, and treasure, so that my life may reflect Your love. Stay with me in the year ahead. Come, Lord Jesus.




